### Vigilance

Whenever we stand for something, there will always be forces that oppose us. Therefore, it's best if we choose now what glorifies God, what honors Him, and what we are morally bound to do as Catholic Christians. Even Jesus Himself could not appease everyone. That wasn't His calling in life. It shouldn't be ours. His goal was to do the will of Our

Heavenly Father's, that is, to do the work that will bring about the salvation of souls under the direction of the Holy Spirit. Our Lord was firm in His teachings because they contained His Words of Life, the direction given for those who wish to attain Heaven. Those who reject it, suffer in the end. Those who embrace it, will reap rewards for all eternity. Our culture has gotten more brazen and hostile against God and the Catholic Church for many, many years. Our response to these attacks (such as sacrilege) is not for us to cower against the atrocities but to raise up an even louder, rallying cry to the Heavens and boldly proclaim the saving message of Jesus Christ to all peoples. Pray the rosary daily. Do not lose heart!

### Warmer Weather

It is a blessing to experience some warmer weather. The colder temps certainly expand our appreciation for the summer air. With warmer weather, many go through a change in wardrobe to reflect the change in season. It is a blessing to see people come to worship the Lord on His day. It is the way by which we render to God the thanks that is due to Him in the manner that He has asked. Yet, it would serve us well to make sure that when we do come to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we are dressed our best.

Now, I know there are circumstances when that's not possible, such as when only one Sunday Mass time (among the eight currently offered throughout our Family) is possible and it coincides with

one's work schedule (either having to go to work immediately after Holy Mass or going to Holy Mass immediately after work). That's certainly one example where we may not be able to dress our best for the Lord. I have encouraged those, for example, who work in the medical field to come as they are especially if having to change clothes will make them late for Holy Mass or unable to attend Holy Mass at all. Yet there are other circumstances when our schedules do not impede us from dressing well for Jesus. In fact, we must make that a priority as we come before the King of kings and Lord of lords!

According to [catholicgentleman.com](https://catholicgentleman.com), how we dress is actually a sign of how much respect we have for ourselves and for other people! I'd also like to add that it's a sign of how much we are aware of what is going on at a particular event. Looking our best takes time and effort, and people are well aware when we take the time to do so. When we dress our best, it is a way that we show reverence for Jesus. Sam Guzman explains, "We struggle as a society to understand royalty. We have a warped view of equality that tells us that no one, no matter who they are, is worthy of honor and respect. This is simply wrong. St. Paul says to 'give honor to whom honor is due.' And if anyone is worthy of honor, it is Jesus Christ, our priest and king.... Part of being a man is doing the right thing, even if it isn't popular" (source: <https://catholicgentleman.com/2013/07/gentlemen-dress-up-for-mass/>).

## BELIEVE: with Fr. Steve

Sam offers an appropriate rule of thumb for dressing appropriately for Holy Mass:

1. Your outfit should take effort – When choosing what to wear for Mass, don't go for what is most comfortable and easy. In fact, make it a little uncomfortable. For example, if you have been wearing Crocs to Mass, try wearing some nice leather shoes instead. If you have been wearing a polo shirt, try a dress shirt. If you have been wearing a tie, try adding a sport coat. In other words, put forth some effort and make a small sacrifice.
2. Your attire should be above average – We all live in different places, and our culture has much to do with what constitutes respectful dress. A ranch hand in rural Montana or poor migrant worker is not held to the same standards as a wealthy Wall Street executive. No matter where we live, though, we should all have 'Sunday best'—clothes we wear that are nicer than what we wear every day. If you're wearing the same thing to Mass that you do when going to the movies, there is a problem.
3. Do it for love – Most importantly, love should be our motivation. The moment we start doing things for reasons other than love, we are wasting our time. I have heard a lot of people say, "God looks on the heart. He sees that I love him even if I don't dress up." WRONG. Love always manifests itself outwardly through acts of self-giving. Love is not a feeling, it is a choice to sacrifice yourself or something you value for someone else. As I said earlier, dressing up is a very small sacrifice. Tell Jesus you love him and respect him by making a sacrifice of effort when choosing your attire or grooming for Mass. The more you don't feel like dressing up, the more valuable your sacrifice of time and attention will mean to Jesus.

With all of that said, through the hecticness and craziness of the last month of my life, I wish I had the ability to thank each of you individually, but I just cannot. I opened every single one of your cards before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, read them, and prayed for you. May your intentions be heard by God and your kindness shown to me be returned tenfold!

