

Ethics of Vaccines

Back in 2005, the Pontifical Academy for Life (PAL) from the Vatican had provided clarification for parents that were asked to use vaccines produced using fetal cell lines for their children. The response (source: https://bit.ly/3m3eQUp) sheds light on our moral responsibility and duty as Catholics and Christians. This extends to all vaccines including ones for COVID. The following has been derived from PAL's clarification:

As regards the preparation, distribution and marketing of vaccines produced as a result of the use of biological material whose origin is connected with cells coming from fetuses voluntarily aborted, such a process is stated, as a matter of principle, morally illicit, because it could contribute in encouraging the performance of other voluntary abortions, with the purpose of the production of such vaccines.

There is a grave responsibility to use alternative vaccines and to make a conscientious objection with

regard to those which have moral problems; as in regard to the vaccines without an alternative, the need to contest so that others may be prepared must be reaffirmed... the lawfulness of the use of these vaccines should not be misinterpreted as a declaration of the lawfulness of their production, marketing and use, but is to be understood as being a passive material cooperation (with evil) and, in its mildest and remotest sense, also active, morally justified as an extrema ratio due to the necessity to provide for the good of one's children and of the people who come in contact with the children (pregnant women); such cooperation occurs in a context of moral coercion of the conscience of parents, who are forced to choose to act against their conscience or otherwise, to put the health of their children and of the population as a whole at risk. This is an unjust alternative choice, which must be eliminated as soon as possible.

It is up to the faithful and citizens of upright conscience... to oppose, even by making an objection of conscience, the ever more widespread attacks against life and the 'culture of death' which underlies them. From this point of view, the use of vaccines whose production is connected with procured abortion constitutes at least a mediate remote passive material cooperation to the abortion, and an immediate passive material cooperation with regard to their marketing. Furthermore, on a cultural level, the use of such vaccines contributes in the creation of a generalized social consensus to the operation of the pharmaceutical industries which produce them in an immoral way. Therefore, doctors and fathers of families have a duty to take recourse to alternative vaccines (if they exist), putting pressure on the political authorities and health systems so that other vaccines without moral problems become available. They should take recourse, if necessary, to the use of conscientious objection with regard to the use of vaccines produced by means of cell lines of aborted human fetal origin.

Are there COVID vaccines/treatments that do not contain aborted fetal cells at this time?

Here are most of the ones that would be morally acceptable to use: AVM Biotech - AVM-0703, Israel - Pluristem, BCG Vaccine: No cells involved, British American Tobacco (BAT), Novavax - NVX-CoV2373, Sorrento Therapeutics, Sanofi Pasteur Sars-CoV - insect cells, Sanofi Partners with GSK, Symvivo, JPII Medical Research Inst. and CET (Cellular Engineering Technology), Sinovac Biotech, Merck and IAVI, Regeneron - Sanofi, Athersys - Multistem - Treatment, BioNTech and Pfizer (tested on HEK-293 but not in the product).

Here are some that were originally produced with or contains aborted fetal cells: Moderna and NIAID, Johnson and Johnson/Janssen Tech., Johnson and Johnson/Emergent Biosolutions, AstraZeneca AZD1222, CanSino Biologics, University of Pittsburgh, Massachusetts Eye and Ear, Regeneron, Inovio Pharmaceuticals, Altimmune, Vaxart VXA-CoV2-1.

Below is a mail call from a couple of years ago, but it is worth a second look!

Q. In the Old Testament the prophet Isaiah wrote "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (Isaiah 7:14). However, (Luke 1:31) tells us the angel Gabriel says to the Blessed Mother: "You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus." There are those who claim that the Bible is unreliable because it is full of contradictions like

this. How does the Church defend such contradictions?

A. There is no defense needed because there are no contradictions, just a lack of understanding. Taking your example here, Isaiah reveals His identity, Gabriel reveals His name. Translating from one language to another can become a bit tricky and sometimes a bit confusing. We must be careful about putting too much emphasis on ancient Hebrew and Aramaic words that have been translated into English. We do, however, need to recognize Isaiah used the phrase "They shall call him" and Gabriel used the phrase "you are to give him the name." The original Hebrew word that Isaiah used was translated into Greek, and then translated into Latin, and finally into English. Isaiah used a Hebrew word (Immanuel) which means "God with us." The important thing here is that Isaiah is prophesying 800 years before the arrival of the Messiah that He would be God Incarnate.

There is no contradiction. Mary was given a name from Gabriel as the name by which God (Immanuel) was to be known, Jesus. To Isaiah and his Hebrew audience 800 years before Christ, the Messiah's given name would have been of little concern. The fact of His Divine identity however was of utmost significance. This revelation was a cause for great anticipation. We participate in this excitement as we anticipate the birth of Jesus. We celebrate His first arrival while we also look forward to His promised return. And this is indeed cause for us to celebrate Happy Advent!

"I will honor Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year."

Thanksgiving ends and we all rush to put up our trees, get out all the decorations, and embrace the Christmas spirit. Just as quickly as we begin, we tend to quickly end it as well. It's like a light switch; we turn on Christmas and then turn it off.

Every year, my 6th graders read the classic *A Christmas Carol* by Charles Dickens. In the story, Ebenezer Scrooge changes from a selfish miser to a generous man who vows to keep the Christmas spirit all year long. Even though I have read this story countless times, I found myself asking, "Why do we act differently during the Advent and Christmas season? Why do we seem to pack away those good feelings and attitudes with the decorations as soon as the new year begins?"

I decided to challenge my 8th grade students with this question: How can you "honor Christmas" in your heart and "try to keep it ALL THE YEAR?" Here are their responses:

"We can donate and give to those in need. We can be thankful for what we have. We can always understand that Christmas isn't about presents, but HIS (Jesus') presence. We need to always be prepared for Jesus' coming."

"We can help people and give people something to enjoy; even a positive word can make someone's day better. Christmas is about giving - giving people something to enjoy."

"What we can do is we can be nice to everyone, and we can also do something kind to help someone out."

"Keep the happiness, peacefulness, and generosity throughout the year - spreading joy and keeping the nice deeds every time of the year - not just Christmas."

"Keep the peace because everyone is always so peaceful on Christmas."

"I wish that giving food or clothes to the homeless and hungry stayed longer. Also, instead of saying 'Merry Christmas,' say something like "Have a nice day" or just smile at someone. You never know how you can impact someone's day or even life."

"Spend time with family."

"Be a better person. Give until your heart can't give anymore."

Holidays and Special Events How to celebrate safely with family and friends

Limit the number of attendees as much as possible to allow people from different households to remain at least <u>6</u> feet apart at all times. Guests should avoid direct contact, including handshakes and hugs, with others not from their household.

Host outdoor rather than indoor gatherings as much as possible. Even outdoors, require guests to wear masks when not eating or drinking.

Increase ventilation by opening windows and doors to the extent that is safe and feasible based on the weather, or by placing central air and heating on continuous circulation.

Require guests to wear masks. At gatherings that include persons of different households, everyone should always wear a <u>mask</u> that covers both the mouth and nose, except when eating or drinking. It is also important to stay at least <u>6 feet away</u> from people who are not in your household at all times.

Encourage guests to avoid singing or shouting, especially indoors. Keep music levels down so people don't have to shout or speak loudly to be heard.

Encourage attendees to <u>wash</u> their hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, use <u>hand sanitizer</u> that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Limit contact with commonly touched surfaces or shared items, such as serving utensils.


