FIRST THURSDAY HOLY HOUR - JULY 2nd (9:00 am - 10:00 am)

Cardinal Dolan had asked back in the summer of 2025 that the parish have a Holy Hour for Vocations to the Priesthood. Jesus Christ, the High Priest, established the ordained priesthood on Holy Thursday. The ordained priest is necessary to offer the unbloody Sacrifice of the Mass making present Christ's one saving sacrifice of the Cross on our altars. The priest has been given by Christ through ordination, Christ's authority to forgive sins in Christ's name. The priest has been given the power to bless and anoint. Pope St. John Paul II used to repeat, "Without priests there is no Eucharist. Without the Eucharist there is no Church." In order to be the People of God, we must do our part to encourage, inspire, and pray for vocations to the sacred priesthood.

Come and spend time with our humble Lord Jesus Christ, really and truly present in the Blessed Sacrament! He promises, "I will be with you always, until the end of time." (Mt 28:20) He fulfills His promise in the Holy Eucharist.

Act of Consecration to the Sacred Heart

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, to Thee I consecrate and offer up my person and my life, my actions, trials, and sufferings, that my entire being may henceforth only be employed in loving, honoring and glorifying Thee. This is my irrevocable will, to belong entirely to Thee, and to do all for Thy love, renouncing with my whole heart all that can displease Thee. I take Thee, O Sacred Heart, for the sole object of my love, the protection of my life, the pledge of my salvation, the remedy of my frailty and inconstancy, the reparation for all the defects of my life, and my secure refuge at the hour of my death. Be Thou, O Most Merciful Heart, my justification before God Thy Father, and screen me from His anger which I have so justly merited. I fear all from my own weakness and malice, but placing my entire confidence in Thee, O Heart of Love, I hope all from Thine infinite Goodness. Annihilate in me all that can displease or resist Thee. Imprint Thy pure love so deeply in my heart that I may never forget Thee or be separated from Thee. I beseech Thee, through Thine infinite Goodness, grant that my name be engraved upon Thy Heart, for in this I place all my happiness and all my glory, to live and to die as one of Thy devoted servants. Amen.

First Saturday of Our Lady

Saturdays are traditionally associated with Holy Mary Mother of God. It is appropriate because on the Saturday after Christ's crucifixion and death, Blessed Mary had faith in His promised resurrection.

The Promise

Following the apparitions at Fatima, on December 10, 1925, Our Lady promised Sister Lucia that She would "...assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturdays of five consecutive months confess, receive Holy Communion, pray a Rosary and keep Me company for a quarter of an hour meditating on the fifteen mysteries with the intention of offering Me reparation.

How to do the Five First Saturdays in Honor of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

There are four requirements to faithfully fulfill the five first Saturdays.

1. Go to Confession.
2. Receive Holy Communion.
3. Say five decades of the Holy Rosary.
4. Meditate for fifteen minutes on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary. (Separate from saying the Rosary.)

During an apparition of February 15, 1926, Sister Lucia presented Our Lord the problem some people had of confessing on Saturdays. She asked Our Lord if the confession would be valid if done within a period of eight days before or eight days after the first Saturday. Our Lord answered: "Yes, it can even be within many more days, provided they are in the state of grace when they receive Me, and have the intention of offering reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary." The Intention To console the Immaculate Heart of Mary, offer reparation for the blasphemies and ingratitude of unrepentant sinners, and for peace in the world.

PRAYER OF REPARATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

In one of His appearances to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, Our Lord Jesus showed her His Sacred Heart saying, "Behold the Heart that has loved men so much that It has spared nothing, even to exhausting and consuming Itself, in order to testify to them Its love. But in return I receive from the greater part of mankind only ingratitude, by reason of the contempt, irreverence, sacrilege, and coldness shown Me in this Sacrament of Love."

Jesus asks us to unite ourselves to Him and make reparation not only for our own sins, but for the offenses of others against His loving Heart. Reparation in the concrete means, for example, love for our Lord's honor, having Holy Mass offered for those in need of grace, making acts of contrition and confessions for personal sins, receiving Holy Communion as a form of reparation, and moving from prayer to acts by such things as almsgiving or acts of charity for others with the intention of reparation. The following prayer is a good start to focus or intention and cultivate a holy disposition.



