

First Sunday of Advent November 29, 2015

First Reading: Jeremiah 33:14-16

The prophet (or a later redactor) describes the future king of David's line as a bringer of both security and justice to the land of Judah.

Second Reading: I Thessalonians 3:12-4:2

Paul prays for his community to have an increase of love. Then he exhorts them to behave according to his prior instructions.

Gospel: Luke 21:25-28, 34-36

Jesus speaks of cosmic signs accompanying His return, which will be frightening but in no way above His control. His disciples can therefore be confident but remain vigilant in behavior as they prepare.

Certain lengthy jury trials and courts martial fit the description of being either "the beginning of the end" or "the end of the beginning" of the case in hand. Today, at the beginning of another Liturgical Year, the First Sunday of Advent, the Church offers us a little of both in the chosen Readings from the bible.

The Jeremiah selection speaks of "a new beginning" for Judah with a new king, who will be her messiah. St. Paul prays that his Thessalonian converts will continue to behave as they believe with even greater zeal. Then we hear Luke's gospel passage, wherein Jesus speaks of the somewhat frightening cosmic signs of the end time. We learn that amid "the shaken powers of the heavens" will come the Son of Man with power and glory for our redemption. Jesus also warns against hearts that become "drowsy by sinful indulgence."

This Reading ensemble practically demands that we step back, as it were, and take a collective breath. It may be the perfect antidote for the annual pre-Christmas frenzy that grips many of us with a stranglehold that tends to choke the real meaning of the season.


Many people dislike the Fall because there are so many reminders in nature of their own death. Fallen leaves, stark shrubbery and longer nights do bear that interpretation. But in these last weeks of Fall, before the official start of Winter might just be a perfect opportunity to ask ourselves some basic questions and ponder the answers.

The story is told about the late great physicist Albert Einstein on a train from his beloved Princeton frantically searching his suit for his ticket when he saw the conductor coming his way. Without success, he then checked the empty seat beside him and the floor below. The friendly conductor tried to reassure him when he said, "Professor Einstein, I know who you are, and I'm sure you have a ticket, so don't worry about showing it to me." So the great man relaxed for a bit.

But just as the conductor was about to head for the next car, he happened to turn around and see Einstein on the floor of the car feeling around anxiously. The conductor rushed back to reassure Einstein that he need not worry about having a ticket. Einstein stood up, smoothing out his now rumpled suit and said, "Thank you. I need the ticket because right now I don't know where I'm going."

Not knowing where one is going in life can be a terrible situation for anybody. Advent is a season that wants to help us find out. Because this life on earth is really prelude to an eternal one in heaven with God. Our death is not so fearsome a prospect when we take it as the end of the beginning of our arrival there. If you think in terms of a railroad trip, the Lord has already given us our ticket, and we have the inner peace of knowing exactly where we are going. Aren't you glad about that?
