Ascension of the Lord:

From Sermon LXXIV of Pope Saint Leo the Great (+ A.D. 461)

And so, dearly-beloved, let us rejoice with spiritual joy, and let us with gladness pay God worthy thanks and raise our hearts' eyes unimpeded to those heights where Christ is. Minds that have heard the call to be uplifted must not be pressed down by earthly affections, they that are fore-ordained to things eternal must not be taken up with the things that perish; they that have entered on the way of Truth must not be entangled in treacherous snares, and the faithful must so take their course through these temporal things as to remember that they are sojourning in the vale of this world, in which, even though they meet with some attractions, they must not sinfully embrace them, but bravely pass through them. For to this devotion the blessed Apostle Peter arouses us, and entreating us with that loving eagerness which he conceived for feeding Christ's sheep by the threefold profession of love for the Lord, says, "dearly-beloved, I beseech you, as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul." But for whom do fleshly pleasures wage war, if not for the devil, whose delight it is to fetter souls that strive after things above, with the enticements of corruptible good things, and to draw them away from those abodes from which he himself has been banished? Against his plots every believer must keep careful watch that he may crush his foe on the side whence the attack is made. And there is no more powerful weapon, dearly-beloved, against the devil's wiles than kindly mercy and bounteous charity, by which every sin is either escaped or vanquished. But this lofty power is not attained until that which is opposed to it be overthrown. And what so hostile to mercy and works of charity as avarice from the root of which spring all evils? And unless it be destroyed by lack of nourishment, there must needs grow in the ground of that heart in which this evil weed has taken root, the thorns and briars of vices rather than any seed of true goodness. Let us then, dearly-beloved, resist this pestilential evil and "follow after charity," without which no virtue can flourish, that by this path of love whereby Christ came down to us, we too may mount up to Him, to Whom with God the Father and the Holy Spirit is honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Symbols of Easter / Símbolos de Pascua / Symbole Wielkanocne

Another Easter folk custom -- one known all over Europe -- is that of watching the sun "dance" in joy for the risen Lord on Easter morning. The sun, already a symbol of Christ, is especially a symbol of Him as it rises and pierces the dawn on Easter Sunday. In the olden days, most people would go to a hilltop in the morning -- at dawn, just as the sun was rising like Christ rising from His tomb -- and wait to see if they could see the spectacle, sometimes watching the reflection of the sun in a lake or in a bucket of water. But a basin of water on an eastward-facing windowsill served (and serves) just as well. Of course, parents might surreptitiously give the basin a tiny shake to cause the waves that make the "miracle" manifest! (And, of course, too, God can well make the sun truly dance without our help!)

Many customs surrounding Easter are totally secular in origin, such as the German egg-laying Easter bunny traditions -- which are fine as long as they don't detract from the Season's meaning or become its focal point. Parents often put out baskets of candy "from the Easter Bunny" for the children to find on Easter morning -- baskets decorated with flowers and ribbons, lined inside with grass, and filled with chocolate bunnies, chocolate eggs, Jordan almonds, jelly beans, and other candies. In any case, here's one recipe to help you fill an Easter basket:

Easter Nests (makes 15)

- 2 cups butterscotch chips
- 1 cup peanut butter chips
- 2 TBSP shortening (not butter, margarine, or oil)
- 3 cups crunchy Chow Mein noodles
- Jelly beans, Jordan almonds, Peanut M&Ms, or other egg-shaped candies

In double boiler or microwave, melt together all the chips and the shortening. Fold in noodles and stir to coat. On waxed paper, using 1/3 cupful of the mixture for each one, form 3-inch nests. Chill for 30 minutes. Place a few of your favorite candies in each nest to appear as eggs. Store airtight in refrigerator. Chocolate chips can be used in place of butterscotch chips for a different flavor and look.

Parents often hold Easter egg hunts for the children, too -- hiding painted eggs around the yard for them to find. One egg is often painted a special color, and the child who finds this one is a winner of the contest as is the child who finds the most number of eggs.

-- but, as said, all of these fun things need to be kept in check so that the focus of the day isn't lost. I strongly, strongly urge your telling your children the story of Moses and the Passover (Exodus 2-12), and their being types of -- their foreshadowing -- Christ and the hope of salvation through the Blood of Christ as evidenced by the Resurrection.

