MALLIA'S MOMENTS

On behalf of the pastoral and school staff of our parishes, I want to wish you all a very Happy and Holy Easter. There is no greater statement of joy for any believer to say than, Jesus Christ is Risen from the dead. Alleluia!

It is not just a statement of faith; it is a statement of fact. Think about that for a moment. Other statements can cause happiness or excitement, but the statement that Jesus is Risen is the only statement that means that we are redeemed. It points to an eternal effect on all humanity.

All Lent, we have been reflecting on the idea that sin enslaves us; that sin is a burden that we carry around even though we don't have to. We used the visual of the chains on the cross and in my pre-Lenten letter I used the image of Jacob Marley in the story, [A Christmas Carol](#), banging the chains of his sins that he forged throughout his life to underscore what we have been freed from. As long as we do not embrace the truth that Jesus Christ has died for our sins and risen for our salvation, we remain burdened by the chains of our past. We must confess our sins, turn away from patterns of sin and not be held captive by evil. St. Paul teaches us that we have been claimed by Christ; we are his. Today can be your day of freedom. Today can be the day you let your chains fall from your heart. Today can be the day your life will change.

Though many people think Valentine's Day is a day when we focus on love, there is no greater love than what our celebrations have called us to focus on these past few days. Cupid is a pagan symbol of romantic love, but the cross is the reminder of what pure and profound love is all about. Look at the underside of your Lenten bracelet. John 3:16 reminds us that we are loved and that we are redeemed. If we have been freed, why would we give ourselves back to sin; that which entrapped us in darkness?

My friends, I know that not all of you come to mass every week. In fact, I am aware that the majority of you do not. Even with the large crowds on Easter, the vast majority of Christians stay home and do not come to church.

This pains me as I read the passage of Scripture where God tells the prophet that it is not the prophet the people reject, but that it is God whom they reject. Is God really disposable in our lives? Did his death mean nothing?

When Moses gave the law to the people, he told them that he placed before them life and death, and he encouraged them to choose life. I encourage you to choose to live in the risen life of Jesus. I pray that you do not allow yourselves to fall away from the truest source of love. God seeks you out and God is calling us to be a city on a hill, a light shining in the darkness. When we are not all together, that light is dimmed. We need everyone here to be the good in the world that God has called us to be. I plead to all of you; come back next week and to keep coming back.

As we share in the joy of Christ rising from the dead, may God give us the grace we need to share the good news with the world around us through our actions and our words. May we commit ourselves to Christ completely, surrendering all to him. May we feel the peace which comes from knowing all our chains are broken and our lives made free. Let us pray each day, serve each day, give each day to God and worship the Lord together each week. He alone is worthy to be praised. He alone is God. He alone is the source of all that is good. His name alone is above all others. To God be glory and praise forever and ever. Amen. Alleluia!

May the Risen Lord bless and keep you all close to his heart. God bless you all.

Registration for 3 and 4 year old pre-school, Transitional Kindergarten and the regular K-8 grades is now open with limited space. Please call **St. Augustine Catholic School** for information and registration materials.

Please be aware that registration for this year's **Vacation Bible School** will be starting soon. Please register early so proper planning can be done.

If you are planning on getting married at either of our parishes, you must contact the church at least six months in advance.

Consider purchasing a cemetery plot at either **St. Michael or St. Philip cemeteries**. We are fortunate that both parishes have a cemetery to help you in your planning process. Remember that even if you are cremated, you must bury or intern remains. You are forbidden by church law to scatter ashes or to divide them among relatives. We believe in bodily resurrection and so we honor the person who has died with a proper burial. You can bury remains over an existing grave as well. For more information about our cemeteries, please call the parish offices. Thank you.

Traveling this summer? Planning to be away on the weekends? I know that people often give to the parish that they attend during the summer or while traveling. I might suggest that you contribute to your parish each week and if you are away, place a donation into that parish's collection. 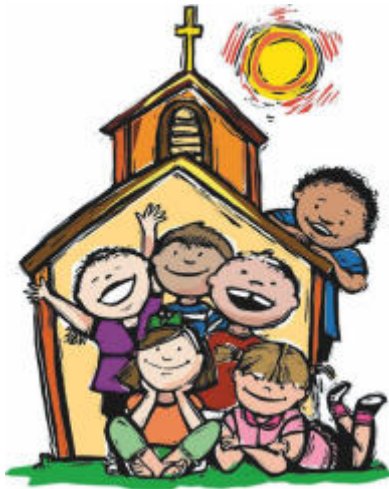

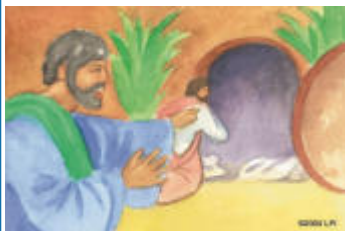

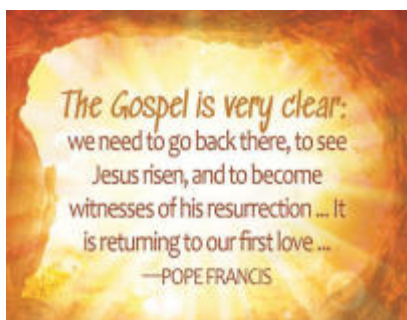

THIRD GRADERS MASTER THEIR FACTS

This year the third graders have been working hard to master their multiplication facts. We began working especially hard at the beginning of this year. At St. Augustine School, it has become a custom that when a student memorizes his or her multiplication facts the student earns a t-shirt that says: "I Mastered the Facts at St. A's". I am proud to say that for the past twenty-two years, every student has earned an "I Mastered the Facts at St. A's" t- shirt.

In order to master the facts in my class, a student must complete 100 multiplication facts in less than 5 minutes without making a mistake, twice in a row. If they get a 99 after a hundred they must start again. In the end, each student has a sense of pride as he or she meets the goal. I don't think there are too many schools where the students come in each morning and ask, "Can we take a multiplication- timed test today? I think I'm gonna get a 100 today!"

Fr. Joe comes in every morning and says, "Good morning geniuses! Did anyone get their shirt today?" Some days someone proudly stands up and says, "I got mine today!" Sometimes it's "I got a 99, but I'll get a 100 tomorrow." He told them as soon as they all earned their shirts we could wear them to church and take a picture for the church bulletin. So on March 20, the third graders proudly wore their "I Mastered the Facts" t-shirt and we took the class picture. It also happened to be "Free Cone" Day at Dairy Queen, so what a perfect way to celebrate our accomplishment, a free cone at DQ!

As each student gets her/his shirt, the whole class cheers, gives high fives, and hugs. Then the third grader goes off to proudly show the first and second graders their accomplishment. In the office we have a "Super Kid Book" that they sign for a permanent record. They often look back to see if they earned their shirt faster than their brother or sister. Some even see their aunts and uncles that are now grown-ups in the "Super Kid" book. Back in the day, students would also call home from the school office to share the good news. With the technology of today, I take a picture with their shirt on and text it to Mom or Dad.

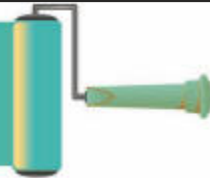
