

ABOUT THE LITURGY: Where is God?

The young girl, new to pre-K, is brought into the Church. She is learning so much now in school: how to walk with a group; how to ask questions appropriately; how to behave in public. She had heard that Church is God's House, and so it seemed natural for her to ask the tall priest, dressed in elaborate robes, "Are you God?" When he had to admit that he wasn't God, then she pressed further, "Well, where is God?"

Such is a question that we had to deal with every day. Sometimes, it is hard to see God, because we may have one idea of who God is or where to find God, but the truth about God runs much deeper. We all have some image of God: Watchful Shepherd, Prince of Peace, Divine Judge, Master of the Universe, Almighty One, etc. God is all of these and yet none of them at the same time. It would work better for us if we approached God without any definition or limit of who God actually is. If we only ever see our God as Creator, Universal Ruler, and Powerful Master – but never as Father, Brother, or Friend – then we limit who God is, ignoring much of God's own revelation to us.

The heart of that revelation is Jesus Christ, fully God and fully human, a sacrifice of love to the point of death on a cross. So often we focus on Jesus as but only one of those two natures: either God or human. However, the Gospel proclaims that Jesus was and is both divine and human at the same time and through all time. At the same time, the love between the Father and the Son is the Holy Spirit that fills the universe with the presence of God.

So, where do we find God? The Church, the House of God, would be the first place to look, as we come to allow the Holy Spirit into our lives. Beyond that, are we aware of God being present in our midst, and in each moment of our lives?


ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

Abstinence

~ All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are obligated to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting

~ Fasting means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which altogether do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to observe the laws of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.




