

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ



MALLIA'S MOMENTS By Fr. Joe Mallia

Today we proclaim the truth that in the Eucharist is present, the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ. This truth is based on the words of Jesus himself in the Gospel of John in the sixth chapter and in the Last Supper discourse found in the other three Gospels. This is further highlighted in the writings of St. Paul, where he clearly indicates that the early believers took the words of Jesus literally and this is further testified to by the writings of the early church fathers. From the very beginning it has always been held by those closest of Jesus and those taught by them, that the Eucharist was in fact the bread of life and the cup of salvation; the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ.

Over the centurys others came along and denied this truth. They proposed on their own, with no scriptural backing, that the Eucharist was nothing more than a symbol. Others would later push it to the point of near extinction by not including it in their worship service. All this is contrary to the Scripture and the teaching of the early church.

A further tragedy is that the majority of Catholics today have accepted these false perceptions and also agree that the Eucharist is nothing but a symbol and not the real presence of the Lord. No wonder our faith falters and wanes as we deny even the most basic of essential truths given to us by the Lord himself. No wonder the vast majority see no issue with missing mass on Sunday. After all, it is only a ritual, something to do and they do not see it as an encounter with the real presence of the Lord.

This manipulation of the truth to fit our own wishes and whims has been the cause for the slow and maybe not so slow decline of faithful discipleship in believers. Take for example the impact of how we have allowed sin to be watered down to the point it has no significant impact on our conscience. People rarely go to confession and the false belief that everyone goes to heaven are just signs of how people think evil is "no big deal."

That is why our Walk with Jesus, this yearly pilgrimage with the Blessed Sacrament through the main road of our two communities, is very significant. Think about what we are doing. We are carrying the Lord Jesus through the heart of our

I Am the Living Bread JN 6:51-58

Jesus said to the Jewish crowds: I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

The Jews quarreled themselves, saying, "How can this man give us [his] flesh to eat? "Jesus said to them, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Unlike your ancestors who ate and still died, whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Attend a Eucharistic Procession

On the feast of Corpus Christi, many churches have Eucharistic processions. A Eucharistic procession is a public witness of the veneration of the most holy Eucharist, conducted through public streets. It takes place in this way: A consecrated host—the real presence of Jesus Christ—is placed in a monstrance, which is then lifted and carried by a priest who leads the faithful in procession. Like a pilgrimage, a Eucharistic procession normally starts at one holy place and ends at another. This earthly journey reminds the Catholic faithful of their spiritual journey toward eternal life with God.

Today, find a local Eucharistic procession and join in! Each year there is a Eucharistic Procession at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Detroit. Other parishes have them as well.

Can't make it to a procession? Visit Jesus at an Adoration Chapel. Many parishes have 24-hour chapels for perpetual (or continuous) adoration. As a family, spend time with the Lord in adoration. Spend time in silence, and pray for the needs of your family and friends. Bring a journal to write down anything you hear the Lord speak into your heart.

A. Without the benefit of Catholic Tradition, which Protestants also reject, understanding Scripture can be anywhere from easy to impossible for a lay person. More on Tradition a little farther down. With your friend's example, however, one only has to read at the passages in question and apply a little common sense. When Jesus said that He was the door, nobody took Him literally and walked away (John 10:9). Nobody pictures Jesus as wood planks nailed together with a door knob attached.

When Jesus declared that we must eat His flesh and drink His blood, 5,000 people who actually heard his words understood Jesus to be speaking literally. They walked away (John 6:67). Now add to this the fact these 5,000 people saw the miracles Jesus performed and were all just served a free meal from five barley loves and two fish (John 6:2-12). The all or nothing approach which holds that the Bible is to be read in an entirely literalist way, or that it is all merely symbolic is just not practical. Protestants, too, would reject such an idea. The real question then becomes which texts are to be understood literally, and which texts use symbolism?

When trying to understand Sacred Scripture, we lay Catholics have Sacred Tradition, which is simply the teaching of the Church Fathers from the first century on. These Fathers down through the centuries have universally understood Jesus' words in the 6th chapter of John to be literal. St. Paul taught that Holy Communion is a partaking of the body and blood of Christ and goes on to declare that those who receive it unworthily, not discerning the body and blood of our Lord Jesus, actually sin against the body of the Lord (First Corinthians 11:29).

It is interesting to note the original Protestant reformers did not dispute such things as the real presence, nor did they argue the queenship or perpetual virginity of the Blessed Mother. Protestant denial of these things didn't happen in their movement until later on.



KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS

Decrees of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

On May 26, 2020, the Holy Father Francis received in audience His Eminence Cardinal Angelo Becciu, prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. During the audience, the Supreme Pontiff authorized the same Congregation to promulgate the Decrees regarding the

miracle, attributed to the intercession of the Venerable Servant of God Michael McGivney, Diocesan Priest.

He was born on August 12, 1852 in Waterbury (United States of America) and died in Thomaston (United States of America) on August 14, 1890. Venerable Michael McGivney was the founder of the Knights of Columbus, now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization. After studies in Canada and the United States, he was ordained to the priesthood by Archbishop James Gibbons in Baltimore. He founded the Knights of Columbus as a mutual aid society, geared especially to working men and their families. He was known for his tireless work among his parishioners. He died at the early age of 38 from pneumonia.


