



As you know, St. Peter's regularly has a second collection to pay off its longstanding debts to the Archdiocese of New York both for the costs of running the Parish in the past and for the many years it ran Saint Peter's Parochial School in order to provide many young people, perhaps you yourself, with a Catholic education.

As of the end of **January 2023**, the total liability of St. Peter's Parish to the Archdiocese for Parish and Parochial School Debts was **\$934,078.75**.

ST. AUGUSTINE OF HIPPO On the City of God, Bk 11, Ch. 28

"[W]e are men, created in the image of our Creator, whose eternity is true, and whose truth is eternal, whose love is eternal and true, and who Himself is the eternal, true, and adorable Trinity, without confusion, without separation; and, therefore, while, as we run over all the works which He has established, we may detect, as it were, His footprints, now more and now less distinct even in those things that are beneath us, since they could not so much as exist, or be bodied forth in any shape, or follow and observe any law, had they not been made by Him who supremely is, and is supremely good and supremely wise; yet in ourselves beholding His image, let us, like that younger son of the gospel, come to ourselves, and arise and return to Him from whom by our sin we had departed. There our being will have no death, our knowledge no error, our love no mishap. But now, though we are assured of our possession of these three things, not on the testimony of others, but by our own consciousness of their presence, and because we see them with our own most truthful interior vision, yet, as we cannot of ourselves know how long they are to continue, and whether they shall never cease to be."

LOVE AND CHRIST

It is very important to understand that *caritas* (charity) and the love of one's fellow man are not identical, although the love of one's fellow man, in its full sense, cannot be separated from *caritas*. The unique quality of *caritas* - the triumphantly transfigured goodness, the supernatural abundance, and the winged freedom - is not linked to the category of the love of one's fellow man. It establishes itself in us only in the love for God in Christ, We receive it only in devotion to Christ. Qualitatively, the love of God and the love of one's fellow man are identical, for both are *caritas*, but as categories, the love of God and the love of one's fellow man are totally different.



Dietrich von Hildebrand

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER: ROMAN CANON QUAM OBLATIONEM

Official Latin

Official English

Literal English

Quam oblationem tu, Deus, in omnibus, quaesumus, benedictam, adscriptam, ratam, rationabilem, acceptabilemque facere digneris: ut nobis Corpus et Sanguis fiat, dilectissimi Filii tui, Domini nostri Iesu Christi.

Be pleased, O God, we pray, to bless, acknowledge, and approve this offering in every respect; make it spiritual and acceptable, so that it may become for us the Body and Blood of your most beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

We ask, O God, that, in every respect, you might deign to make this oblation blessed, approved, ratified, rational and acceptable, so that it may become for us the Body and Blood of your most beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

The *Quam oblationem* begins the core of the Eucharistic Prayer, which continues until the *Memento etiam*. Modern liturgists interpret the *Quam oblationem* as an *epiclesis*, a prayer that calls down the Holy Spirit, even though there is no specific invocation of the Holy Spirit. However, in other Rites, the Holy Spirit is invoked to change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. In the Roman Canon, it is indisputable that the God the Father is asked to make the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The opening words *Quam oblationem* connect this prayer with the previous *hanc igitur oblationem*. For the *Quam oblationem*, the official English translates *oblationem* as "offering," although in the *Hanc igitur* the same word is translated as "oblation." The English word offering signifies giving something to someone purposively, while oblation has a more technical meaning in English related to an offering made to God. While the *Te igitur* and the *Memento* did not use the word *oblationem*, those parts of the Roman Canon did utilize the verb *offerimus* (we offer) with regard to these gifts, these services, these holy unblemished sacrifices, respectively. The offering is of bread and wine, but in anticipation that they will be transubstantiated into the offering of Jesus Christ.

The Roman Canon uses respectful sounding second person singular subjunctive verbs rather than harsh sounding imperative verbs with reference to God. The request is made more humble by using words such as *quaesumus* meaning "we ask" and *digneris* which means "may you deem worthy," "may you deign," or "may you condescend."

Five past passive participles are used as adjectives for the desired result of God's action on the bread and wine, namely, to make them benedictam, adscriptam, ratam, rationabilem, acceptabilemque so that they may become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. These words are rooted in Rome's legal vocabulary, but also may echo the fact the Church of Rome was initially made up from a large number of Jewish converts. *Benedictam* means divinely blessed. Adscriptam literally means written down. It sometimes was used with a technical meaning related to enrollment in a Roman voting tribe. It can be translated as marked down, enrolled, noted, registered, acknowledged, or approved. Ratam can be translated as considered, judged, established, fixed, certain, authoritative, or ratified. Rationalem means rational in the sense of endowed with reason. The official English translation uses spiritual perhaps because rational can seem limited while spiritual includes the meaning of rational. Notably, the Greek word would for rational is *logikos* which comes from *logos*, the word used in the first chapter of John to refer to Jesus Christ as the Word is God with God who became flesh. As God, Christ can create rational life. As giver of life, He can lay down His own rational life. He says, "No one takes my life from me. I give my life of my own free will. I have the authority to give my life, and I have the authority to take my life back again." (John 10:18) The sacrifice of the New Testament is the sacrifice of Jesus Christ who is God made human. Christ both is priest who offers and victim offered. His sacrifice is the perfect act of worship. Later, St. Paul in his letter to the Romans (12:1) exhorts the first Christians, "I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your rational worship (logikēn latreian)." Meanwhile, since human beings are rational animals, and because rational, have spiritual souls, the official English translation prefers to use spiritual as a translation. Acceptabilemque, is closely connected with rationalem. The Old Testament sacrifices were of cereal items or irrational beasts which merely represented the once future sacrifice of Christ. They were only acceptable in so far as taking part in them was an implicit act of faith in the coming of Christ. However, they were not acceptable in themselves. Christ alone presents the acceptable sacrifice. Thus, to become acceptable to God, bread and wine must become the Body and Blood of Christ.
