From Msgr. Pat

One morning some years back I was coming down the steps for 6:30 AM Mass. The rectory adjoined the church. I'm not really a morning person, and I confess I was grumbling (whining?) about the early hour and my needing to get to the sacristy.

I went through the door separating the rectory from the church and had three more steps to the sacristy. On the second step the Lord clearly said to me, "Remember what you are about to do." I froze in mid step. I hadn't consciously been praying, but Jesus knew what I needed to hear. I celebrated Mass with special attentive prayerfulness that morning.

Ritual's purpose is to free us so we can lift our minds and hearts to God. Being human, we can too easily let rituals become routine. That can be spiritually deadly.

I mention this for two reasons. I had a recent conversation with an usher who suggested we move back to using the center aisle to approach for Holy Communion. Our present process is the result of appropriate caution as we returned to Mass as Covid's threat lessened. Also, many children in our parishes will be joining our procession to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus for the first time. I suggest, in this year dedicated to deepening our appreciation for this great gift, we all pause and "remember what we are about to do." I offer a document from our bishops about receiving Holy Communion which I find inspiring and helpful. I believe it can be a grace for us all (and I thank Fr. Kishore, our acting Director of Worship, who passed it on to me).

The document is entitled, "Reception of Holy Communion at Mass." You can find the entire document at the USCCB website. I plan to share part of it here, and more later.

"The Church understands the Communion Procession, in fact every procession in the liturgy, as a sign of the pilgrim Church, the body of those who believe in Christ, on their way to the Heavenly Jerusalem. All our lives we who believe in Christ are moving in time toward that moment when we will be taken by death from this world and enter into the joy of the Lord in the eternal Kingdom he has prepared for us. The liturgical assembly of the baptized that comes together for the celebration of the Eucharist is a witness to, a manifestation of, the pilgrim Church. When we move in procession, particularly the procession to receive the Body and Blood of Christ in Communion, we are a sign, a symbol of that pilgrim Church 'on the way.'"

For some, however, the experience of the Communion Procession is far more prosaic, analogous, perhaps, to standing in line in the supermarket or at the motor vehicle bureau. A perception such as this is a dreadfully inaccurate and impoverished understanding of what is a significant religious action. The Communion Procession is an action of the Body of Christ. At Christ's invitation, extended by the priest acting in Christ's person: 'Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb,' the members of the community move forward to

share in the sacred meal, to receive the Body and Blood of Christ which is the sign and source of their unity. In fact, each time we move forward together to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord, we join the countless ranks of all the baptized who have gone before us, our loved ones, the canonized and uncanonized saints down through the ages, who at their time in history formed a part of this mighty stream of believers."

Due to limits of space, I'll pause there for now. Our bishops have certainly given us a lot about which to pray, individually and as a community.

I commend to your personal prayer, the children who will receive Christ's Body and Blood for the first time and we'll be praying for them at Masses this and on the coming weekends as well. I urge you to pray that they will always be ravenously hungry for Jesus, especially in Holy Communion, and their parents as well. Pray, too, please, for the young people in the final weeks of preparation for Confirmation. Our world needs Spirit-filled young people to bring the Good News of God's love to countless wounded hearts.

Finally, on behalf of our communities, I want to thank all those who labored to make our worship such a grace-filled experience Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday: those who decorated, those who served as lectors, ushers, sacristans, acolytes, musicians and choir members. May God richly bless you all as He blessed us through your service.

I will be praying for all of you while I am away and I ask that you continue to pray for me for a safe journey. I look forward to being with you all when I return in June.

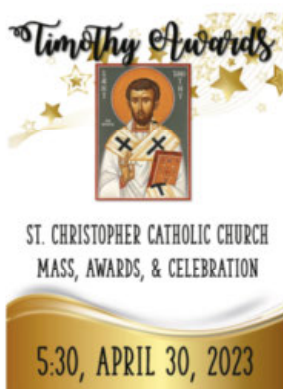

Walk With Jesus**

Sunday, June 11, 2023

What is *Walk With Jesus*?

Walk With Jesus is a mini pilgrimage. Pilgrims walk, processing Jesus in the Monstrance, through the community from St. Augustine to Holy Family in honor of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

This pilgrimage starts at St. Augustine with Mass at 6:30 a.m. After Mass, pilgrims will set out for a six mile walk to Holy Family. Along the way songs of praise, recitation of the Rosary and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed. There are two stops along the way where Benediction is offered. Porta potties are available with an opportunity for a short rest. Upon arrival at Holy Family, around 10:30 a.m., there will be Benediction and Mass offered. Immediately following Mass, the celebration is concluded with lunch and fellowship in the Life Center.

A shuttle bus will begin shuttling pilgrims from Holy Family to St. Augustine starting at 6:00 a.m. and will run until around 7:30 a.m. For those who may need a rest during the walk, a hay wagon will be available at the end of the procession during the entire walk.

Along the walk there are stations set up allowing pilgrims the opportunity to carry Jesus and the canopy. Six people are needed for each station. Station sign-ups will be available at each parish. You can sign up for a station by either visiting the parish where the station sign up sheet is or by calling the parish office where the station sign up sheet is located.

So, what is *Walk With Jesus* you ask? It is an opportunity for people of our Family of Parishes to go on a small pilgrimage, evangelizing our local community, and celebrating together the true Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

"Ultreya" is a Spanish word, derived from the original Latin, meaning Onward! It was commonly used by pilgrims to greet and encourage one another along the way.

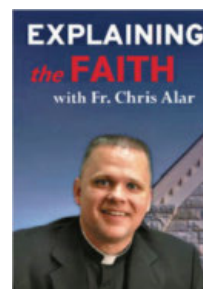
