MALLIA'S MOMENTS

When Bartimaeus heard that Jesus was calling him, the passage in the Gospel today tells us that he threw off his cloak and sprang up and went to Jesus. This cloak was a symbol of his life as a beggar, a social outcast, a sinner because of his blindness. But Jesus called him and that was enough for him to cast aside the labels and the limitations placed upon him. Even before the blindness was gone, Bartimaeus was ready to be different. Before he was called, he was ready for the change!

That change in him happened because he heard the call coming from Jesus. The realization of who was calling him, the dignity instilled in Bartimaeus because of that call opened up the whole world of possibilities to him. Jesus does that for us. We are so often blind to the possibilities that exist within ourselves. We allow the limitations placed on us by others to become our reality. I know I have done that in my own life. I still struggle to overcome the past that I have allowed to become my present. I know I need to hear Jesus call my name on a regular basis to help me cast off the cloak of limitations.

We need Jesus to speak our name and to call us from the midst of the crowd where we can so often feel insignificant to the world. And maybe to the world we are insignificant, but we are never that to God. So, call out to the Lord. Call out with all your heart if you want to shed the past and if you are ready to begin to see yourself in a new and more life giving light. No matter how much others would try to push you down, get up. God will define my future, not people. God will help me to see who I am and that is why I follow Jesus on the path where he leads.

Everyone else in the story stayed where they were and they did not hear Jesus call them because they were not ready to change, to cast off their past. Let's not make that same mistake. Do you want to see yourself differently? Do you want to unleash the fullness of the potential within you? Call on the name of the Lord and he will call you by name and tell you to cast off the past and then follow him. God bless.

Along with the Catholic Cemetery Association, we are offering a free burial for all those who were cremated but never buried. Our local funeral homes will be participating and we invite any of you who have the cremated remains of loved ones to join us for that celebration. The cremated person does not need to be Catholic, so spread the word to family and friends who also may have cremains in their home and would like to bury them at no cost. We are grateful for the donation of the burial vault and for the donation of the opening and closing of the grave. Many people are working together to make sure that every person who desires to have a proper burial may have one. This will be followed by the fall clean up of the cemetery. I hope we have a good turn out for this special day. We are anticipating some 60 sets of cremains to be brought to church for this mass. May all the faithfully departed rest in peace. Amen.

An indulgence is the remission in the eyes of God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose culpability has been taken away. The Christian faithful who are rightly disposed and observe the conditions of the indulgence gain this remission. This remission is gained through the effective assistance of the Church, which, as the minister of redemption, authoritatively distributes and applies the treasury of the expiatory works of Christ and the Saints.