O sweet Jesus, Whose overflowing charity for men is requited by so much forgetfulness, negligence and contempt, behold us prostrate before Thy altar eager to repair by a special act of homage the cruel indifference and injuries, to which Thy loving Heart is everywhere subject.

Mindful alas! that we ourselves have had a share in such great indignities, which we now deplore from the depths of our hearts, we humbly ask Thy pardon and declare our readiness to atone by voluntary expiation not only for our own personal offenses, but also for the sins of those, who, straying far from the path of salvation, refuse in their obstinate infidelity to follow Thee, their Shepherd and Leader, or, renouncing the vows of their baptism, have cast off the sweet yoke of Thy Law.

We are now resolved to expiate each and every deplorable outrage committed against Thee; we are determined to make amends for the manifold offenses against Christian modesty in unbecoming dress and behavior, for all the foul seductions laid to ensnare the feet of the innocent, for the frequent violations of Sundays and holidays, and the shocking blasphemies uttered against Thee and Thy Saints.

We wish also to make amends for the insults to which Thy Vicar on earth and Thy priests are subjected, for the profanation, by conscious neglect or terrible acts of sacrilege, of the very Sacrament of Thy Divine Love; and lastly for the public crimes of nations who resist the rights and teaching authority of the Church which Thou hast founded.

Would, O divine Jesus, we were able to wash away such abominations with our blood. We now offer, in reparation for these violations of Thy divine honor, the satisfaction Thou didst once make to Thy eternal Father on the cross and which Thou dost continue to renew daily on our altars; we offer it in union with the acts of atonement of Thy Virgin Mother and all the Saints and of the pious faithful on earth; and we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of Thy grace, for all neglect of Thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past. Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel and especially that of charity. We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending Thee and to bring as many as possible to follow Thee.

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; and by the crowning gift of perseverance keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to Thee, so that we may one day come to that happy home, where Thou with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest God, world without end. Amen.

POPES NAMED LEO

Pope Leo V was a priest from Priapi, about 20 miles south of Rome, near Ardea, but he seems to have been a priest serving a church on the outskirts of Rome when he was elected pope after the death of Pope Benedict IV in August of 903. He was known to be an admirable and holy priest. Meanwhile, the tenth century was a dangerous period in Rome with rival noble families vying for power, even by having family members and friends made priests or bishops. It is speculated that Leo was a pragmatic choice, namely because the noble families would not allow any candidate from another noble family of Rome to be elected. This secular interference in papal elections would lead to some unworthy candidates being elected, although despite their serious moral failings, they never attempted to alter Church teachings on matters of Faith and Morals. A century and a half later, a strong Pope would institute the Conclave of Cardinals to reduce secular interference in papal elections.

The only papal act for which he is remembered, is for issuing a Bull to exempt the canons of Bologna from the payment of taxes. About a month after Leo V was elected, he was taken prisoner by the cardinal-priest of San Lorenzo in Damaso, Christopher. The partisans of Christopher, declared Leo illegitimate, deposed him, and claimed to elect Christopher as Pope. Leo died in prison, perhaps by murder, not long afterward. Meanwhile, Christopher was soon rejected as an antipope and was himself deposed. Around January of 904, he was thought to have been murdered at the orders of Count Theophylact I of Tusculum who ruled Rome from 904 to 924 and supported the election of the aristocrat, Sergius III, (r. 904-911) as Pope.

Leo V is the first pope of that name not to be canonized.

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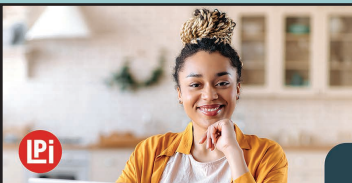
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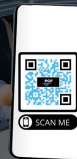


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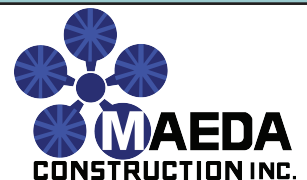
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
