ST. PAULINUS OF AQUILEIA

St. Paulinus of Aquileia (c. 726-802) was a priest, theologian, and poet who was nominated by Charlemagne to be Patriarch of Aquileia in the northeast of Italy in 787. He participated in synods and opposed the semi-Nestorian heresy called Spanish Adoptionism. He formulated the doctrine of interpolation, wherein words can be added to the Nicene Creed by Church authority, such as the *Filioque*, since the doctrine is implicit in the Apostolic Faith. Paulinus was bishop of Europe's then largest diocese and sent missionaries to the pagan Avars and Slovenes to share with them the Catholic Faith. He is author of several doctrinal works, many letters, and likely the hymn *Ubi Caritas* which is often ascribed to his authorship. The following excerpt of a translation I did for my licentiate is from St. Paulinus' *Book of Exhortation* written for Eric, Duke of Cividale. His feast day is January 11.



Chapter 4 Conversion to God

[7.] Indeed, my dearest brother, may the spiritual grace of knowledge be upon your head. May it illumine your mind, and lead you to eternal life, just as I desire and hope. For, with every affection of my heart, I hope and pray to God, that you extend yourself to interior things, until you arrive at the sublime crown of perpetual beatitude, and that you do not permit the nobility of your mind, which in you I know very well, to move away from the love of Christ either by any advice of friends or any ambition of worldly desires.

[8.] Do not obscure your own goodness by the malice of others, but wherever, and as much as you can, let yourself appear loveable in the presence of God and of all people. The grace of the helping God will not be lacking to you, if you have the will to accept the holy admonition to which the mind of Your Goodness very often attends in the Divine Scriptures.

Chapter 5 Recommendations on alms, and pious works

[9.] I beg you, even as a layman, be ready for every work of God (*opus Dei*): pious towards the poor and towards the infirm, a consoler of the sorrowing, compassionate to the miseries of all, generous in almsgiving, being mindful of the two mites of the widow in the Gospel [Lk 21:1-4] and the prophetic saying, “*Break your bread for the hungry.*” [Isa 58:7] And be careful, having foresight in the distribution of alms, so that for both the giver as well as for the receiver, it might be a solace. ©

A NOTE ON CREMATION

Cremation is permitted by the Catholic Church, as long as it is not being chosen to deny belief in the resurrection of the body or the dignity of the human body. The Church prefers burial or entombment of the body. However, if cremation is chosen, Catholics must treat the cremains (ashes) with the same respect as they would treat the body. Cremains should be buried or entombed as soon as possible after a Funeral Mass. It would be a sin to sprinkle cremains over land or water. Nor may cremains be divided among multiple family members and friends. Just as the body is reverently buried, so too should cremains be laid to rest with reverence and with prayer. Please speak with a priest if you have a question.


