



### **LENTEN DISHES - BIGOI IN SALSA**

(Bigoi is a Venetian thick spaghetti made from durum wheat and eggs)

Serves 3-4

- \* salted anchovies
- \* 14 oz/400 grams of Bigoi (as a substitute use spaghetti)
- \* salt
- \* 4 Tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- \* 2 onions
- \* freshly ground pepper
- \* 1 bunch of flat leaf parsley to garnish



Wash the anchovies, removing any bones. Cut small. Peel the onions and slice finely. Boil the pasta in plenty of salted water until al dente - just firm to the bite. Meanwhile, gently heat half the olive oil in a skillet and saute' the onions until soft, without browning. Go slow with this. Add a little water if necessary. Add the anchovies and cook gently until they disintegrate. Remove from the heat. Stir in the remaining olive oil. Transfer the pasta to plates and pour over the sauce. Season with freshly ground pepper and garnish with whole parsley.

## EMBER DAYS

Before Pope Paul VI replaced the traditional Roman Rite of Mass and the Roman Liturgical Calendar in the Advent of 1969, the Roman Church, since its earliest days, had celebrated Ember Days on the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday of four different weeks during the year. These were days for prayer, fasting, and abstinence, occurring around the change of the four seasons, reminders of the blessings of creation, drawing from us gratitude, and also reminders of our need for moderation in our use of creation while being generous to those in need. Often Ordinations took place at these times. In the Old Testament's Book of Zechariah, there is mention of the ancient Jewish practice of fasting four times a year (8:19). Meanwhile, the *Didache* or *Teaching of the Apostles*, composed around 60 AD, notes that the first Christians fasted on Wednesdays and Fridays. Significantly, Wednesday was the day Jesus was betrayed by Judas and Friday the day Jesus died on the Cross. Saturday, the Jewish Sabbath, was the day Jesus rested in the tomb. Thus, marking these three days four times a year by the Roman Church became known as the "*Quatuor Tempora*," in Latin, meaning the "four times." Somehow, the Latin "*tempora*" came to be pronounced as "ember" in English. Pope Leo the Great (440-461) considered the Ember Days as an Apostolic institution. Pope Gelasius (492-496) speaks of all four, and after his time their observance spread from Rome to England in the late 6<sup>th</sup> century, to France and Germany during the 8<sup>th</sup> century, by the Carolingians, and to Spain in the 11<sup>th</sup> century.


While the themes of penance, gratitude, and prayer are similar to each of the set of Ember Days, each set had a special emphasis. The "Winter" Ember Days fall during Advent after December 13, the Feast of St. Lucy, and convey a theme of coming Divine Judgment. The "Spring" Ember Days occur after the First Sunday of Lent and stress the importance of the Lenten discipline. The "Summer" Ember Days occur after Pentecost Sunday during the Octave of Pentecost with stress placed on the harvest of souls due to the Holy Spirit, forgiveness and healing. The "Fall" Ember Days occur in September, but immediately after September 14, the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Notably, these days almost always coincide with Yom Kippur, and the texts of the Masses stress that the fulfillment of the Temple sacrifice in Jesus Christ who is our atonement with God the Father. According to Fr. Charles J. Callan, O.P., a good way of remembering these dates is the rhyme "Lenty, Penty, Crucy, Lucy" representing Lent, Pentecost, Cross, and Lucy. In Rome, the Pope would offer Holy Mass at the Basilica of St. Mary Major on Ember Wednesday, the Church of the Holy Apostles on Ember Friday, and at St. Peter's Basilica on Ember Saturday. The pre-1965 Roman Missal, in the formulary for the Ember days, retains in part the old practice of lessons from Scripture in addition to the usual two, namely, for the Wednesdays three, for the Saturdays six, and seven for the Saturday in December.

The penance demanded on the Ember Days used to be abstinence from meat. Wednesday and Saturday once required partial abstinence, allowing meat to be consumed at one meal. However, Friday required total abstinence, meaning no meat at all. Pope Paul VI removed this as an obligation. However, each individual Catholic can judge for him or herself whether or not to follow the traditional practices. Thus, although they are no longer liturgically observed in the *Novus Ordo* Liturgy, Catholics may want to observe them informally by personal prayer and adopting the old fasting and abstinence rules in so far as we can, without being bound under pain of sin, in their homes as a time tested Catholic tradition. We should also pray for vocations to the priesthood.



