**REMINDER:** Please be certain to use the offering envelopes that are mailed to you each month, when making your weekly offering. There are blank church envelopes available at the entrances to the chapel to use when your personalized envelopes are not available. Please be certain to write your ID number on the blank envelope to ensure that proper credit is applied to your account.

## WHY REGISTER WITH A PARISH?

Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass? Attendance at Holy Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation is a key mark of a faithful Catholic. According to Canon Law, one is a parishioner of the parish in whose boundaries one resides, unless one registers with another parish. Yet, registration is important for a number of reasons. For example, registration is the public act by which an adult declares that he or she is a member of a parish community committed to the mission of making Christ known in the local community. Registration is a mature act of commitment to the parish community, and a will to be identified with and included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration affects the parish, since parish census numbers can determine: how many priests are assigned to a parish, what benefits and obligations the parish has to the archdiocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled. Registration facilitates the religious education of children, and the scheduling of baptisms, marriages, quinceañeras, and funerals. Registration fulfills one of the requirements enabling the pastor to issue a letter of good standing to a parishioner to be a godparent for baptism or sponsor for confirmation. It also enables the parish to track donations and offertory contributions and to issue a statement for one's taxes. Most importantly, it is a sign of your commitment to your Catholic identity and to your willingness to take part in the life and work of the Catholic Church.

## IMPORTANT NOTES FOR HOSPITAL VISITS

**Priest chaplains:** Whether going to the hospital for a scheduled procedure or for an emergency, make sure to make it clear that you are a "Catholic" and that you want a visit by a priest chaplain for the sacraments. This is important because some hospitals no longer ask you. In some cases, parishioners who have been admitted to the hospital, were not asked and were listed as having "no religion."

**Emergencies:** In an emergency at home, call the parish priest immediately after calling the ambulance. It is easier for him to administer the sacraments at your home than to get access to you in the emergency room. Also, if you are going to the hospital in an emergency, ask for the hospital chaplain before calling for your parish priest. Even if a Rabbi or Protestant minister comes, tell them you want a priest. The chaplain is usually on site and can get to you most quickly. Moreover, the chaplain has special privileges to go into areas where non chaplains may not be allowed. Of course, if the priest chaplain is for some reason not available, call your parish priest. And even after the chaplain gets to you, inform your parish priest that you would like a follow up visit. He wants to know you are in the hospital and visit you. But remember that the chaplain is like the pastor of the hospital.

**Scheduled procedures:** If you are going to the hospital for a procedure for a medical condition, talk to your parish priest before you go. Set up a time to celebrate the sacraments of confession and anointing of the sick. Strengthening the health of the soul can have a profound impact on physical bodily healing.

## FIRST THURSDAY HOLY HOUR

Cardinal Dolan had asked back in the summer of 2025 that the parish have a Holy Hour for Vocations to the Priesthood. Jesus Christ, the High Priest, established the ordained priesthood on Holy Thursday. The ordained priest is necessary to offer the unbloody Sacrifice of the Mass making present Christ's one saving sacrifice of the Cross on our altars. The priest has been given by Christ through ordination, Christ's authority to forgive sins in Christ's name. The priest has been given the power to bless and anoint. Pope St. John Paul II used to repeat, "Without priests there is no Eucharist. Without the Eucharist there is no Church." In order to be the People of God, we must do our part to encourage, inspire, and pray for vocations to the sacred priesthood. Here are some prayers, adapted from the Roman Missal, that can be used in private prayers.

Ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest, says Jesus to his disciples. (Mt 9: 38)

Let us pray.

O God, who willed to provide shepherds for your people, pour out in your Church a spirit of piety and fortitude, to raise up worthy ministers for your altars and make them ardent yet gentle heralds of your Gospel. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Look kindly, we pray,

O Lord, on the prayers of your people, that the stewards of your mysteries may grow in number and persevere always in your love. Through Christ our Lord.

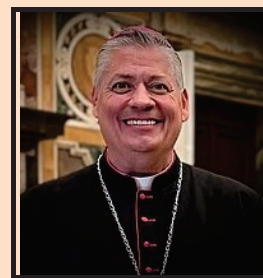

## **BISHOP JOHN S. BONNICI**

On Wednesday, January 8, 2026 Pope Leo XIV appointed Bishop John S. Bonnici Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, New York. He succeeds Bishop Salvatore R. Matano who will reach the age of 80 in September. His installation as Bishop of Rochester is scheduled for Thursday, March 19, 2026, the solemnity of St. Joseph. Bishop Bonnici, born in New York City, was ordained a priest of New York by Cardinal John O'Connor on June 22, 1991, after seminary studies at the Pontifical North American College and study at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome. The Cardinal was assigned to pursue graduate studies at the Pontifical John Paul II Institute in Rome where he earned his Licentiate of Sacred Theology degree in 1992. Later, in 1995, he was assigned to earn a Doctorate in Sacred Theology at the Washington, D.C. campus of the Pontifical John Paul II Institute.

His first assignment was as parochial vicar at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Parish in Elmsford, New York in 1992. In 1995, he was appointed assistant director of the Archdiocesan Family Life/Respect Life Office, and as director in 1996. From 2002 to 2008, he was named pastor of St. Philip Neri Parish in the Bronx, and transferred in 2008 to St. Columba Parish in Chester, New York. He also served as parochial administrator at St. Mary's Parish in Washingtonville, New York, from 2020 to 2021. Since 2021, he has served as pastor of Sts. John and Paul and St. Augustine in Larchmont, New York.
