## ABOUT THE LITURGY: The Second Vatican Council on the Liturgy (continued)

Last week we looked at two articles from Sacrosanctum Concilium: The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, which was promulgated by the Second Vatican Council. This document represents the official and foundational teaching of the Church regarding the Liturgy. In it are certain key positions that define what we do in Church.

The article last week ended with the emphasis that the liturgy is much more than the things that the priest says or does. The faithful who are present also have an important place. We read, "But in order that the sacred liturgy may produce its full effect, it is necessary that the faithful come to it with proper dispositions, that their thoughts match their words, and that they cooperate with divine grace lest they receive it in vain (cf. 2 Cor. 6:1) (SC, #11)." We were also reminded how important it is "that the faithful take part knowingly, actively, and fruitfully (SC, #11)."

This is a reminder that the Mass is a communal gathering. We come together first of all to be present to the Lord Jesus and His Sacrifice on the Cross and to participate in Holy Communion with His Body and His Blood. But we cannot lose sight of the importance that we come together as God's People to offer the Lord worship, praise, and prayers. The action of the Liturgy is centered on the action of the priest and other ministers, but it also includes the action of the People, the Faithful, who come and participate fully and actively as the Mass unfolds in beauty. We are all brought together.
