Necessary Action

"The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men do nothing." While the origins of this quote is up for debate, the sentiment rings true. People of goodwill participate in the promotion of good and fighting against evil. Wishing evil not to happen when someone has the ability to "right the ship" is not enough. As baptized Catholics, Christians, and people of goodwill, we must respond appropriately and virtuously in the face of evil.

Last weekend and this weekend, I shared much of Bishop Boyea's pastoral letter to his flock in Lansing as well as Archbishop Allen Vigneron's pastoral letter to our archdiocese. They both spoke about our responsibility to learn more why we need to vote no when it comes to the "Reproductive Freedom for All" initiative that will be up for voting on November 8th as Proposal 3. The matter is so grave that Archbishop Vigneron said, "To vote in favor of this proposal would be to actively participate in the promotion and expansion of the intrinsic moral evil of abortion." I encourage all to take the time to learn about this proposal and learn why the only Catholic (and good) response is to vote it down.

If you have not heard me speak of this, I encourage you to please check out

the podcast which has my homilies. It's the one marked for the "25th Sunday in Ordinary Time C."

Both bishops have advocated us to support the organization called "Citizens to Support MI Women and Children." Their website is located here: https://supportmiwomenandchildren.org/ There you will also discover the wording of the Proposal and the implications of having this pass.

Bishop Boyea encouraged us to participate in a 54 Day Rosary Novena. While it began on the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows, you can still join the effort by texting "FightLikeHeaven" (without quotation marks) to 84576. For those relatively new to texting, you will first be prompted who you would like to send the message to, and that should be the number first (84576). Then you will be taken to the area to type out your text. In case. in the word type "FightLikeHeaven" (again without quotations).


Treasures of the Church

On September 16th, St. Mary Queen of Creation hosted this beautiful exhibit where the relics of many saints were present for veneration. We did host this last year at Holy Family if this sounds familiar. This included relics of the Twelve Apostles, St. Joseph, St. Pio of Pietrelcina, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Joan of Arc, St. Sebastian, St. Mary of Jesus Crucified, St. Philomena, St. Thomas Moore, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, and St. Thomas Aguinas. Featured among the relics were also that from Jesus and Our Blessed Mother Mary (such as the relic of the true cross, the spear of Longinus, and Our Lady's veil). It was an opportunity to be physically close to God and a few of His saints (over 150 relics!). 




