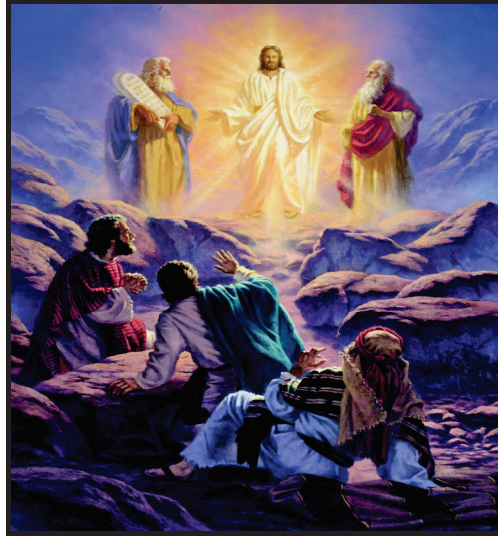

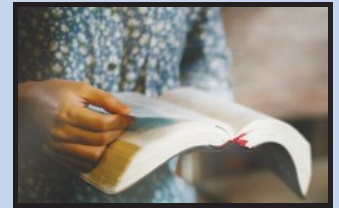

FIRST THURSDAY HOLY HOUR

Cardinal Dolan had asked back in the summer of 2025 that the parish have a Holy Hour for Vocations to the Priesthood. The ordained priest is necessary to offer the unbloody Sacrifice of the Mass making present Christ's one saving sacrifice of the Cross on our altars. PREPARING FOR CONFESSION

Examine your conscience.

Remember!

Every sin has a NAME.

Be sure to tell the NAME of the sin to the priest,
and, if mortal, HOW MANY TIMES you committed it.
It is a good rule to always confess your Mortal sins first,
then any venial sins you may wish to confess.

Important!

A sin is Mortal if all of the following three things are present.
If any one of the three is missing, then it is not a Mortal Sin.

1. It must be a BIG (serious) SIN (according to Jesus or the Church).
2. I must KNOW that it is a BIG SIN.
3. I must DECIDE/CHOOSE/CONSENT to commit the BIG SIN.
(If I am forced at gunpoint to steal, or through forgetfulness eat meat on Fridays of Lent, or if an impure thought randomly pops into my imagination but I fight it, there is no mortal sin.)

to resolve firmly to commit them no more,
to confess them properly, and
to accept the penance the priest gives me.

LENTEN DISHES FRICO CON PATATE

(Cheese and potato fry)



- * 1 onion
- * 4 medium sized potatoes
- * 1 Tbsp. butter
- * 1-2 cups/250-500 ml of stock
- * 14 oz./400 g Montasio cheese

Chop the onion, peel the potatoes and slice them thinly. Melt the butter in a frying pan and lightly sauté the onions. Add the sliced potato and toss briefly in the butter. Pour on the stock, and cook gently until the potatoes are soft.

Meanwhile, grate or dice the cheese. Once the potatoes are cooked and all the stock absorbed or evaporated, scatter the cheese on top and let it melt. Brown slowly, pouring off the excess fat from the cheese. The *frico* is ready when the edge is browned. Serve hot.

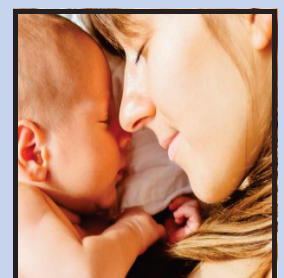

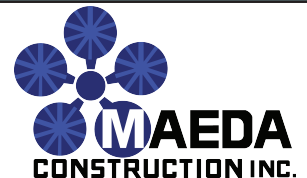
