

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Communicantes

Official Latin

Communicántes, et memóriam venerántes, in prímis gloriósae semper Vírginis Mariae, Genetrícis Dei et Dómini nostri Iesu Christi*: sed et beáti Ióseph, eiúsdem Vírginis Sponsi, et beatórum Apostolórum ac Mártyrum tuórum: Petri et Pauli, Andréae, (Iacóbi, Ioánnis, Thomæ, Iacóbi, Philíppi, Bartholomaéi, Matthaéi, Simónis et Thaddaéi; Lini, Cleti, Cleméntis, Xysti, Cornélii, Cypriáni, Lauréntii, Chrysógoni, Ioánnis et Pauli, Cosmae et Damiáni) et ómnium Sanctórum tuórum; quorum méritis, precibúsque concédas, ut in ómnibus protectiónis tuae muniámur auxílio. Official English

In communion with those whose memory we venerate, especially the glorious ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of our God and Lord, Jesus Christ,* and blessed Joseph, her Spouse, your blessed Apostles and Martyrs, Peter and Paul, Andrew, (James, John, Thomas, James, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Simon and Jude; Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, Cornelius, Cyprian, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmas and Damian) and all your Saints; we ask that through their merits and prayers, in all things we may be defended by your protecting help. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)

Literal English

In communion with and venerating the memory, firstly, of the glorious ever-Virgin Mary, Mother of our God and Lord, Jesus Christ,* and of blessed Joseph, the Spouse of the same Virgin, of your blessed Apostles and Martyrs, of Peter and Paul, Andrew, (James, John, Thomas, James, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Simon and Jude; Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, Cornelius, Cyprian, Lawrence, Chrysogonus, John and Paul, Cosmas and Damian) and all your Saints; by whose merits and prayers, you might grant that in all things we may be fortified by the help of your protection. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)

Like the preceding *Memento*, the *Communicantes* will also have a parallel in a prayer after the Consecration. However, at this point in the Eucharistic Prayer, as the *Memento* seeks to keep us mindful the Church Militant on Earth, the *Communicantes* seeks to emphasize our fellowship with the Church Triumphant in Heaven. In fact, all the saints are present at the Holy Sacrifice, because they are present wherever Jesus Christ is present. (Rev. 14:1-13) Through, with, and in Christ, we are already in communion with the saints living with God in Heaven, albeit awaiting the resurrection. Since they are already in heaven, we are also *venerantes*, that is, we are venerating them as our heroes in the Faith and as intercessors with God for us. Saint James 5:16 teaches that the "continuous prayer of a righteous person has great value." They have fought the good fight (1 Tim. 6:12) and stand before the throne of God making petition night and day. (Rev. 5:8; 7:10-15) Their merits are God's own gifts which God crowns. But, since they freely responded to and cooperated with God's grace, we venerate the saints. Notably, this veneration is a form of giving honor and respect, as is due to parents according to the Fourth Commandment. Veneration is not adoration which belongs to God alone as the source of all good.

Fittingly, the first saint mentioned is Holy Mary, who is in a saintly category all her own. She is addressed as the glorious ever-Virgin. This title is a witness to the Catholic Faith that Mary remained a virgin before, during, and after the Birth of Jesus Christ. She is also called Mother of our God and Lord Jesus Christ. This title is also important because it affirms that Mary, though a creature, is mother of Jesus who, although existing eternally as Son of God, truly became human in Mary's womb.

Besides Holy Mary and besides Joseph who was added to the Canon by Pope John XXIII in 1962, there are twenty-four other saints named in the *Communicantes*. The first twelve names are Apostles. However, Paul is given a place instead of Matthias, who is mentioned later. The inclusion of Paul is certainly because of his connection with the Church of Rome, having been a missionary and martyr there. In fact, the Roman Church has almost always named Peter and Paul together as brothers in the Faith, even if the Bishop of Rome is the successor of Peter.

Following the names of the Apostles, are Martyrs venerated by the Church of Rome. Linus, Cletus, Clement, Sixtus, and Cornelius are Popes. Lawrence, a Spaniard and Deacon of Rome, and John and Paul, laymen, brothers, and military officers, died in Rome. Cyprian was Bishop of Carthage in North Africa; Chrysogonus, a layman, military officer, from Aquileia in Venetia; and Cosmas and Damian, laymen, brothers, and physicians from Arabia. And of course, the list of names is not meant to be exhaustive as the phrase "and of all your saints" is added. However, in these venerable saints we recognize the apostolicity and catholicity of the Church of Rome.

To be noted is that the *Communicantes* has five alternative opening lines which are specified to be used b on certain Feast Days, before the *et memoriam venerantes* in order to provide a reflection on the feast being celebrated. Thus, there are special inserts at: Christmas and its Octave (Celebrating the most sacred night (day) on which blessed Mary the Immaculate Virgin brought forth the Savior for this world), Epiphany (Celebrating the most sacred day on which your Only Begotten Son, eternal with you in your glory, appeared in a human body, truly sharing our flesh), Easter and its Octave (Celebrating the most sacred night (day) of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh), Ascension Thursday (Celebrating the most sacred day on which your Only Begotten Son, our Lord, placed at the right hand of your glory our weak human nature, which he had united to himself), and Pentecost (Celebrating the most sacred day of Pentecost, on which the Holy Spirit appeared to the Apostles in tongues of fire).

The phrase "Through Christ our Lord. Amen." often concludes a number of the prayers of the Roman Canon, although since 1969 they are surrounded by brackets when optional. The phrase is important since all our prayers to the Father should be through Jesus Christ, our Mediator and High Priest.

Finally, the *Communicantes* of the Roman Canon is said by scholars, such as Fr. Enrico Mazza, to have similarities to the Antiochene Liturgy of Saint James and the Byzantine Liturgy of Saint Basil revealing the common Faith of the Church in her worship.
