NOTES FROM THE LOFT

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 1, 2017

Most Christians have grown up singing 'hymns'. The word itself comes to us from the Greek, 'humnos'. Hymns were sung to praise and worship a 'god'. The more elevated songs were actually poems – odes- set to music. Throughout the ancient world, whether pagan, Jewish or Christian, congregational singing of hymns (canticles) formed an important part of worship services. Sadly, in recent decades, hymns have fallen by the wayside in some parishes, having been replaced by more contemporary compositions. The years after Vatican II produced a great volume of Scripture-based music; however, the Council never intended the demise of Catholic hymnody.

The earliest Christian hymns are found in the New Testament in the epistles or letters of Sts. Peter and Paul. The five "Christological Hymns" celebrate the Person, mission and mystery of Jesus, the 'christ', the 'anointed one'. They include I Peter: 2:21-25; Hebrews 1:1-3 (authorship debated), Colossians 1:15-20, I Timothy 3:16 and one of the longest and most beautiful, Philippians 2:1-11, the subject of next Sunday's Second Reading. It is the hymn of the 'kenosis', that is, Christ's emptying Himself of a divine vestige and "coming in human likeness."

It reads, "(T)hough He was in the form of God, (Jesus) did not regard equality with God something to be grasped...Because of this, God (the Father) greatly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the NAME which is above every name, that at the NAME OF JESUS, every knee should bend...and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord."

We cannot know the ancient melody Christians would have employed to sing this. However, in 1925, English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams was inspired to write AT THE NAME OF JESUS # 721, setting it to a new tune he called the 'King's Weston', after a manor house in Bristol, England.

The text for another popular Catholic hymn, HOLY GOD, WE PRAISE THY NAME, # 190 was composed by Fr. Ignaz Franz (18th c.) based on the "Te Deum, Laudamus" ("We Praise You, God") by the 4th 5th century bishop, theologian and composer, St. Nicetus who Christianized the barbarians in the lower Danube Valley. Fr. Franz' composition became popular with German-speaking Catholics and made its way into the German Catholic Songbook of Vienna. Both HYMNS will be part of the Choir repertoire next Sunday.

BLESSING OF THE CRITTERS



Our annual Blessing of the Animals in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals, will take place on **Tuesday, October 3**. Families are encouraged to bring their pets — of all breeds and species — to Assumption's

Parking Lot so these beloved family members can receive a special blessing. The "service" will begin promptly at 6:30pm. In the event of rain, the blessing will be postponed. (Though the feast day of St. Francis is officially observed by the Church on October 4, his actual death and "transitus" – i.e. "the time of passage through death to life" – was October 3 (in 1226), which is the day Franciscans observe with special prayers and services. Our Blessing of the Animals on October 3, thus, is truly in keeping with Franciscan tradition.)

ADORATION THURSDAY

Starting on **Thursday, October 5**, every Thursday, we will be Exposing the Blessed Sacrament for silent adoration from 7:30am until Benediction at 7PM, only interrupting for the 9AM Mass, and if there is a funeral (there will be some occasions when a group will be continuing with Adoration until 8PM; and there will be some



other occasions when there will be abbreviated or interrupted Adoration). We are asking that at least 2 people be present at all times in the church to adore Jesus. Next weekend, we will put out a schedule with the hours listed for sign-ups. Of course, anyone is welcome to come at any time, and to stay for as little or as long as you want, but we will need to have commitments from at least 2 people for each hourly time slot. Can you please consider signing up to adore Jesus for an Hour? We are doing this also as a way of preparing for our Chapel of Perpetual Adoration, which will require that 2 parishioners are present to adore Jesus every hour of every day. Jesus will bless you abundantly for your love for Him!
