
In accordance with the guidelines of the Province of Michigan, engaged couples must contact the Parish Office six months prior to the desired date of marriage and complete required preparation.

From Msgr. Pat

"Remember what you are about to do," the Lord said to my heart as I walked to the sacristy several years ago, complaining about the early hour for Mass.

Today I share further from a document from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops entitled "The Reception of Holy Communion at Mass."

I'm sharing these for a few reasons, not least because many children are receiving the Body and Blood of the Lord for the first time. Also, we're in the midst of a time of special catechesis and reflection on the Eucharist at the archdiocesan and national parish, This will culminate in a Eucharistic Congress to be held in Indianapolis in 2024. I'll repeat the document's first line, and then pick up where I left off last week.

"The Church understands the Communion Procession, in fact every procession in liturgy, as a sign of the pilgrim Church, the body of those who believe in Christ, on their way to the heavenly Jerusalem.

This action by Christ's body is, the Church assembled for the Eucharist, is manifested supported by the Communion Chant, a hymn in praise of Christ sung by the united voices of those who believe in him and share his life. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) takes this hymn very seriously, mandating that it should begin at the Communion of the priests and extend until the last person has received Communion.

"For some, however, this hymn is perceived as an intrusion on their own prayer, their private thanksgiving after Communion. In fact, however, this hymn is prayer, the corporate thanksgiving prayer of the members of Christ's Body, united with one another.

Over and over again the prayers of the liturgy and the norms of the General Instruction emphasize this fundamental concept of the unity of the baptized, stressing that when we come together to participate in the Eucharistic celebration we come, not as individuals, but as united members of Christ's Body. In each of the Eucharistic Prayers, though the petition is worded slightly different ways, God is asked to send his Holy Spirit to make us one body, one spirit in Christ; the General Instruction admonishes the faithful that 'they are to form one body, whether in hearing the Word of God, or taking part in prayers and singing..." (No. 96). It describes one of the purposes of the opening song of the Mass as to "foster unity of those who have gathered" (No. 47), and says of the Communion Chant that "its purpose [is] to express the spiritual union of the communicants by means of the unity of their voices, to show gladness of heart, and to more clearly bring out the communitarian character of the procession to receive the Eucharist' (No. 86).

It is difficult for some of use to

embrace this emphasis on the Mass as the action of a community rather than an individual act of my own faith and piety, but it is important that we make every effort to do so. Christ himself at the Last Supper pleaded with his Father: 'Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, just as we are...as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us...' (John 17:11, 21). Baptism has joined us to Christ and to one another as the vine and its branches. The life of Christ, the Holy Spirit, animates each of us individually, and all of us corporately and guides us together in our efforts to be one in Christ."

The document says that some of us may find these directions challenging. I expect so. I sometimes find some things the Church asks of me to be challenging. Jesus has taught me over the years that, rather than turning away, He has a special grace for me in that moment. So I encourage anyone who finds anything in the above challenging to take it to Him in prayer. Have a conversation with Him, and especially lift up any unpleasant feelings which arise. He wants our hearts, and He can take these difficult moments and bring us grace and a deeper sense of His love through them.

I'll share the remainder of the bishops' document in the coming weeks.

Greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven

The faith of a child is like no other. It is a faith of abandonment and complete trust due to their innocent nature. As children grow older, their innocent faith of childhood develops into a more mature faith, often with a deeper understanding of theology. We as adults strive to grow as missionary disciples of our Lord, but sometimes we complicate the process, forgetting that Jesus reminded His disciples that in order to enter the kingdom of heaven, they must be humble like children. As I spend time with the children at St. Augustine School, I am regularly humbled by their witness of faith.

I notice simple things, such as how they close their eyes when they pray at morning prayer, or how they sing boldly during Mass, belting out the hymns without reservation. The children show their love for others in the prayer petitions they write to pray for people in our school, community, country, and world. The reverence in their voices can be heard as they pray the Stations of the Cross with their class. All of these examples are delightful to behold, but this past Lent, I witnessed their love for Jesus in a new way.

