Sacrament of Marriage:

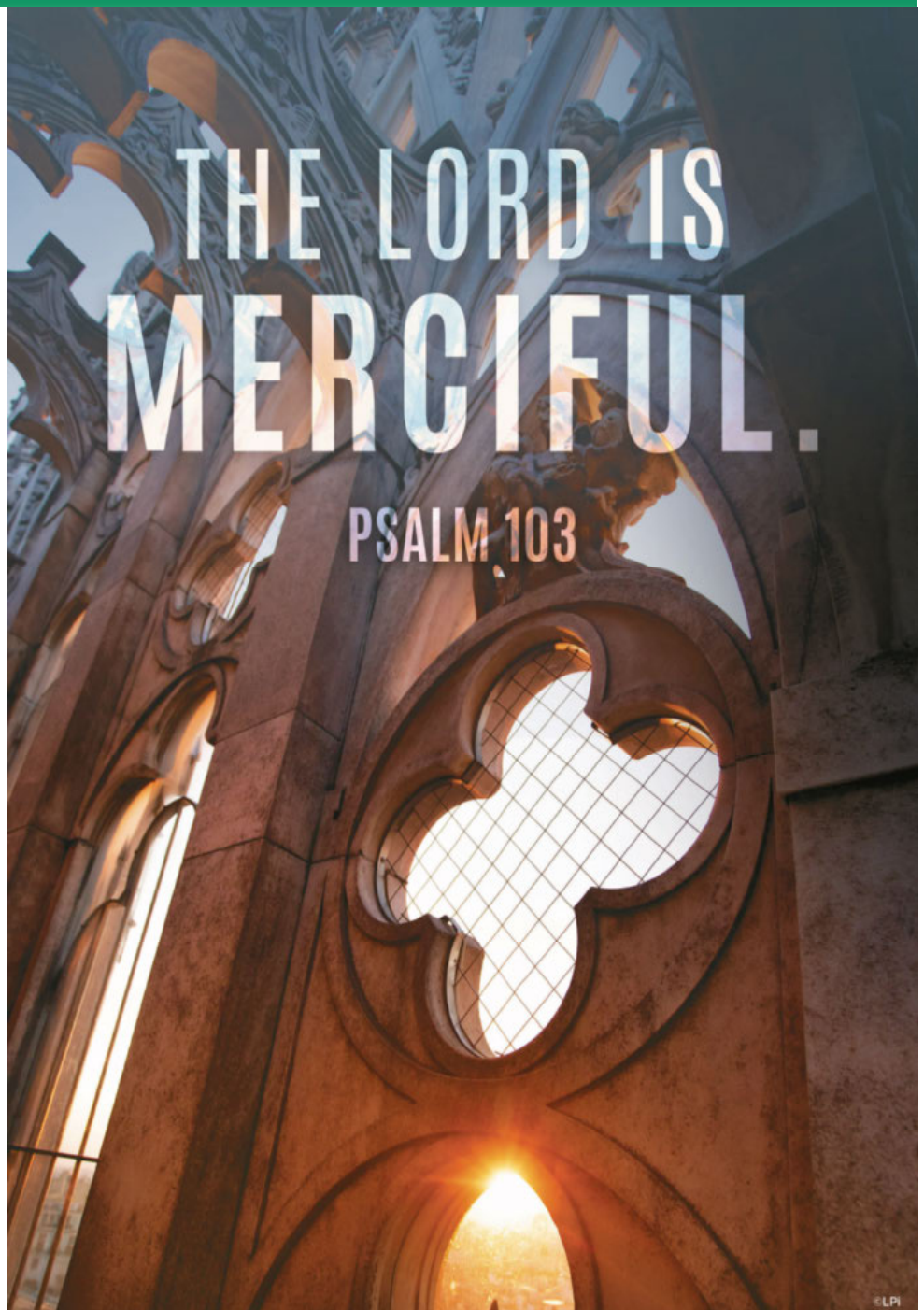
In accordance with the guidelines of the Province of Michigan, engaged couples must contact the Parish Office six months prior to the desired date of marriage and complete required preparation.

Prayers are being answered, but we sometimes don't do a good job of sharing the good news to others when such prayers are answered in accordance with our hope. While we should always render God praise, since He answers our prayers according to His benevolent wisdom, nevertheless, we should always give God the credit that is due to Him when the fruit of prayer comes as we have desired.

Healing of Families (Intergenerational Healing)

Does your family have a history of high blood pressure, heart problems, degenerative eye diseases, cancer, and other afflictions?

