

PREFACE TO THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

After the Eucharistic prayer dialogue is the Preface, a word that comes from the Latin *praefatio* which literally means spoken before temporally or spatially. It is a prayerful prologue to the Eucharistic Prayer of Holy Mass which changes depending on the liturgical season. However, it has a certain recurring structure.

Thus, the first part always begins by reaffirming the last response of the dialogue that "[i]t is truly befitting and just," to worship the "Lord." Here the Lord refers to God the Father implicitly or explicitly. This first part more or less has standard language and ends by mentioning God or Christ.

The second part of the preface usually says something specific about Christ and His work of salvation making more explicit the reason for the offering of thanks. This second part emphasizes a doctrinal truth.

Finally, again using more or less standard language, the Preface concludes by associating our praise as members of the Church militant on earth with that of the Church triumphant, especially the Angelic Hosts, in Heaven.

There are at more than 100 Prefaces that can be used at various times during the year. Below are the among the most important and most ancient, the traditional Christmas and Easter Prefaces, respectively.

CHRISTMAS PREFACE

Vere dignum et iustum est, æquum et salutáre, nos tibi semper et ubíque grátias ágere: Dómine, sancte Pater, omnípotens ætérne Deus:

Quia per incarnáti Verbi mystérium nova mentis nostræ óculis lux tuæ claritátis infúlsit: ut, dum visibíliter Deum cognóscimus, per hunc in invisibílium amórem rapiámur.

Et ídeo cum Angelis et Archángelis, cum Thronis et Dominatiónibus, cumque omni milítia cæléstis exércitus, hymnum glóriæ tuæ cánimus, sine fine dicéntes: It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For in the mystery of the Word made flesh a new light of your glory has shone upon the eyes of our mind, so that, as we recognize in him God made visible, we may be caught up through him in love of things invisible.

And so, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and Powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim:

EASTER PREFACE

Vere dignum et iustum est, æquum et salutáre: Te quidem, Dómine, omni témpore confitéri, sed in hac potíssimum nocte / in hac potissimum die / in hoc potíssimum gloriósus prædicáre, cum Pascha nostrum immolátus est Christus.

Ipse enim verus est Agnus qui ábstulit peccáta mundi. Qui mortem nostram moriéndo destrúxit, et vitam resurgéndo reparávit.

Quaprópter, profúsis paschálibus gáudiis, totus in orbe terrárum mundus exsúltat. Sed et supérnæ virtútes atque angélicæ potestátes, hymnum glóriæ tuæ cóncinunt, sine fine dicéntes: It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, at all times to acclaim you, O Lord, but on this night / on this day / in this time above all to laud you yet more gloriously when Christ our Passover has been sacrificed.

For He is the true Lamb who has taken away the sins of the world; by dying, He has destroyed our death, and by rising restored our life.

Therefore, overcome with paschal joy, every land, every people exults in your praise and even the heavenly Powers, with the angelic hosts, sing together the unending hymn of your glory, as they acclaim:

THE EASTER ALLELUIA

Saint Augustine of Hippo (354-430) was born of the Romanized Berber family, with a pagan father and Catholic mother, from what is now Algeria. After a wayward youth and study of philosophy, he converted to Catholicism and was eventually origin ordained bishop of Hippo Regius in Roman Numidia. His many writings have had a strong impact on Western philosophy and Western Christianity, and he is recognized as an orthodox teacher of the Catholic Faith by the Second Council of Constantinople. His many important works include *Confession*, *On the City of God, On True Religion*, and *On Christian Doctrine*. The following passage is from his *Commentary on the Psalms*, and focuses on Psalm 148.

Our thoughts in this present life should turn on the praise of God, because it is in praising God that we shall rejoice for ever in the life to come; and no one can be ready for the next life unless he trains himself for it now. So we praise God during our earthly life, and at the same time we make our petitions to him. Our praise is expressed with joy, our petitions with yearning. We have been

promised something we do not yet possess, and because the promise was made by one who keeps his word, we trust him and are glad; but insofar as possession is delayed, we can only long and yearn for it. It is good for us to persevere in longing until we receive what was promised, and yearning is over; then praise alone will remain.

Because there are these two periods of time—the one that now is, beset with the trials and troubles of this life, and the other yet to come, a life of everlasting serenity and joy—we are given two liturgical seasons, one before Easter and the other after. The season before Easter signifies the troubles in which we live here and now, while the time after Easter which we are celebrating at present signifies the happiness that will be ours in the future. What we commemorate before Easter is what we experience in this life; what we celebrate after Easter points to something we do not yet possess. This is why we keep the first season with fasting and prayer; but now the fast is over and we devote the present season to praise. Such is the meaning of the Alleluia we sing. Both these periods are represented and demonstrated for us in Christ our head. The Lord's Passion depicts for us our present life of trial—shows how we must suffer and be afflicted and finally die. The Lord's Resurrection and Glorification show us the life that will be given to us in the future.

Now therefore, brethren, we urge you to praise God. That is what we are all telling each other when we say Alleluia. You say to your neighbor, "Praise the Lord!" and he says the same to you. We are all urging one another to praise the Lord, and all thereby doing what each of us urges the other to do. But see that your praise comes from your whole being; in other words, see that you praise God not with your lips and voices alone, but with your minds, your lives and all your actions.

We are praising God now, assembled as we are here in church; but when we go on our various ways again, it seems as if we cease to praise God. But provided we do not cease to live a good life, we shall always be praising God. You cease to praise God only when you swerve from justice and from what is pleasing to God. If you never turn aside from the good life, your tongue may be silent but your actions will cry aloud, and God will perceive your intentions; for as our ears hear each other's voices, so do God's ears hear our thoughts.
