

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER: ROMAN CANON HANC IGITUR

Official Latin

Official English

Literal English

Hanc igitur oblationem servitutis nostrae, sed et cunctae familiae tuae, quaesumus, Domine, ut placatus accipias; diesque nostros in tua pace disponas, atque ab aeterna damnatione nos eripi, et in electorum tuorum iubeas grege numerari. (Per Christum Dóminum nostrum. Amen.)

Therefore, Lord, we pray: graciously accept this oblation of our service, that of your whole family; order our days in your peace, and command that we be delivered from eternal damnation and counted among the flock of those you have chosen. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)

Therefore, Lord, we ask, that you might be pleased to accept this oblation of our servitude, but also of your whole family; and that you might arrange our days in your peace, and command that we be snatched from eternal damnation and counted among the flock of your chosen. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)


The *Hanc Igitur*, as previous parts of the Roman Canon, is addressed to God the Father as Lord, and requests that the *oblationem* that we present may be accepted. *Oblationem* is the direct object form of the noun *oblatio* from the past particple, *oblatus*, of the verb *offerre* which means to offer. Therefore, it can be translated as oblation or offering. *Oblationem* is modified by *servitutis* which is translated service in the official English, but it can be translated as servitude or can also be a humble way to say "of us," because we are God's servants. The word *familiae* is reminiscent of the *famulorum* and *famularum* of the *Memento*. Thus, those who make our offering to God are both God's servants and part of God's family.

In this part of the Eucharistic Prayer, we ask that God might *accipias*, that is, to take, receive, or accept our offering, not only of the bread and wine that have been placed upon the altar. Bread comes from many grains threshed from wheat, refined as flour, and baked. The Wine comes from grapes picked, crushed, and fermented. The fruits of the earth were made something new through the work of human hands. Now they have been removed from ordinary use to represent ourselves. But, since mere bread and wine in themselves or representing us cannot move God to give us peace, free us from sin, nor unite us the flock of God, the prayer anticipates the mystery of transubstantiation which means that they will really and truly become the Body and Blood of Christ without losing their outward appearances as bread and wine, which happens not long after these words are spoken by the priest.

Earlier, we prayed that the Lord give peace (pacificare) to the Church. In the Hanc igitur we beg the Lord to dispose, order, or arrange our days in His peace. This phrase, "diesque nostros in tua pace disponas," was added by Saint Gregory the Great who had grown up during the Gothic War in which Rome was reduced to poverty as a village of about 10,000 inhabitants. Later, he saw the invasion of the pagan Lombards. We too need to earnestly pray for peace. But because the peace that God gives which is not merely a cessation of wars, but reconciliation with God through our contrite repentance and firm purpose of amendment along with God's forgiveness of our sins, we also pray to be snatched from eternal damnation and joined to God's flock. At this point, the Hanc igitur echoes John 3:16 which acknowledges that our default position through conception and birth before God's sanctifying grace was damnation. We are born destined for damnation because of the consequences of Original Sin of the first parents of the human race. They had been made for eternal life with God, but could not bequeath to us what they lost for themselves. But, the prayer also echoes the Scriptural teaching that God did not want us to be separated from Him. The prayer includes words to like flock (grege) reminding us that God is the Good Shepherd who seeks His lost sheep (Luke 15) and His sheep who hear His voice and follow Him. The Divine Shepherd having snatched His sheep from the wolf will not let those who remain with Him be snatched away from Himself unwillingly (John 10).

In the Middle Ages there were many alternative *Hanc Igitur* prayers. St. Paulinus II of Aquileia was said to have composed a number of them. There are currently two alternative *Hanc Igitur* prayer in the Roman Missal. The one for Easter and its Octave adds between "family" and "order" a petition that the oblation "which we make to you also for those to whom you have been pleased to give the new birth of water and the Holy Spirit, granting them forgiveness of all their sins;...." The *Hanc Igitur* for a Nuptial Mass is quite different and is officially rendered as: "Therefore, Lord, we pray: graciously accept this oblation of our service, the offering of your servants N. and N. and of your whole family, who entreat your majesty on their behalf; and as you have brought them to their wedding day, so (gladden them with your gift of the children they desire and) bring them in your kindness to the length of days for which they hope. (Through Christ our Lord. Amen.)"

An interesting rubric, no longer continued in the Novus Ordo, was that while praying the *Hanc Igitur* the priest would lay his hands over the offering without touching the offering. This gesture was reminiscent of the Old Testament sacrifices when the priest put his hands over the scapegoat to set it apart from profane use since it would be set aside for sacrifice. Although the gesture is no longer prescribed, the meaning is still valid. Christ, although Good Shepherd, became one of the flock and our scapegoat to save us. Thus, the prayer end with an optional "Through Christ our Lord. Amen."


