

Hello St. Augustine and Holy Family parishes! My name is Fr. Sean Bonner, and I am excited to be starting as your new associate pastor! I met many of you last weekend at St. Augustine and I look forward to meeting many more in the weeks to come. During the next few years I am sure we will get to know each other well, but I thought I would introduce myself to you here by giving you some of my background.

I am the third of four children, two brothers and a sister. We moved to the Detroit area from Buffalo, NY when I was three. I grew up in Dearborn Heights where I attended St. Albert the Great elementary school and Detroit Catholic Central High School.

You may guess by looking at me, but I did not enter seminary right out of high school. I went to college at the United States Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, NY. After college I spent 15 years going to sea. I worked for several companies during that period, usually as the ship's navigator, although I sailed in a variety of positions as a licensed deck officer and as an unlicensed engineer. I spent a couple of years sailing on the Great Lakes, but most of my career was spent sailing on ships all around the world.

During my sailing career I worked on a variety of ship types, ranging from spy ships (actually very boring work) to tankers and container ships, to volunteering on a hospital ship operated by the Christian missionary organization, Mercy Ships. While sailing as Chief Mate on my last ship, the *M/V Global Patriot*, I downloaded my application for Sacred Heart Major Seminary (from an internet cafe in Thailand). At that point I had been discerning a vocation to the priesthood for several years.

During college, I was very active in the Chapel programs, including Lifeteen, and I seriously considered going to seminary then, but the time was not right. Several years later, when I began to hear God calling me again, I entered Sacred Heart Major Seminary. Since it had been 15 years since I was last in a classroom, I started things out slowly. My first semester at seminary was as a commuter student taking only a couple of classes. This gave me the opportunity to figure out what it meant to be a student again! PowerPoint didn't exist the first time I started college! It also allowed me to continue to discern where God was calling me.

When I finally became a seminarian I was still not sure that God was calling me to the priesthood, but I knew that I had to give God a chance to work in my life and to see where he was calling me. It took a couple of years in seminary before I was certain that I wanted to be a priest, and that that was where God was calling me.

I was ordained to the priesthood on May 23rd of this year. After seven and a half years as a student, I am glad to finally get back to work! I am looking forward to working with Fr. Joe and the rest of the St. Augustine/ Holy Family parish families.


#### Sacrament of Marriage:

## MAIL CALL



- **Q**...I don't have a question, only an observation followed by a suggestion. Mass is boring! Let's liven it up a bit just like some of our Protestant counter-parts have done.
- **A.** My first reaction is another observation; we don't have any Protestant counter-parts. This is not to be considered as being critical of them. In fact, any Protestant reading this would be breathing a sigh of relief because they have been preaching the very the same thing since they came into being.

When someone tells me they consider the Mass to be boring what they are really saying is that they have little to no understanding of the Mass. Rituals of the Mass point back to our original parents, Adam and Eve. As the Mass unfolds we can see the history of God's dealing with His people down through times of Abraham, Moses, the prophets of old, the judges, the kings, the Messiah, the apostles, and the worship of the Christians of the first few centuries.

We sing, we pray, and we hear the Word of God proclaimed. Then at the summit of the Mass we observe a miracle from God. When the priest prays the prayer of consecration and ordinary bread and wine is turned into the body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, I miracle has just taken place. So, when you see the priest ceremonially washing his hands (as the priests have done since time of Moses before offering the sacrifice) pay attention, something BIG is about to happen.

Next we are given the opportunity to eat His flesh and drink His blood, just as Jesus commanded 2,000 years ago. During this Eucharistic portion of the Mass we also observe the mystery of body of Christ (His People) consume the body of Christ (the Eucharist). What an enigmatic paradoxical mystery indeed!

Although this not the "I" centered type entertainment centered get together found in many denominational churches, once you understand this unfolding celebration of the history of our salvation, you will see that it is far from boring. Worship is what we do for God and we worship Him in the manner He Himself clearly prescribed in Sacred Scripture.
