First, heart-felt thanks to all who contributed to the appreciation reception for Fr. Phil. I know he moves forward to whatever priestly ministry God has in store for him, confident that our prayers continue to support him.

Second, special thanks to the brother knights who created and installed the new platform for our bell at Holy Family. Well done, good and faithful servants!

The Knights of Columbus District Deputy spoke with me after 7:30 Mass at St. Augustine about a special image of St. Joseph which will come to each of our parishes this spring at a date to be determined. This will afford us an opportunity for special prayer to St. Joseph. Details will follow as plans progress.

Five weeks ago, as I stood with the pilgrims on the Mount of Olives. I pointed out the route that Jesus most likely followed from the Upper Room, down a set of stone steps still present on the grounds of St. Peter Gallicantu church ("the cock crowed"), across the Kidron Valley and up to the Garden of Gethsemane. Being there was, of course, powerful. Remembering what He did, and why He did it, is even more powerful.

As we journey with Jesus during this holiest of weeks, what grace does He have for us, as individuals, families, and parish communities? The events are so dramatic that we could easily be swept up in the power of the liturgies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. And that would certainly be a great blessing.

I suggest that Jesus wants even more for us: He wants us to know Him and His Love for us much more deeply. So deeply that we can't help but let others know how much He loves us all. Let's ask Him now to draw us closer; to open our hearts to whatever grace He wants for us. Let's ask this for ourselves, of course, but for one another as well.

I think in the past I may well have gotten so caught up in what happens next, in the details, that I forgot how much He wants me to encounter Him, to know Him, so I can follow Him.

I pray that this will be the holiest week of our lives.

Kinder-Garden Corner

We are nearing the end of Lent, and in Kindergarten we have been using this time to help us to "Grow in Jesus." When Lent began, we talked about what this season in the Church means and why it is so important to take an active part in it. We talked about sacrificing, giving, and growing in our faith. To help us to do these things, each week the Kindergarteners take home a sheet of flower petals. On each petal there is something written. Each day, with the help of their parents, the Kindergarteners pick a petal to do. Some of the petals are a sacrifice - not watching TV or giving up a favorite snack or treat for the day. Some petals are an act of kindness - playing with someone who looks lonely, calling grandparents to visit, helping with a chore, or telling people in their families they love them. Some petals are times for prayer and quiet time with Jesus. Every morning the kids bring their petals into school. They have colored them in - some one color, some with designs - all different, all unique, like my Kindergarteners. We share the petals with the class, and the children beam with pride when their petals are shared. At the end of the day, the petals

are hung on a giant flower we are "growing," so that we can see how we are "Growing in Jesus." The children are so proud and they get so excited, anticipating when it will reach the top and sides - and what if it gets too big?

Kindergarteners have a wonderful way of helping adults put life in perspective. As we prepare for Holy Week, I encourage you to take time to reflect on your Lenten journey. Did you grow in Jesus? Did your flower get too big? Did you enrich your relationship with our Lord?

May the peace and joy of the coming Easter season be with each of you. Thank you for all you do for our school! God bless!

Q. It seems that Protestant reformers were on to something when they declared that salvation is based on faith alone; just believe. Works are not needed. And, the bible alone should be the sole source of our faith. There is therefore no need for a pope, the Church or Sacred Tradition. How can Catholics dispute such simple logic?

A. Let's start with Proverbs 14:12: "There is a way which seems right to a person, but the end thereof is death." Logic may not be the best foundation on which to base our salvation. Translating from one language to another can be difficult. When it comes to God's word, we need to be ever mindful of this fact.

Matthew 6:30, Jesus admonished: "oh you of little faith" in regard to not trusting God to take care of our basic needs. Matthew 8:26, when a storm arose on the water, the disciples became

fearful. Once again Jesus admonished "oh you of little faith." The original word for faith in both of these passages is *olethroz*, meaning lacking trust or confidence. In Hebrews 10:23 St. Paul wrote: "Let us hold fast to the profession of our faith." The original word for faith here is *elpece*, meaning "anticipate with pleasure." However, in over 130 other passages in the New Testament where we find Jesus or an apostle using the word "faith" the word is *piztos*, meaning "fidelity or allegiance." Our English translations can sometimes be lacking in detail, meaning, or richness.

Fidelity and allegiance are not the same as trust or confidence. In his letter to believers Peter reminds the readers what Paul had written to them: "there are some things hard to understand that the ignorant and unstable distort to their own destruction." (2 Peter 6:16). Being ignorant (unaware) or distorting God's word, perhaps by using poor translation to form a misguided logic, can result in

our destruction. James 2:19 reads: "You believe that there is one God, you do well! Even the demons believe that—and shudder."

The human logic that reasons salvation comes by faith alone is completely contrary to the Sacred Scripture. Hebrews 11:6 "Without faith (*piztos*) it is impossible to please God." Fidelity and allegiance are actions (works). There is no auto-pilot here. Add to this James 2:24: "a person is justified by works and not by faith alone." Works do not produce salvation, that is true, but are rather a result of our salvation. It's a natural outcome. When you dive into a river, you can't help but get wet.

How can we have allegiance and fidelity to someone with whom we are not familiar? How can we claim fidelity to Jesus if we do not take the opportunity to learn about him through the Church he established for that very purpose? How can we understand the bible without the light of the Sacred Tradition which illuminates and magnifies God's word in its original language?

Jesus said "If you love me you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). He means all of his commandments, not just those that require no effort. The only way to have a complete understanding of what Jesus commands is from Sacred Scripture in its pure unadulterated form.

The sum and summit of our Catholic faith is the Eucharist. Among the other riches we find here is Sacred Tradition. It originates from people who lived at the time, in the culture, using the language in which the bible was written. Rejecting Sacred Tradition is not only illogical, it is downright dangerous.

As for scripture alone, there are 35,000 Protestant denominations teaching diametrically opposed doctrines while using the same bible, proving scripture alone is in need of reevaluation. As far as faith alone is concerned, I would ask which definition of faith we should use.
