## NOTES FROM THE LOFT

13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time June 28, 2015

Next Sunday's First Reading begins with this proclamation: "GOD DID NOT MAKE DEATH...for He fashioned all things that they might have BEING...man to be imperishable... the image of His own nature. (B)y the envy of the devil, DEATH entered the world." The entire Liturgy of the Word contains sixteen allusions to death, destruction, and tears. However, the Gospel Acclamation cries out: "Our Savior Jesus Christ DESTROYED death", and by illustration, Mark's Gospel records the raising to life of Jairus' daughter with the Savior's command, "Little girl, ARISE!"

The key message – the kerygma – the first proclamation of the Gospel in the post-Pentecost Church was JESUS IS ALIVE! The first preaching was that Jesus was the Son of God-made-man, born of a Virgin; was crucified, died, was buried; and ROSE from the dead! He ascended to prepare a place for us, and He will come again for EACH of us, so that where He is, we also may be! The Psalm Response dramatically proclaims it: "I will praise You, LORD, for YOU have RESCUED me!" anticipating by almost three thousand years the teaching of St. John Paul II in his first encyclical, "The Redeemer of Man" (1979): "(A)ccept by personal decision the saving sovereignty of Jesus Christ and becom(e) His disciple" (#46). Like the psalmist, we EACH must claim Jesus as LORD and PERSONAL SAVIOR!

This theme of 'rescue' appears in the second verse of PRAISE, MY SOUL, THE KING OF HEAVEN #568: "(He) rescues us from all our foes." Verse one describes this rescue: we have been "ransomed, healed, restored and forgiven." Ransomed from slavery to sin and the devil; healed of the mortal blow of original sin; restored to immortality; and forgiven of personal sin. The hymn's tune, 'Lauda Anima', is attributed to John Goss (1800-1860); the text, inspired by Ps.103, is the work of distinguished Scottish poet and Anglican clergyman, Henry Francis Lyte (1793-1847), who also wrote "Abide With Me".

In the New Testament St. Paul is likely the first to refer to Jesus as 'Redeemer', but this title appears in Job 19:25: "I know that MY REDEEMER lives..." Handel would compose an elaborate 'aria' around this text. Next Sunday, the Choir will sing Samuel Medley's hymn version set to the 'Duke Street' melody.
