

### ADVENT IN THE BIBLE: PROPHECIES OF THE MESSIAH

The Bible's prophecies about the Christ (Greek for Hebrew Messiah which means "anointed") lay the foundation for Advent. A number of prophecies foretell such things as the Savior's birth, his role as a light to the nations, and even his birthplace in Bethlehem. Below are just four. During Advent, we can reflect on these ancient promises, seeing their fulfillment in Jesus, whose arrival brings hope and salvation. But as we remember Christ's first coming, we also look forward with hope to his promised coming again in glory.

- \* Isaiah 7:14: Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanu-el
- \* Isaiah 9:2: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; whose who dwelt in the land of the deep darkness, on them has light shined
- \* Isaiah 9:6: For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government will be upon his shoulder, and his name will be called 'Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace
- \* Jeremiah 23:5: Behold, the days are coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land (Modified from www.ascensionpress.com)



December 7, 2025 Season of Advent Jubilee Year of Hope

Dear friends in the Lord:

As we approach the annual collection for the *Retirement Fund for Religious* – an appeal that benefits nearly 25,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests – I reflect on the ministry of women and men religious – past and present – and I am grateful for the ways they have shaped my own faith, and the tremendous service they have offered our archdiocese.

In their younger years, they laid the foundation for Catholic schools, parish religious education programs, hospitals, and works of mercy with very little compensation, leaving their religious communities with a shortage of retirement savings. Today, many serve in volunteer ministry. Others are frail and need assistance. Yet all remain committed to their vocations, accepting the limitations of aging and embracing the opportunity to spend more time praying for our Church and world.

Your gift, which will be collected on December 14, offers support that helps religious communities provide loving care for older members while ensuring younger ones can continue the good works of their elders. Rising health care costs and decreased income compound the challenge to meet day-to-day needs for medications, nursing assistance, and other necessities. Over 20 congregations in the archdiocese received more than \$2,000,000 in grants from this national collection.



# **2025 Jubilee Year of Hope**



Pope Francis has announced the 2025 Jubilee of Hope, which will run from December 24, 2024 to January 6, 2026.

Holy doors will be opened in Rome at St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican, the Cathedral of St. John Lateran, the Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major and the Papal Basilica of St. Paul outside the walls. The Pope also gave indications that, in all the cathedrals of the world, diocesan bishops would celebrate the Eucharist as a solemn opening of the jubilee year. The Holy Father encourages local pilgrimages to cathedrals and other sacred places where indulgences may be obtained.

### Cardinal Dolan has designated eight jubilee pilgrimage sites throughout the archdiocese:

- The National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Middletown
- The Franciscan Friars of the Atonement at Graymoor, Garrison
- Mount Alvernia Retreat Center, Wappingers Falls
- The National Shrine of Mary Help of Christians, Stony Point
- St. Frances Cabrini Shrine, Upper Manhattan
- St. Patrick's Cathedral, Midtown Manhattan
- The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral, Mulberry Street
- The Schoenstatt Shrine of Light, Staten Island

The official opening of the Jubilee Year 2025 will occur in the Archdiocese of New York with Mass celebrated by His Eminence, Timothy Cardinal Dolan, on the Solemnity of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, on Sunday, December 29th at 10:15 am at St Patrick's Cathedral. **Indulgences During the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025** 

During the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, all the faithful, who are moved by a spirit of charity and who, purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, will be able to **gain a plenary indulgence for the remission and forgiveness of all their sins**, which can be applied to the souls in purgatory. The jubilee indulgence is especially linked to works of mercy and penance, which bear witness to the conversion undertaken. Pilgrims of hope attain the jubilee indulgence by performing any of the following acts alongside the usual spiritual, sacramental, and prayer conditions:

- Devout participation in Holy Mass or a celebration of the Word of God, the Liturgy of the Hours, the via crucis, the Marian rosary, or the recitation of the Akathist hymn;
- A penitential celebration, which ends with the individual confessions of the penitents, as established in the Rite of Penance (form II);
- Engagement in Eucharistic adoration and meditation at any designated jubilee site, concluding with the Our Father, the profession of faith in any legitimate form, and invocations to Mary, the Mother of God;
- Visiting, for an appropriate amount of time, their brothers and sisters who are in need or in difficulty (the sick, prisoners, lonely elderly people, disabled people...), making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them;
- Abstaining at least for one day of the week from distractions (including, for example, the use of media and/or social networks);
- Abstaining from superfluous consumption and donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor;
- Sustaining works in support of the defense, protection, and quality of life in all its phases;
- Dedicating a portion of one's free time to voluntary activities that are of service to the community.

The faithful who are truly repentant of sin but who cannot participate in the various solemn celebrations for serious reasons (especially the elderly, the sick, prisoners, and those who, through their work in hospitals or other care facilities, provide continuous service to the sick), can obtain the jubilee indulgence, under the same conditions if, united in spirit with the faithful taking part in person, they recite the Our Father, the profession of faith in any approved form, and other prayers in conformity with the objectives of the Holy Year, in their homes or wherever they are confined.

Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, those who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in purgatory, if they receive Holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, applicable only to the deceased (this must take place within a Eucharistic celebration).
