

Catholic Schools Week

Kicking off our celebration this week, our school families have been invited to come this Sunday to either the 9:00am or the 10:30am offering of Holy Mass at St. Augustine and Holy Family, respectively. Sunday is the holiest of days, and nothing quite says our identity as Catholic as the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass where we are most privileged to receive the gift of Jesus Himself in the Holy Eucharist.

This year's theme focuses on "Faith. Excellence. Service." Each day will have a particular focus, celebrating our community, the nation, vocations, staff and volunteers, and students and families. Community reminds us of the need to go beyond our needs and tend to the needs of our brothers and sisters. We are part of the Mystical Body of Christ, called to be the hands and feet of Jesus for all our brothers and sisters from the womb to the tomb. Giving attention to our nation, we recognize the broader impact of our faith and how the faith can contribute to a better society. The day dedicated on vocations should foster within our students that each of them has been made by their Heavenly Father for a specific purpose: marriage, consecrated life, priesthood, diaconate, and single life. Traditional Blessing of Candles

With an upsurge of requests to have candles blessed. I had looked into various blessings of candles and searched through what the Church has provided in this area. I found a beautiful Candlemas blessing a few weeks back that I was not familiar with. The blessing has been adapted from the 1949 St. Andrew's Daily Missal and the 1943 version of The Catholic Missal. Candlemas is celebrated on February 2nd (if this date fell on a Sunday, it would be celebrated on the following Monday). So, this will take place on our scheduled 7:00 PM Mass. For those who would like to have their candles blessed in this rite. please be sure to bring those candles with you when you come for Holy Mass or please drop them off at the parish office by Tuesday morning. Please be sure to label which candles are yours. The candles preferably should be of beeswax. There will be a blessing of candles offered on the weekend of the 6th/7th but will not be the same as the one offered on the 2nd.

Topic for the week of February 1st: How can we share our faith and help others find Christ?

Q: If I remember correctly the practice of assigning names to the Holy Angels is discouraged by the Church. If this is correct, why? What if the name of my guardian angel was revealed to me in prayer?



A: A document written in 2001 by the Congregation for Divine Worship entitled, Directory on Popular Piety in the Liturgy reads: "The practice of assigning names to the holy angels should be discouraged, except in the cases of Gabriel, Raphael and Michael, whose names are contained in Holy Scripture."

Perhaps, it is the understanding that names at one time had meaning. For our modern world, a name is simply something we respond to and are known by. In ancient times, and

even in many places today, a name has a far deeper significance. A name could indicate the parent's hope for what the child would become. A name could also describe something of the essence of the person. The Jews named their child on the eighth day. Among other reasons, this practice gave the parents some time to observe something of the child's reactions to different situations or stimuli. Then, these observations could give a clue for naming a child. Most Biblical names at the time were meaningful and descriptive.

It is presumptive of us to think that we can know enough of the essence of an angel in order to be able to assign a name. Hence, assigning a name seems inappropriate. Another reason is that assigning a name indicates some superiority over the one being named. In the case of a child, parents, who are superior over their child, have authority to name them. In the case of angels, they are superior to us. Even though we are taught they serve us, they are able to carry out this mission because of their superior power. Thus, assigning a name to an angel does seem out of line and an overstepping of our position.

As for an angel's name being revealed to you, it seems to me a tad unlikely an angel, or the Holy Spirit, would act contrary to the directive that Jesus gave His Church, which is to be His voice here on earth. What would have been the purpose for this unusual revelation? For me personally, since not knowing the name of my guardian angel has no bearing on my salvation, I'm not even curious. Let me respectfully suggest that you have a discussion with Fr Phil, Fr John or Deacon Alan. I may be wrong, and any one of these men can guide you in the discernment process.

COVID-19 UPDATE WHY ARE THE WINDOWS OPEN IN CHURCH?

- Stay home if you are sick. If you are not feeling well, have a cough, or are experiencing any symptoms of COVID, please refrain from attending Mass in person and watch Mass online or
- Wear a mask. Please put on your mask prior to entering the church building and keep it on.
- Sanitize your hands. Sanitize your hands at the Hand Sanitizing stations as you enter the building.
- Practice social distancing. Be mindful of proper social distancing when choosing a seat and when going up to receive Communion.



FRIDAY: CELEBRATING OUR STUDENTS


Plans for an enjoyable afternoon and a PTC treat for the entire student body, plus free pizza lunch for the whole school.


