Sacrament of Marriage:


In accordance with the guidelines of the Province of Michigan, engaged couples must contact the Parish Office six months prior to the desired date of marriage and complete required preparation.

From Msgr. Pat

The following from a sermon by St. Augustine inspired and moved me. I hope it has a similar effect for you.

"The passion of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is the hope of glory and a lesson in patience.

What may not the hearts of believers promise themselves as the gift of God's grace, when for their sake God's only Son, co-eternal with the Father, was not content only to be born as man from human stock, but even died at the hands of the men he had created?

It is a great thing that we are promised by the Lord; but far greater is what has already been done for us, and which we now commemorate. Where were the sinners, what were they, when Christ died for them? When Christ has already given us the gift of his death, who is to doubt that he will give the saints the gift of his own life? Why does our human frailty fail to believe that mankind will one day live with God?

Who is Christ if not the Word of God: 'in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God"? This Word of God 'was made flesh and dwelt among us.' He had no power of himself to die for us: he had to take from us our mortal flesh. This was the way, though immortal, he was able to die; the way in which he chose to give life to mortal men: he would first share with us, and then enable us to

share with him. Of ourselves we had no power to live, nor did he of himself have the power to die.

Accordingly, he effected a wonderful exchange with us, through mutual sharing: we gave him the power to die, he will give us the power to live.

The death of the Lord our God should not be a cause of shame for us; rather, it should be our greatest hope, our greatest glory. In taking upon himself the death he found in us, he has most faithfully promised to give us life in him, such as we cannot have of ourselves.

He loved us so much that, sinless himself, he suffered for us sinners the punishment we deserved for our sins. How then can he fail to give us the reward we deserve for our righteousness, for he is the source of righteousness? How can he, whose promises are true, fail to reward the saints when he bore the punishment of sinners, though without sin himself?

Brethren, let us then fearlessly acknowledge, and even openly proclaim, that Christ was crucified for us; let us confess it not in fear, but in joy, not in shame, but in glory.

The apostle Paul saw Christ, and extolled his claim to glory. He had many great and inspired things to say about Christ, but he did not say that he boasted in Christ's wonderful works: in creating the world, since he was God with the Father, or in ruling

the world, though he was also a man like us. Rather, he said, 'Let me not boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.'"

Because he died, we can live. One day is too little to contain our joy. And as disciples, we must share this Good News.

May God bless you with ongoing Easter ioy!

Erase and Try Again



Being surrounded by Preschoolers and their magnificent acceptance of the Lord and His everlasting love is a wonderful gift. There are so many examples of their goodness that I could share, but one particular moment resonated with me and my Lenten journey so outwardly that I thought God must be speaking to me directly.

Every year when I am personally preparing for Lent, I try to find something special to dedicate to our Lord. Many years ago when I was quite young, giving up chocolate or sweets was common, but as I have gotten older, I like to add something as opposed to taking something away. Sometimes it is a family promise, such as saying the Rosary together or memorizing a prayer, and sometimes it is more private, meant for me and the Lord only. Sometimes I get it right and sometimes it is a total miss. I tend to be hard on myself when I miss and this experience with a Preschooler reminded me that in either case, hit or miss, to thank the Lord for the lesson and most importantly, His sacrifice.

At the end of every month, the Preschoolers complete a Monthly Review. It is a snapshot of what we have been working on in that month and it shares with families and myself what areas have been mastered and which areas we need to revisit. While I was working on the Monthly Review with one of our four year olds, he was moving along quite quickly and confidently. Color of the month, check. Shape of the month, check. Letters

learned that month, check. Then writing his numbers ~ 1, check; 2, check; 3, check; 4, check; 5, check; 6, check; 7, check; 8...stop. I notice his pause, but give him the gift of time. First 8 attempt, he moans, then erases. Second 8 attempt, an ugh, then erases. Third 8 attempt, he says, "Boy, I need to work on this." Then erases. At this moment, I share words of encouragement and the fourth attempt begins, and he masters the number 8! A huge smile follows and an, "I did it!" exudes from his mouth.




I thought at this moment God was right there showing me through the work of a child how Lent should be approached and how merciful He is. Lent is a journey and if you do not get it right the first time, erase, and try again. And if you do not get it right on the second try, erase, and try again. Keep trying until you get it right. Find others who will give you words of encouragement. Pray to do better next time and always remember, our Lord is kind and patient. He will wait for us to get it right.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is an age-appropriate opportunity for children to celebrate a *concurrent* Liturgy of the Word in a nearby space and then return to the main assembly for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The children experience the same ritual and hear the same scriptures, but proclaimed in simplified language. The most notable difference is that the homily message is delivered as an interactive dialogue.

CLOW is currently happening at the 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. Augustine and the 10:30 a.m. Mass at Holy Family. All children are welcome. No preregistration is necessary. Please understand that this is not Childcare; the children are only gone for approximately 15-18 minutes. They'll return during the Offertory preparation. CLOW is most appropriate for Pre-school through 2nd grade.

After the Introductory Rites, the celebrant will invite the children and the volunteer leaders forward to be dismissed. The leaders will proclaim the readings and gospel, lead the children in singing a Psalm response, share the main message, and conclude with a simplified creed and intercessory prayers before rejoining their parents. This is not a "Sunday School" format. There are no crafts, coloring pages or snacks offered.

We are in great need of CLOW Leaders. If you enjoy working with children and can spare about 15 minutes of prep time, please consider this ministry. You will work in teams of two and if enough people sign up you will only be scheduled once every five or six weeks. A detailed leader guide is provided. Corpus Christi -Walk with Jesus Chairperson NEEDED

Our Corpus Christi procession, Walk with Jesus, began in 2008 when Holy Family was newly formed from Holy Rosary, St. Philip Neri, and All Saints. At that time, the walk started at Holy Rosary in Smiths Creek and ended at All Saints in Memphis. In 2010, after the closing of Holy Rosary, the Corpus Christi Walk With Jesus procession continued with a new route from Holy Family *Columbus* (St. Philp Neri) to Holy Family *Memphis* (All Saints). This continued until 2014 when the route once again changed, and the procession went from St. Augustine to Holy Family.
