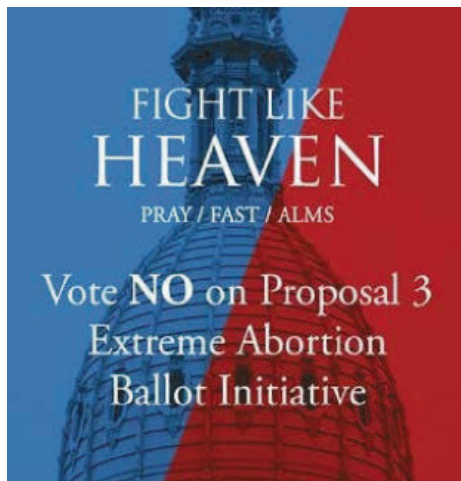

When we have a goal ahead of us, we are more apt to do whatever is necessary to get it.

All Souls Q & A

Question:

November is called the month of All Souls. More recently, it has been called the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Can you tell us more about this feast and the remembrances of this month?

Answer:

November 2nd, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, dovetails with November 1st, the feast of All Saints. The saints, our models of Christian living, are one with God in heaven. All the faithful departed are those who have died with hope and trust in a loving God who calls us to greater growth and development, even beyond death. This growth and development occurs in a state of being that we have traditionally called purgatory.

While the Western Church has emphasized the cleansing and purifying nature of purgatory, the Eastern Orthodox Church has emphasized the growth and development aspect of it. Today, belief in purgatory allows one who has died in Christ to continue growing and developing before meeting God face to face. God continually invites communion with these loved ones, but some feel the need to continue growing and developing before entering into full communion with God.

These November feasts vividly remind us of the rich reality known as the communion of saints. This belief stresses the strong affirmation that the church is always one in Christ. Death does not sever any of the bonds that unite us in Christ. That is why it is a fitting practice to pray for the dead and to ask them to pray for us. Just as we do that for each other when we are alive, so, too, do we continue that bond and concern for each other even beyond death.

Q. I'm sure you have been asked this before, but how does the Catholic Church come up with the idea that salvation requires works?

Ephesians 2:8-9 clearly states, just like Martin Luther wrote: "We are saved by faith alone not by any works we do."

A. This issue has come up before, as have other concerns. For those who may have missed particular questions in the past or are new to this forum, responses are worth repeating.

Let's be clear, the Church does not come up with ideas. The Church passes on what has been handed down to her. As for your question: Ephesians 2:8-9 reads: *"For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves it is the gift of God not by works, so that no one can boast."* I could completely agree with Martin Luther here were it not for the very next verse (10) which continues: *"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."* Clearly, works do not produce salvation but salvation produces works.

Not only does salvation produce works, God has prepared, in advance, specific works for each individual. What is God's plan for you? Priest? Deacon? Nun? Catechist? Missionary? Altar server? Usher? Wedding planner? Parish council or commission member? Caring for the church building and grounds? Working in a soup kitchen? Visiting the sick or imprisoned? Sharing your faith at work or in your neighborhood? The list of openings for works is endless. St. Paul taught us the Church is one body with many parts (1 Corinthians 12:12-27). Our salvation produces many open doors of opportunity. God provides our individual call, his mission for us.

There is also the matter of faith itself. Reading further in this same chapter, 2:24-26 reads:

"a person is justified by works and not by faith alone, for as the body without

the spirit is dead, so too faith without works is dead." Scripture is clear; salvation is not by faith alone. Furthermore our faith is dead without works. How then are we to be saved by faith alone? Martin Luther's answer to this question was simply to remove James and six other books from his bible to suit his own personal idea of salvation. Problem solved.

We must take Sacred Scripture in its entirety and not lift individual passages out of context and ignore others to justify our personal opinions. This method of bible interpretation is a direct result of people being taught they are their own pope and they do not need to look to the Chair of Peter, established by Jesus Christ, to guide his Church.

This is why Catholics have an advantage over denominational Christianity. We can rely on this 2,000 year old Church, established by Jesus, to provide the path for us to follow. 2 Timothy 2:15: *"Study to show yourself approved unto God, a workman who needs not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."* And there it is again—work. Study, workman, rightly divide the word of truth. We study to learn God's plan of salvation, not develop our own conjured up plan.

Since few people today are fluent in Ancient Hebrew, Aramaic, Latin and Greek and we are not familiar with the customs, idioms & genre of the times that the authors wrote their books nor the audience the books address, we workmen need guidance in our study. Without it, rightly dividing (understand) the word of truth is not possible. This New Testament Church, born from the complete fulfillment of the Old Testament Scriptures, is where the first hand knowledge, of all of the above has been compiled, protected and handed down to us. We Catholics are indeed a fortunate people.

Thank you for your prayers. I believe I was miraculously healed ...[at a] talk I gave at St. Mary's in Monroe.

For over 36 hours, I could not speak whatsoever. Barely a whisper. Hardly a sound. I asked some friends to pray over me before my scheduled talk in Monroe.

I went there expecting to be healed and knowing God would provide in all things—as He always does.

As my friends prayed over me, the image that came to my soul was my throat-coat tea with honey. I said to myself: "dang it! I forgot my tea!" And wondered if I had time to go back home and make some. Everyone gave me their solutions to solving laryngitis—honey tea being most common.

They continued to pray. As they did I saw this wild honey flow from a rock. I remembered Moses striking the rock for water and fed the Israelites. I cried out to God! Lord you are my honey from the Rock!

I knew Jesus is the sweetness of all things. He ... our honey from the Rock!

I kept saying to Him silently, "be my honey from the rock!" Over and over again, "be my honey from the rock!"

Instantly—my voice became audible. Low. My friend said "Jesus, turn up the volume! I want more honey from the rock Jesus!"

At the end of our time I was speaking in a raspy voice. Still hesitant to push it. I waited to speak much—but I was healed.

On my way to Monroe my friend texted me Psalm 81:16 "But you would be fed with the finest of wheat; with honey from the rock I will satisfy you."

I had completely forgotten God's promise!!!! He is the HONEY FROM THE ROCK!

I got to Monroe. Prayed in thanksgiving. Barely spoke, but as I was being introduced to come up to speak, I felt this immense weight and power on my head. I put my head between my legs and said "Jesus you are my Honey from the Rock! I claimed the healing I just received. I am yours. You are mine. Open my voice!" And went on to speak for 12 mins or so for the first time in two days. Hoarse. Raw. Squeaky. But healed by Jesus our King—our HONEY FROM THE ROCK!
