

### **Family Directors**

I announced last weekend (and plan to do so this weekend) that we are in need of talented, generous individuals who would be willing to volunteer their skills and their time to bolster and enhance our Family. A short summary of the two director positions are listed below:

#### Director of Engagement

Professional who assists parishioners by equipping them for the service of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. (See Unleash the Gospel, Guidepost 4.); oversees programs that evangelize the evangelizers (Marker 4.1, 4.2) using the process of encounter, grow, and witness; helps parishioners to discern their charisms for ministry (Marker 4.3); leads parish and Family efforts to reach out to unchurched Christians and people of other faiths; ensures effective and responsive communications to all those engaged with or seeking engagement with the Church; oversees RCIA and the radical hospitality for all parish events and programs; develops evangelization initiatives and collaborates with the team so evangelization is integrated

throughout the other areas; works closely with the Director of Discipleship Formation and Director of Family Ministries, helping to move individuals and families from the "attract" and "encounter" stages of evangelization into the "grow" and "witness" phases of discipleship formation.

Examples of particular attention to this position include ministry placement, evangelization, communications, and hospitality.

This individual should be passionate about the work of making disciples and supporting the parish mission and vision statements, able to inspire others about all aspects of Detroit Model of Evangelization, and possess some of the following charisms: Administration, Discernment of Spirits, Evangelism, Helps, Hospitality, Leadership, and Teaching.

### Director of Evangelical Charity

Professional who ensures a full response to Catholic Social Teaching through charity in areas of human need, both in the parish and beyond, and who works for justice by the promotion and coordination of action to eliminate the causes of human need in our society; ensures all evangelical charity initiatives are based on a person-to-person engagement approach that places a primary value on the integral connection between works of mercy, accompaniment, and evangelization (UTG Markers 6.1,6.2 and 8.4).

Examples of particular attention in this

position include care ministries, bereavement, community outreach, and pro-life ministries.

This individual should be passionate about the work of witnessing to the power of the Lord's mercy to the world, and possess some of the following charisms: Administration, Encouragement, Giving, Healing, Helps, Mercy, Service.

#### **Indulgence: Praying for the Dead**

There is a particular plenary indulgence that can be obtained beginning November 1st to 8<sup>th</sup>. A plenary indulgence remits the temporal punishment due to sin (purgatory). The indulgenced act during that time involves visiting a cemetery and offering prayers for the dead. The general prescription for obtaining a plenary indulgence apply: 1. Confession (20 days prior or after the indulgenced day), 2. Holy Eucharist, 3. Pray for the Pope's intentions (Remember, the intentions are specific to the office of the papacy, not to the holder of the office. Prayer can consist of an Our Father and a Hail Mary). 4. Be free from all attachment including venial sin, and 5. Carry out the prescribed indulgenced act mentioned earlier. Of course, if any one of these requirements are deficient, a partial indulgence can still be obtained (so it's always worth pursuing). An indulgenced act can only be offered either for oneself or for someone who is deceased. One can only pursue a plenary indulgence once a day; partial indulgences can be obtained without

### Praised be Jesus Christ. Happy Solemnity of All Saints and Feast of All Souls' Day.

One thing that we as 21st century American Catholics are lacking today is an understanding of authentic Catholic culture. In Europe each town has its own patron Saint and on that Saint's feast day, the town shuts down and the people celebrate with great festivities. The reality is, in our world today, we rarely focus on these types of "Catholic things" such as feast days, and instead allow modern culture to influence and form how we live our lives.

### The Gore of Halloween

One obvious sign of the Feasts of All Saints and All Souls' Days (November 1st and 2nd) is our lack of recognition and response to them today. Halloween, with its gore and "terror filled" haunted houses, has taken precedent over the Solemn Catholic Feasts we should

The authentic meaning of Halloween is the Vigil for All Souls' Day. Just as we celebrate Christmas Eve as a solemn entrance into the day of Christmas, so too was October 31st a vigil to enter into the Solemn Feast of All Souls Day. All Hallows Eve, as it was always known as, (Oct 31) began as a reminder to us to pray for our beloved dead and celebrate the saints in Heaven. Unfortunately, now we even allow our own children to dress up as little devils and witches--which is blatantly mocking our Christian Faith.

#### **Celebrating the Days**

This year the feast of All Saints falls on a Monday so that we are all able to celebrate this great day as a family together. All Souls' Day, November 2nd, follows. Please see the

On November 2nd particularly recognize and pray for all the faithful departed from our Family of Parishes—the Family of Jesus' Merciful Love. Pray for their salvation. We entrust them to the Merciful Love of our Savior.

