Catholic Schools and Spiritual Growth

As a teacher, I am very grateful to have the opportunity to work in a Catholic school. Catholic Schools offer opportunities for spiritual growth for the staff, students, and families. You see, I worked in a public school for a short time. During that time if a student brought up God in a discussion, we had to change the subject and not talk about God. Therefore, spiritual growth in a public school is very limited. I'm not saying it doesn't happen, however, in my experience spiritual growth was very stagnant for all.

I love St. Augustine Catholic School. Here staff, students, and families can grow spiritually. While in school we pray together and for each other everyday. We always try our best to love, forgive, and treat our neighbors as we ourselves would like to be treated, just like Jesus taught us to. While doing this, we grow spiritually.

At a Catholic School students have access to priests. St. Augustine's priests are active in the school. For example, you may see Father John greeting students in the parking lot in the morning when students arrive, or Father Phil volunteering for lunch duty when the school was in need, or Father Phil leading the student body in a walking rosary around the schoolyard. Father Phil and Father John provide Mass for the students during the week. Students can prepare and make their sacraments at school. We grow spiritually when we participate in Mass and the sacraments.



Students can grow spiritually when they are actively thinking about their faith. They have Religion class daily. Sometimes students have questions that I am not so sure how to answer, but because we have access to priests, we just have to ask Father Phil to come into the classroom and answer the questions for us. As busy as he is, he finds the time to visit. Some questions students asked were: "Why can't girls become priests?", "Why do priests wear black?", "If someone goes to hell when they die, can they ever get out of there?", "Is it a sin to believe in bigfoot?", "Is it a sin if you hurt someone while protecting your family?", and "Why do bad things happen to good people?". When students get answers to the questions they wonder about their faith, they grow spiritually.

Catholic Schools are a place where spiritual growth takes place. It takes place in the parking lot, playground, classroom, cafeteria, hallways, in subject matter, Principal's office, and the Church. Most importantly, it takes place in the hearts and souls of our staff, students, and families. In a Catholic School spiritual growth is never stagnant. It is always growing.