## **OLDEST PRIEST IN ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK** **REFLECTS ON 104 YEARS OF LIFE AND 78 YEARS OF MINISTRY**

PARK RIDGE, New Jersey (OSV News) — At age 104, Monsignor James C. Turro is the oldest priest in the Archdiocese of Newark, and possibly the United States, and also holds the distinction of being the oldest living alumnus of Seton Hall University. He is a beloved presence at Our Lady of Mercy Parish in Park Ridge, where he served as a weekend assistant for more than 50 years and is now in residence. Parishioners and visitors from across the country visit him at the rectory, and he regularly speaks with students from Our Lady of Mercy Academy after daily Mass. He also remains active in ministry, celebrating Mass and offering pastoral counsel as needed. Over the years, he has presided over approximately 900 baptisms and 400 weddings in Park Ridge alone.

“I thought I’d like being a priest, but I didn’t know how much I would enjoy it until I actually put my hands to it,” Monsignor Turro said, reflecting on his 104 years of life and 78 years of ministry.

“I never reached a point where I stopped to think, am I doing the right thing? I felt God wanted me to be a priest, so I went ahead with it,” he told Jersey Catholic, the news outlet of the Archdiocese of Newark.

### **A Week of Birthday Celebrations**

When he turned 104 on January 26, he marked his birthday with a week of celebrations surrounded by family, parishioners, and well-wishers at Our Lady of Mercy. The celebrations began January 24, when Monsignor Turro’s relatives traveled from across the United States to visit him at the parish rectory for an early birthday gathering. A major snowstorm that weekend prevented a celebration on his actual birthday, January 26, though he received numerous phone calls and cards from friends around the world. During Mass on January 27, the congregation sang “Happy Birthday,” and the parish music director performed several of the monsignor’s favorite hymns. In the days that followed, parish community members stopped by the rectory to extend their greetings, many bringing his favorite dessert, chocolate cake. The weeklong celebration concluded February 1 with a “Muffins with Monsignor” gathering for parishioners after Mass.

He has touched the lives of numerous people. Does he ever stop and think about that?

“No, strangely,” he said. “I just do what’s expected of me and let the good wealth result from my activity. But I never stopped to doubt, could I be doing something better than I am right now?”

### **The Joy of Celebrating Mass Daily**

He added, “The high moment in any day is my celebrating Mass. And you stop to think, what am I doing here? You can’t beat this! This is the tops! ... It’s not once a month or something, I go to Mass every day, and say Mass very, very often.” Faith was central to Monsignor Turro’s life while growing up in Jersey City, where he attended St. Paul of the Cross Elementary School and St. Peter’s Prep. Partly inspired by two aunts, who were Sisters of Charity, he was ordained a priest in 1948 and began his ministry at Holy Trinity Church in Hackensack. After two years, he enrolled at The Catholic University of America in Washington, earning a licentiate in sacred theology, followed by a licentiate in sacred Scripture from the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome. He later joined the faculty of Immaculate Conception Seminary.

### A Legacy of Formation and Service

Monsignor Turro's most significant impact came through his work as a seminary professor, forming generations of priests over 60 years and writing several books. The seminary library at Seton Hall University now bears his name. But throughout his academic career, he remained active in parish ministry, serving as weekend assistant at Our Lady of Mercy. There, he became known for his concise homilies that rarely exceeded a single page. Over the years, the monsignor has offered countless Masses and enriched the lives of untold numbers of people in ways large and small. It would be understandable if, in his more than 77 years of ministry, Monsignor Turro had occasionally grown weary of his job or questioned his vocation. Such was never the case, however. "In every profession there's, how shall I put it?, the routine moments, days even," Monsignor Turro said. "That has never put me off. There must be some priests who get up and say, 'Oh, it's another day, another Mass.' ... But I've got to say, it's never been a cross for me where I have to force myself to do these things, thank God."


### Words of Wisdom for Those Losing Hope

In looking back on the many changes he has lived through as a priest, Monsignor Turro was asked what advice he'd give to people who are afraid or are losing hope.

"It's hard because some of those people seem determined to be negative, to be doubtful, rather than simply to give themselves over to God," he said. "'Here I am, Lord, do with me what thou wilt.'

"That should be the maxim that we go by. You can't beat that. That's the winning formula: 'Here I am, Lord, do with me what thou wilt.'"