First Reading: Acts 7:55-60

Stephen was filled with Holy Spirit, and described seeing Jesus **standing at God's right hand. Then he was dragged away and stoned** to death before many witnesses who did not believe his words. Before **dying he cried, "Lord, do not hold this sign against them."**

Second Reading: Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20

John hears a voice saying, "Remember I am coming!" This messenger for Jesus says that he will come to reward those who are deserving. Those who hear the call of the Spirit are encouraged to answer by accepting Jesus.

Gospel: John 17:20-26

Jesus prays for all the people who will believe in him through the words of his disciples. His prayer is that the world will live in unity, with Jesus living in us as he lives in God. Although we have not known God, we know Jesus was sent by God because of his love for us. He prays that this love will live on in all people.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William Reilly

"The witnesses laid down their cloaks at the feet of a young man **named Saul. As they were stoning Stephen, he called out, 'Lord Jesus receive my spirit. Then he fell to his knees and cried out in a loud voice, 'Lord do not hold this sin against them,' and when he said this, he fell asleep.'**"

On many occasions we touched by an event. Someone does something heroic, or shows great kindness. We might not remember their name or the circumstances. The two-individual singled out by St. Luke, we remember one for his heroism and one for his eventual conversion.

The deacon Stephen suffered martyrdom. Saul eventually met the Lord and became the great St. Paul Like Jesus at Calvary, Stephen entrusted his life to the Lord and offered forgiveness for his murders. The persecutor become the great preacher and apostle.

As we reflect upon the life of the early church, may we see that Christians are persecuted in countless places today. Martyrdom continues in Syria, Iraq. St. Oscar Romero in El Salvador, and the Oklahoma priest Blessed Stephen Rother, in our own time tell us the blood of Christians is still being shed. As members of the body of Christ, we pray for all who suffer as victims of religious oppression, and offer our own forgiveness to those who offend us.

Jesus promised the apostles and promises us: 'stay in the city until you are clothed with power from the high.'

"Los testigos se quitaron los mantos, confiándolos a un joven llamado Saulo. Mientras lo apedreaban, Esteban oraba, diciendo: **'Señor Jesús, recibe mi espíritu'. Después, poniéndose de rodillas, exclamo en alta voz: 'Señor, no les tengas en cuenta este pecado'. Y al decir esto, expiro.'**"

En muchas ocasiones un evento nos marca. Alguien hace algo heroico, o muestra enorme bondad. Puede que no recordemos su nombre o circunstancia. A los dos individuos mencionados por San Lucas se le recuerda a uno por su heroísmo y al otro por su eventual conversión.

El diacono Esteban sufrió martirio. Saulo eventualmente encontró al Señor y se convirtió en el gran San Pablo. Como Jesús en el Calvario, Esteban confió su vida al Señor y ofreció perdón a sus asesinos. El perseguidor se convirtió en el gran predicador y apóstol.

Al reflexionar sobre la vida de la temprana iglesia, ojalá veamos que los cristianos son perseguidos en incontables lugares hoy. El martirio continuara en Siria, Iraq. San Oscar Romero en El Salvador, y el sacerdote beato Stephen Rother, en nuestro propio tiempo nos dicen que la sangre de cristianos todavía se derrama. Como miembros del cuerpo de Cristo, oramos por todos los que sufren como víctimas u opresión religiosa, y ofrecemos perdón a aquellos que nos ofenden.

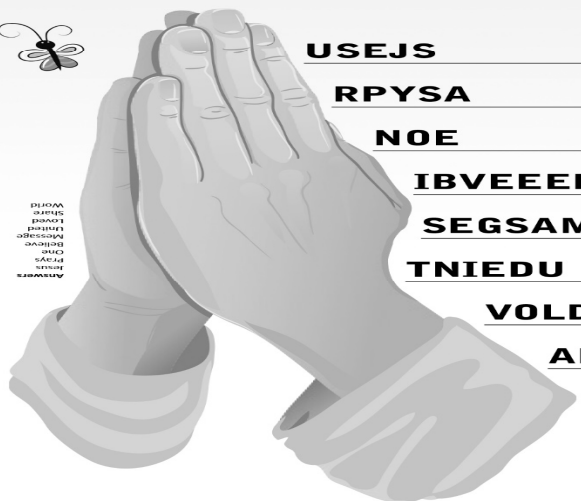
