

MALLIA'S MOMENTS

Today we celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy. This is more than just a celebration of a particular devotion, but a further reflection on the fact that God in his mercy has redeemed us from sin and shown us his mercy in the past, present and future of human history. By celebrating this feast during the octave of Easter, the Church is helping us to contemplate the passion, death and resurrection in light of mercy and not simply an act onto itself. We share in the joy of salvation history which is not solely about sin and retribution but most importantly experienced in the love of a merciful God. How can we not rejoice in the mercy of God! None of us have done anything to deserve to be forgiven by God, yet God does forgive us and has redeemed us from the power of sin through Jesus.

The devotion associated with this feast, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy which was revealed to St. Faustina, is a reminder to all of us to recall this great gift of God's merciful love. I would encourage you to read the Diary of St.

Faustina and to make the Chaplet a part of your daily prayer. It is usually prayed at 3 pm, the hour of the death of Jesus, but if that does not work for you, any time will do during the day. I have found the prayer to be a very helpful and nourishing reflection in my own life and I have enjoyed reading and re-reading the Diary of St. Faustina.

I am presently away for a family wedding in California and will return on Monday, but during this day I will be offering my prayer for all of you so that you will experience the mercy of God in a profound way on this special day. I want to urge you to pray as well for all those in great need of God's mercy in their lives. Pray for those who are ill, abandoned, filled with despair, victims of violence and abuse and for those estranged from the Church. The world is torn apart with hatred and many evils and the only source of healing is to be found in the mercy of God.

This is not just a title or a reflection on the past, but a consolation for our present time. God's mercy is available here and now and to all of us. Rely on the mercy of God, but do not take it for granted. It is very easy to simply think that God will forgive us even if we are not sorry or have no desire to repent and change our behavior. God's mercy is available for all who seek it out, but to seek it out we must desire to turn away from sin. How ungrateful can we be to simply think that Jesus died on the cross so that we can abuse him further by being so presumptuous about God's mercy and love towards us. Yes God loves us, but in our love for God why do we think that we can continue to sin? Would you want someone you love to keep taking advantage of your love without showing any love towards you? Or to keep abusing the gift of your love?

In the image of Jesus the Divine Mercy, his hands are extended to us to pull us closer to his heart and to the Father. If we wish to find peace in our lives, let us turn from sin, delve into God's mercy and be embraced in the loving arms of God. God bless you all.

to all the little changes I was adding to what you normally do. I heard many compliments from people about the way the church looked and how wonderful the celebrations were. Prayer is a community experience and your participation helped our community worthily praise God. Again, thank you.

CSA

OK, I know I have spoken about CSA in the past few weeks and now the time has come to actually put it into action. On the weekends of May 6-7 and 13-14 in the parish paper you will find a blank copy of the actual CSA card. You are asked to make a pledge towards the campaign and cut the form out and put it either in the collection basket or mail it to the office. You may also make a one time donation if you would rather, but we would encourage you to make a pledge.

Now this is the important part: Because our hope is to be able to run our future capital campaigns through the CSA and save ourselves the 7% tax, we will need not only to make our goal, but exceed our goal. Consider how much money 7% of \$3 million is when thinking this is not an important effort. To make our goal is not as hard as you may think. I will not tell you how much to give because people are able to give various amounts. Our target could be made if only half the parish contributed \$200 each. See - simple! But not everyone is going to give and some can do more. I personally am pledging \$500 to each parish this year. We should be able to double the CSA target with very little effort. I believe you can see the wisdom of this effort.

At St. Augustine, the extra money will be used to replace the old wiring in the church. There is a danger that this old wiring could catch on fire and we don't need that. Other funds are needed as we begin to move forward with our study of

future construction of offices, a social hall and possibly a new cafeteria and gym for the school. At Holy Family, the extra money will go towards saving up for the construction of a new worship space and addressing other needs.

By not only making, but exceeding our goal, it becomes a much easier sell to the Archbishop to let us fund-raise through the CSA in the future. Please be as generous as you can. A pledge of \$400 would only mean less than \$8 a week to benefit our parish and set it up for its future. Please pray over this donation and don't simply look at it as something we have to do, but something that we should do for our community and the larger Church community. We have never had a successful CSA drive at either parish, let's make this the first of many. This is really the first step in securing the future of our parish communities. If you have any questions feel free to ask me about any of the details of the plans, the CSA or the math behind this appeal. Thank you in advance.

St. Augustine Parish Council Corner

Numerous items were presented and discussed at the Parish Council meeting of April 12, but by far the most significant was that of Fr. Joe regarding the CSA and the Council discussion following it. Fr. Joe strongly presented the reality that we must not only meet our CSA goal assigned by the Archdiocese of Detroit, which, surprisingly, is less this year than last year, but also exceed it. And he provided an extremely solid rationale for doing so:

As Fr. Joe explained, we must meet our goal through voluntary donations or we will have to pay the difference from weekly collections, which are taxed by the AOD at 7%. The CSA donations are not taxed, so it is very wise for parishioners to pledge a sufficient amount to cover the CSA allotment. And he pointed out something many of us were not aware of, such as the facts that the CSA funds the seminaries and tuition for the seminarians, interest-free loans to parishes, Catholic schools, ministry training, the annulment panel (all marriage annulment studies are free to the applicants in the AOD), and numerous other both wise and necessary activities of a Godly and functional diocese.

But even more important than those reasons, Fr. Joe explained, is the fact that every dollar we raise ABOVE the allotment is not only free of the 7% tax, but also belongs to the parish, a very important means for many parishes, such as ours, who desperately need to make improvements in buildings and facilities, such as updated electrical wiring, as well as replace outdated buildings as per our current master plan. In that regard, Fr. Joe maintained that funding such plans through the CSA donations is truly a benefit to the parish since we would avoid the interest charges of private loans and the cost of a capital campaign to fund our needs. The Council was very impressed with Fr. Joe's presentation (to which Fr. Sean made important contributions), and we took to heart his very practical advice: "We have to pay the CSA anyway, so we should use it to our advantage. The more we contribute to the fund beyond the allotment, the more interest and tax free funds we have for our own needs." And, as Fr. pointed out, we need to convince the AOD that we can support our own building plans.

Finally, Fr. Joe made a most telling theological point: "We are not giving the money to him or to the church but to God who gave us these resources in the first place. And like Abel, we should give our first and best fruits to God and not begrudge him the way Cain did."

As a result of Fr. Joe's presentation, the Council strongly endorsed the CSA campaign and wholeheartedly encourages parishioners to be generous in their support of it. It is not only morally right to support the campaign but in our own best interests.

Certainly not least, though last: The Parish Council expresses deep gratitude to Susan Finley and Lisa Hamel for their wonderful work with the Children's Stations of the Cross and the beautiful Holy Saturday ceremonies.


