

FIRST SATURDAY CLUB FOR AND BY PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES



He is an active member of St. Barnabas' Church, a second-degree blackbelt in martial arts, and volunteers with his wife and children.

Speaker Penelope Rose

Northeast Regional Coordinator of Students for Life.

Penelope will be discussing how Chemical Abortion works, the dangers of Chemical Abortion, and how you can stand against these dangerous pills on your campus and in your community. Penelope Rose is so blessed that she has the opportunity to work full-time in the Pro-Life movement. She grew up in a large Catholic family in Wallkill, New York, She attended SUNY Ulster Community College and graduated in May of 2023 with an Associates Degree in Liberal Arts: Humanities & Social Sciences. She initially became active in the Pro-Life movement when she was a freshman in high school after a debate assignment ignited her passion for Pro-life advocacy. The tragedy of abortion was engraved in her heart and so she decided to start Students for Life Group at her public high school. After starting this Prolife group, she was harassed by her peers even to the point of receiving death threats. This experience only motivated her to keep fighting for the preborn even more. In her senior year of high school, she was a Thaddeus Steven's Fellow with Students for Life of America.