During our all-school morning prayer leading up to Lent, we talked about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. reminded the students that fasting isn't just about food and that it can also be abstaining from an activity that we enjoy. I invited the students to join me every Friday during Lent at recess to pray one decade of the Rosary. I told them it was an optional activity, simply that I would be outside on the playground and if they wanted to join me, they should come to me and gather to pray. I didn't know if any of them would join, especially considering the fact that for most children, recess is their favorite part of the school day! It's more valuable than gold to them! On that first Friday, I went outside for recess with the 4th-8th graders and to my surprise, all except a few students quickly formed a giant circle and prayed the first sorrowful mystery together. I was blown away by how many students gave up their only playtime of the school day to faithfully pray and meditate upon Jesus' agony in the garden. I thought for sure that there would be more students who didn't want to give up their recess, but week after week, for five Fridays, the majority of them stayed with it and continued to pray, making this part of their Friday fast.

The younger students in Kindergarten-3rd grade faithfully joined me to pray a decade each Friday as well. With the young ones, we had to implement a rule that they had to remain in the circle until we finished, since a few little ones ran off after the first couple of Hail Marys! As we gathered to pray one Friday, and kids were forming our circle, one little child turned to me and said, "Mrs. Lenn, we don't need recess, look what Jesus did for us!" Her comment brought tears to my eyes! The faith of these children is precious and demonstrates incredible love for our Lord! This should give us pause to reflect: Do we love Him like the children do?

Q. My friend made the statement that angels don't have free will and, they must obey God's orders. My reply was they must have free will if they rebelled against God and were thrown out of heaven. Not having a comeback to that the next question thrown at me was that some believe if Satan repents on the last day he will be taken back into heaven. That one left me speechless. I'm beginning to believe this type of person has no desire to know the truth. They just like to argue. How should I have responded?

A. You may be correct in your assessment of their motive. My initial (knee-jerk) reaction was for you to not waste your time. If I encountered such a person my answer would have been "Who knows and who cares?" Questions that we cannot answer with absolute certainty, because God has not revealed the answer to us, have no relevance in God's plan of salvation. Such questions are often only thrown out to entice us into some sort of philosophical checkmate to feed the ego of our debater.

However, this overlooks the fact that other times, when a person who earnestly wants to know more about our faith, will start out by asking irrelevant or challenging questions, perhaps from ignorance or maybe shyness. They may be actually probing for answers to deeper questions. We need to be sensitive and open to such possibilities. A knee-jerk reaction, blowing them off, is exactly what we do not want to do. Perhaps a better approach to such a question would be to use it as a springboard to share what God actually has revealed to humanity. Share the Gospel (The Good News) with your friend. Share your personal conversion

Now, for the concept of a repentant Satan, see Msgr. Pat's column in our April 16 church bulletin. He refers to a sermon from St Augustine which explains how that before God could die to pay for our sins and provide our redemption, God first had to become human because as purely God He could not die. He could not have paid our debt for sin.

What follows is my personal belief: Satan is a fallen angel. Since angels do not die, becoming one of them to pay the price for their rebellion is not possible. Angels were created on another level than humans. There can be no atonement available for them. When Satan and his band of angles rebelled, it was a one time, eternal, choice. There is no turning back. There is no "do over" available for Satan. Therefore Satan does not seek repentance, he seeks revenge. Since the creation of humanity, Satan's only revenge against God is to destroy what God loves – us.

Think about it. If demonic redemption is the end result than all this has been for nothing. Jesus would have had died for our redemption from what? He would not have needed to establish His Church. All the lives of the Old Testament prophets and saints, Sacred Scripture, the lives and sufferings of the early Church fathers and lives of martyrs down through the ages would become meaningless.

Satan is a sly, treacherous, cunning, evil hater of humanity. He doesn't walk up to us and introduce himself as the one who wants to destroy our eternal soul. He does the old smoke and mirrors approach. If he can get us bogged down in meaningless discussions with someone seeking to know more about Jesus or His Church, he is whittling away at his goal of the destruction of souls, which is the only means of revenge against God available to him.

Both biopsies came back negative! What an enormous weight that was lifted. Thank you, God, for an answered prayer!