### Roe v Wade

Last week or so there was a treasonous breach at the Supreme Court where as someone released a classified document indicating that the High Court in the United States of America was preparing itself to begin to overthrow the poorly written law of Roe v Wade.

Ectopic pregnancy? Get involved and study. Learn the truth and answers.

Multiple churches have been attacked and Sunday worship interrupted by Satan's minions advocating for the right of abortion. This is not a political issue. This is not an issue about "reproductive rights." This is God's side or not God's side. You cannot be a Catholic in good standing and believe in, support in any way or vote for, the legalization of abortion.

### Conflict

They say "coexist" but know full well that, when push comes to shove, a society built on principles of human dignity and worship of God cannot coexist with a society built on worship of sexual liberation. And they hate you for it. And they're calling you out for living a life in Christ and proclaiming the truth.

What do we do from here? Be kind. Love your enemies. When they shout, tell them "Jesus died for you." But also, don't think your silence is helping you, or making you appear more welcoming. Speak truth loudly and draw boundaries.

The world has brought us here. The front line between good & evil is on your doorstep. At your church. In your child's classroom. Among your friends. Defend the truth. Defend your faith.

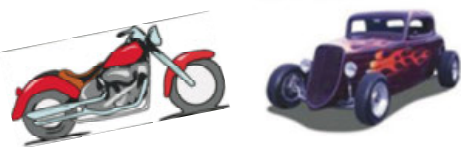

## Corpus Christi ~ Walk With Jesus ~ Sunday, June 19, 2022

What is *Walk With Jesus*?

It is a mini pilgrimage, where pilgrims walk, processing Jesus in the Monstrance, through the community from St. Augustine to Holy Family in honor of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

This pilgrimage starts at St. Augustine with Mass at 6:30 a.m. After Mass, pilgrims will set out for a six mile walk to Holy Family. Along the way songs of praise, recitation of the Rosary and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed. There are two stops along the way where Benediction is offered. Porta potties are available with an opportunity for a short rest. Upon arrival at Holy Family there will be Benediction and Mass offered which is around 10:30 a.m. Immediately following Mass the celebration will be concluded with lunch and fellowship in the Life Center.

A shuttle bus will begin shuttling pilgrims from Holy Family to St. Augustine starting at 6:00 a.m. and will run until around 7:30 a.m. For those who may need a rest during the walk, a hay wagon will be available at the end of the procession during the entire walk.

Along the walk there are stations set up allowing pilgrims the opportunity to carry Jesus and the canopy. Six people are needed for each station. Station sign-ups will be available at each parish. You can sign up for a station by either visiting the parish where the station sign up sheet is or by calling the parish office where the station sign up sheet is located.

So, what is *Walk With Jesus* you ask? It is an opportunity for people of our Family of Parishes to go on a small pilgrimage, evangelizing our local community, and celebrating together the true Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

## Jesus Made Me Do It

A few weeks ago I was reading part of a bulletin from St. Francis-St. Maximilian parish. In it there was a section that stood out to me. In the article it talked about how the resurrection of Christ is really about trying new things. As stated in the bulletin:

“The resurrection of Christ is really about receiving the gifts of trust and faith and doing new things. The rocks that bind us keep us spinning the same wheels and doing the same things. When was the last time you threw caution to the wind and actually did something out of character and different? This is where we find God, in the spontaneous, the adventurous, the fun, and the creative choices we make. God is not boring and stuck. God is exciting and engaging.” (Parish Bulletin of St. Francis-St. Maximilian Kolbe Sunday, Apr 17, 2022)

If we stay in our same old routines we may feel comfort at the expected, but we also miss out on opportunities that God gives us. Life should be about experiences one can partake in rather than possessions. The children here at St. Augustine are often given opportunities (field trips, clubs, sports,

camp, etc.) to participate in things that they otherwise would not experience. We want them to try new things. It is a part of growing and learning in an environment geared to them.

Without change, lessons can become mundane and monotonous, not just for the kids but the teachers as well. Teachers have to change and adapt to the needs of their classroom. This is in the form of trying new lessons, reading new books, and using new resources to enhance the learning experience. Without this teachers are weighted down by those rocks that bind us and keep our students bound as well.

Adults can experience new things if they are willing to untie the rocks that bind us. A trip to a new place, taking a class on something you are interested in, or even taking a new route to work can awaken in us a self-resurrection of our own spirit or sense of adventure. Go out and try something new. See God in these new experiences. Your drive could offer you a different perspective on the morning sunrise. The new class could introduce you to new people who become dear friends. If someone asks you why you are doing something different, respond with “Jesus made me do it.”