Have you noticed that a history of divorce is prevalent down the generational line (your dad was divorced several times, so with your brother, and maybe your aunt also)? Do you feel as if you have been "dealt a bad hand" even though you try to do the right thing? Is everyone else in your family far from God, and you are wondering, "What can I do to help them experience His goodness and be welcomed back into His flock?" Are you struggling with addiction to sin and worldly things that you've given up and figured this is just who you are? Jesus can free you from these and many other things. He only needs you to come.

On Friday, March 18th, at 7:00 PM, we will be offering an Intergenerational Healing of Families service. If any of that speaks to you, I invite you to please come and join us for an anointed evening of prayer in the presence of our Almighty God. Even if you have been through this before, if there are other things that are bothering you or some things that have still persisted, I invite you to come.

Jesus said: "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give him the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence. And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be

opened" (Lk 11:5-10).

And so we come. We come with persistence. We come asking many times and trust that our Father will provide. While there is some preparation that is highly recommended, it is not mandatory. We will commend everything to the mercy of the Father. An updated talk will be made available online on our website (I am hoping before the end of February) that will help prepare you for the Healing service (yes, it's a service, not Holy Mass). For those who are unable to access the internet, I will be making CDs for you to pick up from the parish offices across our Family. I hope for those to be available by the beginning of March.

The last time this was offered in late August at St. Mary Mystical Rose. In March, this will be hosted at Holy Family. In the meantime, I invite everyone to please offer a Hail Mary daily for myself, all those who will be involved, and all those whom the Lord is calling to receive freedom that they may come and not be hindered but encouraged. Also, pray daily that we be protected by the loving mantle of our Mama Mary and pray daily in gratitude to the Father's mercy for all that He will be doing during the Healing service. Many healings occur every time this is offered: spiritual, mental, physical... our God heals today. God bless.

BELIEVE: with Fr. Steve

Lent begins March 2nd on Ash Wednesday; just eleven more days. Can you believe it? Have you given any consideration as to what you are going to offer God this Lenten season? Please do not see your Lenten offerings as just “giving something up.” It is so important for us to attach our offering, our sacrifice, our penance to something.

What does that mean? Say you offer up television and all media during the 40 days of Lent—a great difficulty for some of us. But spiritually, attaching your offering for your child's conversion back to Jesus, or for your spouse, can be immensely beneficial and rewarding. So every single time you want to turn on the radio, or plop in front of the television, you are remembering you are making this offering for that particular intention. **Attach your sacrifice to an intention.**

Have a plan for Lent. This is meant to be the sacred time of renewal for us as Catholics. Ask God to make this Lenten season different than before. Have a plan and make that plan now! On page 7 you'll find our Lent and Easter schedule in full. Decide now which Mass you're planning on attending on Ash Wednesday—and don't wash your forehead immediately afterwards. Those ashes are a great outward sign of our Christian dignity.

The Wild Goose

If you haven't been able to come to the Monday night sessions and video series called “The Wild Goose,” come this week and check it out. I'm teaching on the power of the Sacraments. It's a great series—you should come!

Pro-Life Equipping



- Day 1 - conception takes place.
- Day 7 - tiny human implants in mother's uterus.
- Day 10 - mother's menses stop.
- Day 18 - heart begins to beat.
- Day 21 - pumps own blood through separate closed circulatory system with own blood type.
- Day 28 - eye, ear and respiratory system begin to form.
- Day 42 - brain waves recorded, skeleton complete, reflexes present.
- Week 7- thumb sucking.

- Week 8 - all body systems present.
- Week 9 - squints, swallows, moves tongue, makes fist.
- Week 11 - spontaneous breathing movements, has *fingernails*, all body systems working.
- Week 12 - weighs one ounce.
- Week 16 - genital organs clearly differentiated, grasps with hands, swims, kicks, turns, somersaults, (still not felt by the mother).
- Week 18 - vocal cords work – can cry.
- Week 20 - has hair on head, weighs one pound, 12 inches long.
- Week 21 - youngest child to survive outside womb after premature birth.
- Week 23 - 17% chance of viability outside of womb if birth premature.*
- Week 24 - 39% of babies survive premature birth.*
- Week 25 - 50% of babies survive premature birth.*

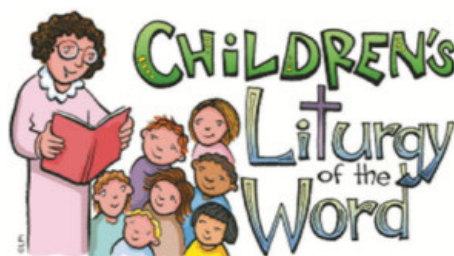
