

SAINT JUSTIN MARTYR DESCRIBES THE HOLY EUCHARIST c. 140 AD

Saint Justin was born to a pagan Graeco-Roman family c. 100 AD in what is now Nablus in the West Bank. He studied the philosophy of the Stoics, Aristotle, Pythagoras, and Plato, preferring the lattermost. However, even Plato did not satisfy him completely. It was a Syrian Christian who introduced him to the prophets and Jesus Christ. He was convinced by Christianity and at some point was baptized either before or when he arrived at Rome where he began to teach about Jesus Christ during the reign of Emperor Antoninus Pius (138–161). In Rome he was denounced as a Christian by the cynic philosopher Crescens, and beheaded by the urban prefect Junius Rusticus who held office from 162 to 168. Among his writings we possess are his First Apology, addressed to Antoninus Pius, his sons, and the Roman Senate; a Second Apology, addressed to the Roman Senate; a Dialogue with Trypho a rabbi; a Discourse to the Greeks; a Treatise on the Sovereignty of God; The Psalmist; and a Treatise on the Soul.



The following is taken from chapters 66 and 67 of the First Apology. Written less than 90 years after St. Peter's martyrdom on the Vatican Hill, the work explains to the Roman Emperor who Christians are, what they do, and why they do it. These chapters in particular deal with the Holy Eucharist. In doing so, St. Justin speaks of the necessity of Baptism, the belief in Church teaching, and living a life in accordance with Church teaching in order to partake in the Eucharist. He gives an outline of Holy Mass, especially focusing on the bread and wine which become the Flesh and Blood of Christ through the words of consecration given by Jesus to the Apostles. St. Justin also makes clear the Christian belief in the Trinity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and the uniqueness of Sunday as the Lord's Day.

[66] No one may share the Eucharist with us unless he believes that what we teach is true, unless he is washed in the regenerating waters of Baptism for the remission of his sins, and unless he lives in accordance with the principles given us by Christ.

We do not consume the Eucharistic Bread and Wine as if it were ordinary food and drink, for we have been taught that as Jesus Christ our Savior became a man of flesh and blood by the power of the Word of God, so also the food that our flesh and blood assimilates for its nourishment becomes the Flesh and Blood of the incarnate Jesus by the power of his own words contained in the Prayer of Thanksgiving.

The Apostles, in their recollections, which are called Gospels, handed down to us what Jesus commanded them to do. They tell us that He took bread, gave thanks and said: "Do this in memory of me. This is My Body." In the same way He took the chalice, He gave thanks and said: "This is My Blood." The Lord gave this command to them alone. Ever since then we have constantly reminded one another of these things. The rich among us help the poor and we are always united. For all that we receive we praise the Creator of the universe through his Son Jesus Christ and through the Holy Spirit.

[67] On Sunday we have a common assembly of all our members, whether they live in the city or the outlying districts. The recollections of the Apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as there is time. When the reader has finished, the one presiding over the congregation speaks to us; he urges everyone to imitate the examples of virtue we have heard in the readings. Then we all stand up together and pray.

On the conclusion of our prayer, bread and wine and water are brought forward. The one presiding offers prayers and gives thanks to the best of his ability, and the people give assent by saying, "Amen." The Eucharist is distributed, everyone present communicates, and the deacons take it to those who are absent.

The wealthy, if they wish, may make a contribution, and they themselves decide the amount. The collection is placed in the custody of the one who presides, who uses it to help the orphans and widows and all who for any reason are in distress, whether because they are sick, in prison, or away from home. In a word, he takes care of all who are in need.

We hold our common assembly on Sunday because it is the first day of the week, the day on which God put darkness and chaos to flight and created the world, and because on that same day our Savior Jesus Christ rose from the dead. For he was crucified on Friday and on Sunday he appeared to his Apostles and disciples and taught them the things that we have passed on for your consideration.
