

Dear Friend,

As I reflect on this month of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, I am filled with gratitude for the love of Christ, for the gift of the priesthood, and for people like you who support us through every season of our lives.

This October will mark my 44th year as a priest. It's hard to believe how quickly the time has passed. I will be 75 this summer and, God willing, will continue in ministry. But the day will come when I retire to the St. John Vianney Clergy Residence in Riverdale and enter a new season of life with my brother priests. What a comfort to know there is a place of fraternity waiting for us after a lifetime of service to God's people.

Recently, I had the joy of attending a day of vocation awareness where 175 young men gathered to learn about the priesthood. To see so many young faces open to a vocation gave me renewed hope for the enduring power of Christ's call across generations. It reminded me of when I first heard His call and said yes.

That same call continues today. And it is through your generosity to the Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal that we make possible the formation of seminarians, ongoing education for active clergy, and care for our retired priests.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER: ROMAN CANON

There are many Eucharistic Prayers among the Eastern Rites of the Catholic Church. However, until the First Sunday of Advent of 1969, the Roman Rite had been only one Eucharistic Prayer called the *Canon Missae* or Canon of the Mass. Today, it is often called Eucharistic Prayer I. The Roman Canon is one of the most ancient Eucharistic Prayers with written evidence of an earlier form from the fourth century in a work called *De Sacramentis* written by St. Ambrose of Milan (339-397). The Roman Canon is essentially the same today as it was at the time of Pope St. Gregory the Great (541-604). The first prayer to the Canon is as follows:



OFFICIAL LATIN

Te igitur, clementissime Pater, per Iesum Christum, Filium tuum, Dominum nostrum, supplices rogamus, ac petimus, uti accepta habeas, et benedicas haec dona, haec munera, haec sancta sacrificia illibata, in primis, quae tibi offerimus pro Ecclesia tua sancta catholica: quam pacificare, custodire, adunare, et regere digneris toto orbe terrarum: una cum famulo tuo Papa nostro N. et Antistite nostro N. et omnibus orthodoxis atque catholicae et apostolicae fidei cultoribus.

OFFICIAL ENGLISH

To you, therefore, most merciful Father, we make humble prayer and petition through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord: that you accept and bless these gifts, these offerings, these holy and unblemished sacrifices, which we offer you firstly for your Holy Catholic Church. Be pleased to grant her peace, to guard, unite and govern her throughout the whole world, together with your servant N. our Pope and N. our Bishop, and all those who, holding to the truth, hand on the Catholic and Apostolic Faith.

LITERAL ENGLISH

To you, therefore, most clement Father, we, suppliants, beg and make petition through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, that You regard as accepted, and bless these gifts, these services, these holy unblemished sacrifices, which we offer to You firstly for Your Holy Catholic Church: May You deign to grant Her peace, to guard Her, to unite Her and to rule over Her throughout the whole world: together with Your servant our Pope N. and our Bishop N., and all right-believing fosterers of the Catholic and Apostolic Faith.

The Roman Canon begins, after the *Sanctus*, with the Latin words *Te* which is the direct object singular of the pronoun you (or Thee in Shakespearean English). The Canon is addressed to the God the Father through Christ the Son. *Clementissime* is an imperial title. The adjective *supplices* (literally meaning bending down) and the verb *rogamus* are redeemed from the religious vocabulary of pagan Roman (as evidenced in Ovid's Metamorphosis' "*supplice voce rogant*") for the worship of the one true God. Formality of language serves to foster humility.

The *dona, munera, and sacrificia* can serve a synonyms. More precisely, *dona* means gifts, *munus* means office as when someone performs his office, but in the plural *munera*, it conveys the sense of our daily and services and worship offered. *Sacrificia* is the plural of Latin word for sacrifice which can be both spiritual and material. Thus, both a contrite upright heart or the unspoiled bread, wine, and water are necessary. The sacrifice is unblemished when the integrity of the offeror and the offerings consonant. Our outward offering cannot substitute for a right interior disposition of soul. Thus, when we ask God to accept our offerings we are acknowledging that God cannot tricked nor manipulated by us. We ask God to bless our offerings to make them and us worthy of Himself. Nevertheless, the Eucharist is always effective because the primary offeror and offered is unblemished Jesus Christ Himself. In fact, the first thing prayed for it that the Church have peace, the biblical *shalom*, the integrity of being right with God and each other. The verbs which follow specify how that peace is sustained.

Finally, throughout the Canon and most of the Liturgy, the priest does not say, "I" but "we" because he speaks in the name of all the members of the Church assembled. God calls us to unite in worship as members of the visible Mystical Body of Christ. To willfully absent ourselves from Sunday Mass is a sinful act of rebellion and denial of our communion with God and each other. Thus, the petition of the Canon is for the Church Herself. Church in both Hebrew (*qahal*) and Greek (*ekklesia*) literally means those called together out of the world although we still remain in it. Numerous teachings of Jesus teach the importance of the individual. However, Jesus established a flock of sheep not lone wolves. In this regard, the words Catholic and Apostolic modifying the Faith of the Church are important. Faith is Catholic because it is not limited to one time or place. Catholic Faith is given by God, supposed to be believed by all, everywhere, and always. The Catholic Faith is not a sect, but meant for all peoples. Moreover, Faith is Apostolic because what we believe and do can be traced back to the very Apostles who knew and received from Christ. It is primarily the mission of the Pope as successor of St. Peter, the local bishop, and all fosterers of the Faith, namely, bishops, to receive and faithfully hand on the Catholic Faith. However, some distinguished commentators such as Florus of Lyons, Pope Innocent III, and William Durandus of Mende understand *cultoribus* as referring to all the baptized who love and live out the Catholic Faith. Whatever the interpretation of *cultoribus* the focus is making the true God known and loved.

In sum, the *Te igitur* is a prayer that asks for acceptance of our sacrifices and a blessing upon the visible Church.