### Mail

Q. I really enjoy celebrating Halloween. I would like to know what the official position of the Catholic Church is on celebrating this holiday.

**A.** I am not sure if Halloween is an actual holiday. I am equally unsure whether the Catholic Church has ever taken a position or otherwise) on celebrating Halloween. I have not found anything to that effect. Therefore, perhaps we are free to draw our own conclusion based on "unofficial" observations and conjecture?

Christianity's attitudes towards Halloween are quite diverse. Many see Halloween as having strong Christian roots. In the Anglican Church, some dioceses have chosen to emphasize the Christian aspects of these traditions, while other Protestants celebrate Halloween as Reformation Day, a day of remembrance and prayers for unity. Still other Protestant denominations condemn Halloween as being evil or satanic.

Although St. Paul never heard of Halloween, he gives us guidelines for a variety of similar situations in the 14th chapter of Romans. We are to follow our conscience on such matters while at the same time being careful not cause others to lose faith by a bad example we might set. The Catholic Church ascribes no negative significance to Halloween, treating it as a purely secular observance devoted to imaginary and handing out candy.

Halloween celebrations are quite common among Catholic parochial schools. Furthermore, Father Gabriele Amorth, a Vatican-appointed exorcist in Rome, has said, "If children like to dress up as witches and devils on one night of the year that is not a problem. As long as it is just a game, there is no harm in that."

Any holiday is what we make of it. If our intention is to pay homage to satanic forces, that would be a grave sin any day of the year. The things of utmost importance are our motivation in the observance, how we conduct ourselves while participating and how our words and actions may negatively influence others.

Our Halloween traditions in the U.S. could actually be considered as a ridicule of evil rather than a celebration of it. Although today's celebrants tend more to dress up as super heroes, cartoon characters, historic figures and such, even those who are decked out as some sort of ghoul do so in fun, not in honor of any dark forces. Door to door trick or treating is giving way to more trunk or treat type events. One big reason for this development is the safety of our children. There are some sick people in this world who would do harm to the children who come to their door. Therein lays the real evil in Halloween.

### Firsts in First Grade

To begin, I would like to introduce myself to those who I have not had the pleasure of meeting yet. My name is Hannah Burke and I'm so blessed to be teaching first grade at St. Augustine. Since I can remember, I wanted to be a teacher, however, like most people, I never expected to be navigating my career during a pandemic. I still remember receiving an email from Wayne State University that classes were changed to online courses and student teaching partnerships were also going to be completed virtually. As impossible as that idea was, I completed a year of student teaching from behind a screen and graduated in May 2021. Even though student teaching and graduation looked much different than I expected, the school year looked different for our students as well.

Something that has brought new understanding to me throughout the pandemic and beginning my career is that my students and I have had similar experiences. During a time of so many unknowns, I never realized that one day, God would lead me to students that also faced similar challenges. Currently, I have 20 first graders in my class that never had a "normal" year of school. They have learned to go to school through the

pandemic just like I have learned to teach in a pandemic.

This journey has brought many exciting experiences to my classroom. To highlight one of these experiences, last week on October 15th, the first and second grade classes went on a field trip to the Pine River Nature Center in Goodells. This was the first time that I was able to go on a field trip as a teacher, but more importantly, it was the first time that our students were able to experience a field trip. We had a wonderful day and our students received such an enriching experience to further understand plants and animals in the world around us.

I always pictured myself working in a large public school district, however, I believe there is always a reason that the Lord points us in a specific direction. The community of St. Augustine has been such a great place to work. This environment has not only helped me to grow in my teaching practices but also grow spiritually. Being a young teacher can be very challenging and something that is a great advantage of working at St. Augustine is the community of faith around me. I'm so excited to continue working in this community and growing in my faith over the next year.

### What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. One must never forget the infinite graces that flow from the Sacrifice of the Mass which benefit one's soul. Pope Leo XIII in his encyclical "Mirae caritatis" (1902) beautifully elaborated this point and emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass: "The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice [of the Mass], to all who belong to the communion of saints."

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

The special personal fruits of the Mass benefit the celebrating priest who acts in the person of Christ in offering the Mass and to the people who are in attendance and participate in the offering of the Mass. These fruits are both extensively and intensively finite, since each of us is finite. Therefore, the more a Mass is offered, the more benefit is conferred.
