



Dear Parishioners: This message comes the Sunday after Thanksgiving through my missing the publication deadline for the November 23 bulletin. I hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving. I especially will have remembered you in my personal intention at morning Mass on Thanksgiving Day. While Thanksgiving is the name of one of the great American holidays, it also describes what we do every Sunday as Christians since the heart of our week is our Sunday Holy Eucharist. Eucharist is from a Greek word that literally means "Thanksgiving." 

## LITURGICAL PHRASES EVERY CATHOLIC SHOULD KNOW

(In 7 languages)

Latin	English	Italian	French	Portugese	Spanish	Romanian

Spanish and Portuguese have remained most faithful to the Latin. Italian and French substituted a word derived from Latin *precari* which can also mean to pray but usually means to ask, beg, or entreat. Romanian uses a word derived from Latin *rogare* which means to ask or request.



From the Second Letter to the Corinthians of Pope Saint Clement I of Rome (r. 96-110)

## COMPUNCTION ACCORDING TO SAINT GREGORY THE GREAT

Dialogues III, 34.

"There are many types of compunction, because every kind of fault causes regret in a repentant soul. For this reason, Jeremias, speaking in the name of contrite sinners, says, 'My eye has run down with streams of water.' (Lam.3:48) There are two main types of compunction, however. The penitent thirsting for God feels the compunction of fear at first; later on, he experiences the compunction of love. When he considers his sins he is overcome with weeping because he fears eternal punishment. Then when this fear subsides through prolonged sorrow and penance, a feeling of security emerges from an assurance of forgiveness, and the soul begins to burn with love for heavenly joys. Now the same person, who wept out of fear of punishment, sheds abundant tears because his entrance into the kingdom of heaven is being delayed. Once we envision the choirs of angels, and fix our gaze on the company of the saints and the majesty of an endless vision of God, the thought of having no part in these joys makes us weep more bitterly than the fear of hell and the prospect of eternal misery did before. Thus, compunction of fear, when perfect, leads the soul to the compunction of love.

...So, we must with deep groans obtain from our Creator the grace of tears. ... It is of utmost importance, however, that those who are zealous for good works and devote much time to performing them should also weep over their past sins, either through fear of eternal punishment or through longing for God's kingdom. ... [The fear of punishment is given first; then only, weeping because of longing for heaven.] Yet, ... the compunction of love is greater in dignity, ....
