After the ceremony, the celebration will continue at The DoubleTree by Hilton Poughkeepsie.

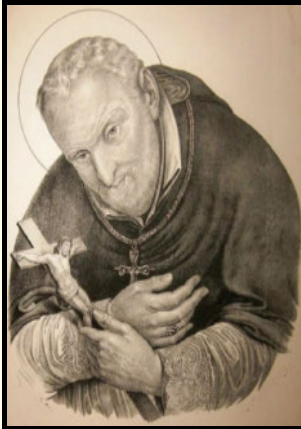

GOD'S GREATEST GIFT TO YOU



St. Alphonsus Liguori

All holiness and perfection of soul lies in our love for Jesus Christ our God, who is our Redeemer and our supreme good. It is part of the love of God to acquire and to nurture all the virtues which make a man perfect. Has not God in fact won for himself a claim on all our love? From all eternity he has loved us. And it is in this vein that he speaks to us: "O man, consider carefully that I first loved you. You had not yet appeared in the light of day, nor did the world yet exist, but already I loved you. From all eternity I have loved you."

Since God knew that man is enticed by favors, he wished to bind him to his love by means of his gifts: "I want to catch men with the snares, those chains of love in which they allow themselves to be entrapped, so that they will love me." And all the gifts which he bestowed on man were given to this end. He gave him a soul, made in his likeness, and endowed with memory, intellect and will; he gave him a body equipped with the senses; it was for him that he created heaven and earth and such an abundance of things. He made all these things out of love for man, so that all creation might serve man, and man in turn might love God out of gratitude for so many gifts.

But he did not wish to give us only beautiful creatures; the truth is that to win for himself our love, he went so far as to bestow upon us the fullness of himself. The eternal Father went so far as to give us his only Son. When he saw that we were all dead through sin and deprived of his grace, what did he do? Compelled, as the Apostle says, by the superabundance of his love for us, he sent his beloved Son to make reparation for us and to call us back to a sinless life.

By giving us his Son, whom he did not spare precisely so that he might spare us, he bestowed on us at once every good: grace, love and heaven; for all these goods are certainly inferior to the Son: He who did not spare his own Son, but handed him over for all of us: how could he fail to give us along with his Son all good things?

WISDOM OF BLESSED JOHN PAUL I

On October 9, 1963, during initial filling of the lake for the newly built Vajont Hydro-electric Dam in the Dolomite Mountains of the Veneto, a landslide caused an 820 foot wave which destroyed several villages and towns causing an estimated 2,500 deaths of people.

Pope John Paul I, then Albino Luciani, Bishop of Vittorio Veneto, commented: "We do not question God why He has permitted this trial, but we do ask ourselves rather what we ought to do in these sorrowful circumstances. The thoughts of God are inaccessible for us."

GOOD KING WENCESLAUS

September 28th is the feast day of the martyr St. Wenceslaus or Václav, Duke (Kniže) of Bohemia (907–935), who was raised as a faithful Catholic by his grandmother. His own brother Boleslav, a pagan, led the coup which assassinated him while he was entering a church. The story of his life and martyrdom became popular and he was regarded as a model Christian prince during the Middle Ages. For example, Cosmas of Prague in 1119 noted among other things in the *Chronica Boëmorum* that "rising every night from his noble bed, with bare feet and only one chamberlain, [St. Wenceslaus] went around to God's churches and gave alms generously to widows, orphans, those in prison and afflicted by every difficulty, so much so that he was considered, not a prince, but the father of all those in misery." Meanwhile, Holy Roman Emperor Otto I (r. 962-973) posthumously gave Wenceslaus the title of "King" which is why he is called such in the well-known song which was composed by John Mason Neale (1818-1866) in 1853. Although the lyrics are about Saint Wenceslaus and the tune from a 13th century spring carol "*Tempus adest floridum*" ("The Blooming Time Is Here"), which he and his music editor Thomas Helmore had found in the 1582 Finnish song collection *Piae Cantiones*, the song is regarded as a Christmas song because the good king "looked out on the Feast of St. Stephen" the proto-martyr whose feast day is celebrated on the day after Christmas, December 26. (Incidentally, thanks to Neale many Medieval hymns were rendered into English such as "All Glory, Laud and Honour," "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," "Of the Father's Heart Begotten," "Sing, My Tongue, the Glorious Battle," and "Ye Sons and Daughters of the King" which can be found in our *Pew Missal*.) The hymn presents an example of St. Wenceslaus' famed charity. His faithful servants goes with him to aid the poor man despite the difficulty of their journey. The final verse invites us to imitate the saint in his footsteps and to likewise show charity to those in need.



*Good King Wenceslaus looked out
On the Feast of Stephen
When the snow lay round about
Deep and crisp and even.
Brightly shone the moon that night
Though the frost was cruel
When a poor man came in sight
Gathering winter fuel.*

*Hither, page, and stand by me
If thou knowst it, telling.
Yonder peasant, who is he?
Where and what his dwelling?
Sire, he lives a good league hence
Underneath the mountain,
Right against the forest fence
By Saint Agnes fountain.*

*Bring me flesh and bring me wine
Bring me pine logs hither.
Thou and I will see him dine
When we bear them thither.
Page and monarch, forth they went
Forth they went together
Through the rude winds wild
lament and the bitter weather.*

*Sire, the night is darker now
And the winds blows stronger
Failed my heart, I know not how
I can go no longer.

Shall yourselves find blessing.*

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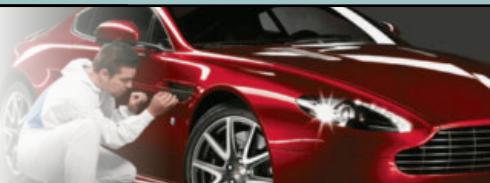
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
