



DEALING WITH OLD PALMS

According to the Code of Canon Law (c.1171) blessed items are not to be discarded in a trash can, but treated with respect. Palm branches can be burned or buried in order to properly dispose of them. This type of disposal honors their sacred purpose and returns them to the earth in a dignified way.

GOOD FRIDAY FASTING AND ABSTINENCE AND EASTER DUTY

Fasting means only **one full meal a day** may be taken. Two smaller meals may be eaten to maintain physical strength but together they should not equal another full meal in quantity. Snacking between meals is not permitted. The fast is not broken by liquids as long as the liquids are not too nourishing. For example, water, soda, tea, coffee, even with milk and sugar, milk, fruit juices, and even wine and beer are allowed between meals as well as at meals. But, soup, cream, a thick shake, or smoothie, etc. are forbidden between meals. **Catholics ages 18-59, unless afflicted with a serious health issue, are obligated to fast on Good Friday.** Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.

Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry, including broth and gravy. More particularly, meat means that which comes from warm-blooded land animals. [Snails, frogs, and snakes may be eaten.] Soups made from meat are forbidden, but Church law allows condiments, even those made from the fat of animals, such as lard and drippings from fat. Milk and cheese are permitted. Catholics aged 14 and older are obligated to abstain on Good Friday. Since the availability of nutritious non-meat foods and vitamins are prevalent in the United States, those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are urged to join in the discipline of abstaining. Catholics should consult a priest if they have a doubt on this matter.

The **Easter Duty** is a precept of the Church binding on all Catholics who have made their first Penance and first Holy Communion. It is fulfilled by a sincere and integral confession and worthy reception of Holy Communion, that is while not conscious of having committed a mortal sin since one's last good confession, and thus, presumably in the state of sanctifying grace. The time to fulfill the Easter duty extends until Holy Trinity Sunday (June 15th).

GUIDE TO CONFESSION

Pray to the Holy Spirit for help to remember your sins. Read through the items on this list and honestly reflect on your behavior for each item. If you committed a mortal sin, try to remember the number of times or, at least, the frequency (ex. a couple times a week over the past two months). If necessary, take this list to Confession to help you remember things. Begin the confession by saying how long since your last confession and your state of life (single, married).

I am the LORD your God. You shall have no other gods before me.

To reject what God teaches through His Catholic Church

To read/listen to materials that attack the Catholic Faith without seeking the response to the attack

To take part in or join another religion, Free Masons or Communist Party or become an atheist

To engage in occult or superstitious practices (ex. horoscopes, fortune tellers, seances, ouija board)

To despair about my salvation or the forgiveness of sins

To commit sin while I presume that God must forgive me

You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain.

To use the name of God in cursing or blasphemy

To break vows/promises made to God

To take part in or enjoy irreverence or hatred towards sacred things

To be angry at God or blame God

To used vulgar or obscene speech

To deny being a Christian

Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day.

To miss Holy Mass on Sunday or a Holy Day

To fail to pray each day

To make a bad confession by intentionally not confessing a mortal sin

To receive Holy Communion or another sacrament in the state of mortal sin

To come late to/leave early from Mass without a good reason

To do unnecessary work on Sunday

To knowingly violate days of abstinence or fast

To receive Holy Communion without fasting for one hour

To fail to make a good confession or receive Holy Communion once during Lent and Easter

Honor your father and your mother.

(If I am a minor) To disrespect or disobey the reasonable demands of my parents

(If I am an adult) To disrespect or ignore my parents in their old age or in their time of need

To neglect children's earthly needs

To neglect to educate children in the Catholic Faith, prayer, periodic confession, and Sunday Mass

To intentionally break just laws

You shall not murder.

To knowingly and willingly kill an innocent human being or cause grave bodily harm

To be involved in an abortion, through advice, encouragement, paying for one, etc.

To assist in, attempt, seriously, or consider suicide or euthanasia

To physically, verbally, or emotionally abuse another person

To cultivate hate toward others

To be unfair or disrespect others because of their sex, race, nationality, religion, culture, or illness

To risk my own life or put another person's life in danger

To get drunk, use drugs, or give drugs to others

To help another to commit a mortal sin through advice or taking part in their sin

To stoke my own anger or remain unwilling to forgive

To seek revenge, hope something bad would happen, or take joy in someone's suffering

To treat animals cruelly

You shall not commit adultery. You shall not covet your neighbor's spouse.

To engage in sexual acts with anyone who is not my spouse (an important circumstance is with whom: married (adultery), prostitute, same sex (sodomy), child (pedophilia)

To marry without the blessing of the Catholic Church

To abandon spouse/family or cause a separation or divorce.

To refuse marital rights without just reason or demand marital rights without concern for spouse

To use birth control in the sacred marriage act

To use in vitro fertilization or artificial insemination

To sterilize sex organs for contraceptive purposes

To put oneself in near occasions of sexual sin

To try to seduce, to purposely dress immodestly, or to sexually harass

To masturbate

To willfully entertain impure thoughts.

To purchase, view, sell, or make use of sexually arousing material

You shall not steal. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

To steal or cheat

To be upset that envy others on account of their possessions

To deliberately damage another's property

To fail to contribute time, talents and money to support parish and Church

To waste money in compulsive gambling.

To fail to pay employees a living wage

To fail to give a full day's work for a full day's pay

To fail to honor a contract or to pay debts

To fail to help those in grave and immediate need

To fail to contribute to reputable charities or individuals

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

To lie, to knowingly and willfully deceived another

(Perjury) to lie under oath

(Detraction/libel) to destroy a reputation by telling others about his faults with no good reason

(Calumny) to tell lies in order to destroy someone's reputation

(Rash judgment) to assume the worst of another person without good evidence
