November 16, 2025 World Day of the Poor Month of the Faithful Departed

Dear friends in the Lord:

At this time of year, during the month of November, we come together to offer thanks to the Lord for the many blessings He has given us. It is also the occasion when we look to give something back to those who are poor. For more than 100 years, Catholic Charities has been serving all New Yorkers in need by making available a range of services that provide help and create hope for the most vulnerable among us, Catholics, and non-Catholics alike.

Beginning in 2017 with the centennial of Catholic Charities, I was pleased to inaugurate the Catholic Charities Campaign for Charity and Justice. Last year, it was renamed the Campaign for Help and Hope, a transformation of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development that better reflects what we do. Funds raised offer grants to parish and community groups to further the service mission of the Church here at home. Last year's collection totaled \$313,933. Awards are made to projects that are founded on the core Catholic belief in the dignity of each person, as made in the image of God, and try to advance Catholic Charities' mission to build a more just and compassionate society. A key feature is that a significant portion of the funds raised will provide several grants to our parishes, in addition to community-based works of charity and justice across the archdiocese.

This offering is being collected on November 23, just a week after the World Day of the Poor, and the Sunday before Thanksgiving. The connection is so clear. Your support makes a real difference for people living in poverty across our archdiocese. It provides an opportunity to concretize Pope Leo's recent exhortation, "I Have Loved You" (Delexi Te), that the Church be a community that prioritizes the needs of the poor.



UNCREATED WISDOM AND CREATED WISDOM

Oration Against the Arians (2:78,79)

Saint Athanasius of Alexandria (c. 296-373) was the great defender of the Catholic Faith against the heresy of the priest Arius who taught that Jesus is not true God. As bishop, though supported by the Popes of Rome, he suffered persecution and exile from his episcopal see of Alexandria in Egypt because of the Roman Emperors Constantine, Constantius II, Julian the Apostate and Valens. After the persecution, he built up his diocese, promoted monasticism, and continued to write in defense of the Catholic Faith. The following passage explains how Christ is the eternal Wisdom of God through whom the Father created all things impressing Christ's image on all to varying degrees.



An impress of Wisdom has been created in us and in all [God's] works. Therefore, [the Son of God] the true Wisdom which shaped the world claims for Himself all that bears his image, and rightly says: *The Lord created me in His works*. These words are really spoken by the wisdom that is in us, but the Lord himself here adopts them as his own. Wisdom Himself is not created, because He is the Creator, but by reason of the created image of Himself found in his works, He speaks thus as though he were speaking of himself. Our Lord said: *He who receives you receives Me*, and He could say this because the impress of Himself is in us. In the same way, although Wisdom is not to be numbered among created things, yet because His form and likeness is in His works, He speaks as if He were a creature, and says: *The Lord created me in his works, when his purpose first unfolded*.

The likeness of Wisdom has been stamped upon creatures in order that the world may recognize in it the Word who was its maker and through the Word come to know the Father. This is Paul's teaching: What can be known about God is clear to them, for God has shown it to them. Ever since the creation of the world His invisible nature has been there for the mind to perceive in things that have been made. Accordingly the Word is not a creature, because the passage that begins: The Lord created me... is to be understood as referring to that wisdom which is truly in us and is said to be so.

So, there is a wisdom in created things, as the son of Sirach too bears witness: *The Lord has poured it out upon all his works, to be with men as His gift, and with wisdom He has abundantly equipped those who love Him.* This quality of being "poured out" belongs not to the essence of that self-existent Wisdom who is the Only-begotten, but to that wisdom which reflects the only begotten one in the world. Why then is it beyond belief if the creative and archetypal Wisdom, whose likeness is the wisdom and understanding poured out in the world, should say, as though speaking directly of himself: *The Lord created me in his works?* For the wisdom in the world is not creative, but is itself created in God's works, and in the light of this wisdom *the heavens declare the glory of God, and the firmament proclaims the work of his hands*.
