
#### **MALLIA'S MOMENTS**

The readings today point to the importance of being a welcoming host. I cannot stress how important that is in your own home, but especially here at church. Too often we see guests as an inconvenience or worse. We dread the thought of hosting parties and having out of town guests stay with us; and those are people we know. Welcoming the stranger or going places where we do not know anyone is a situation most of us dread. The reasons behind all this anxiety are varied, but our failure to welcome people and feel welcomed is a problem that can break down the very fabric of our parishes.

Our hesitancy to welcome new people to our parish makes people not want to return. Instead of rejoicing that there are new faces at mass, we get annoyed that they are sitting in our pew. How are they supposed to know that you always sit there? Why not introduce yourself and welcome them to the parish? Maybe you could ask them if they are new to the area or just visiting and add a comment that makes them know it would be great to see them again. Would that not make a happier prayer experience than being looked at harshly and with no welcome? How would that lead anyone to want to praise God as brothers and sisters in Christ?

The Bible reminds us that by welcoming strangers we unknowingly entertain angels. I think it is important to be reminded from time to time about this important ministry that we can all do. Part of the reason I stand outside the church on nice days is so that I can wave to the people passing by the church. My presence and waving may just be the impetus



someone may need to make the decision to come back to church. Your welcoming people in the building may be the impetus for them to keep coming back.

When we fail to be welcoming, we risk losing someone who may have been struggling to make the decision to come back to mass. Do you want to be the reason a person stays away from the Eucharist and getting closer to God? We must be more willing to welcome each other, greet each other at mass and not simply the people we know. Say hello and introduce yourself. I am not asking you to become best friends with everyone but simply being polite and welcoming is not a huge request and everyone can do it. It is God's house and not yours that you are welcoming them to, after all, and a little secret; it's not your pew!

So, let us all try to be a bit more welcoming and polite to the people we are around at mass since we are all there to give praise and glory to God. God bless you all.







#### **Parish Ministries: Formation**

As Catholics, we know that our faith formation is life-long, starting in the early years with sessions taught by volunteers who are willing to share their own lived faith. In the adult years we seek more knowledge through a variety of adult focused offerings.

#### **CATECHIST**

Those who respond to the call to serve children are supported by training and direction of the Faith Formation coordinator. These volunteers support parents in leading their children to Jesus through exploration of Scripture, Catholic culture and tradition, and prayer experiences. Commitment to this ministry involves 75 minutes of weekly class time and at least an equal amount of time in preparation. All materials, multiple resources, and personal assistance is provided. No specific theological training is required, but a sense of humor, considerable patience and an affection for young people would be an asset.

#### YOUTH MINISTRY

Youth Ministry works with the community's teens, 9th—12th grade, to strengthen and encourage a relationship with Jesus. They provide an opportunity for teenagers to experience the presence of Christ in many formats and settings, offering generous hospitality and relationship building. Through this ministry, teens are empowered to live as disciples of Jesus, encouraging participation in the life, mission and work of the Catholic Community.

Interested individuals for this ministry are adults with a passion for working with teens who don't mind sharing their faith. The ability to listen, care, share and respond to the needs and interests of the youth is necessary. No specific theological training is required.

Commitments can vary from 2 hours a week to 2 hours a month depending on the amount one wants to serve. Small group leaders, set up / clean up ministers, chaperones and drives are needed. Each have their unique commitment.

#### CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is an age-appropriate opportunity for children to celebrate a concurrent Liturgy of the Word in a nearby space and then return to the main assembly for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The children experience the same ritual and hear the same scriptures, but proclaimed in simplified language.

Leaders proclaim the readings and Gospel, lead the children in singing a Psalm response, share the main message, and conclude with a simplified creed and intercessory prayers before rejoining Mass. A detailed leader guide and training are provided. CLOW is offered at the 9:00am Mass at St. Augustine and the 10:30am Mass at Holy Family. This ministry is perfect for someone who loves working with children and sharing their faith. A commitment of about 1 hour of preparation time and serving at one Mass per month (scheduled at your convenience) is required.


