From Msgr. Pat

In 1983, as part of the spirituality program at the University of San Francisco, I made the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola. When men wanted to join Ignatius, attracted by his deep faith and passionate relationship with Christ, he wanted them to have something as close as possible as his own time of intense prayer at Manresa, Spain. During those 30+ days, Ignatius deepened his own relationship with Christ. He wanted to know Christ, and not just know about him. That was my goal as well.

The retreat is divided into four weeks. The fourth week focuses on the Lord's resurrection. The four weeks are rooted in Scripture. However, the 1st meditation (each day has 5) invites the retreatant to imagine him/herself at the tomb with Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Now, there is nothing in any of the gospels which reports such a scene. My director, Fr. Walter Farrell, SJ, told me that St. Ignatius was certain that, like any good son, Jesus would appear to his Mother first! It was one of the most powerful periods of prayer in the 30 days. Sharing that moment with Mary as her Son rose from the tomb was deeply moving. I came to know Mary in a new way from that experience.

As we begin this month of May, dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, I encourage us to reflect on Mary, and her relationship with her Son. I offer two thoughts. The first is from St. Bernard. I mentioned this at a weekday Mass awhile back. It's from a sermon St. Bernard preached centuries ago. We read a portion of it in the Office of Readings in the breviary. He put things

in a way that I'd never considered.

When the angel Gabriel announces God's Will to Mary, St. Bernard describes how all heaven and earth await Mary's response. St. Luke describes her question, "How can this be...?", but, perhaps because I've read it so many times, I guess I thought that it was all over in a matter of seconds. St. Bernard is emphasizing Mary's freedom. There was no guarantee how she'd respond. Created free, she could have said "No." So all creatures are hanging, holding their breath, until Mary responds.

No need for a spoiler alert: we know her answer, thank God! "Let it be done to me...." In her response, Mary becomes both a model and inspiration for us. Mary is the model disciple, responding how God hopes you and I will respond to His Will for each of us, and for us as a community, members of His Son's Mystical Body.

I suggest re-reading Luke 1:26-38. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your reading. Read the passage aloud. Read it slowly. What word, phrase or image strikes me? What stirs in my heart? Express those stirrings to the Lord. Give Him an opportunity to respond.

I also suggest that we all pray for a purification of desire. May our deepest desire, personally and communally, be whatever God wills for us.

Science Olympiad Final Report

To no one's surprise, the students did an outstanding job at the regional tournament back on March 18th! They participated in 22 of the 23 events, medaling in 12 of them including 1 gold, 2 silver, and 1 bronze! Sixteen schools competed, and our students ranked 7th, and like in previous years our team was the only Catholic school representative. While this did not advance us to the state tournament as a team (so close again this year!), a new rule this year allowed any team that earned a gold medal in any event to receive a special invitation to compete in that same event at the state tournament on April 22nd at Michigan State University regardless if the whole team advanced. Our students earned gold in the Bridge event where the objective is to build a small bridge structure that can hold the most weight without breaking, which meant that the students were invited to compete in the Bridge event at the state tournament!

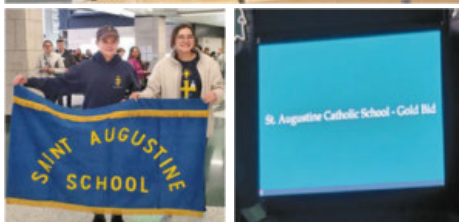
While our students could not advance to the national tournament with this special invitation, this was still a great opportunity for them to experience the state tournament without the same pressure. A new place is always exciting for our students, and I'm glad that those who were able to attend got that experience. With only one event to account for and some free time, we had the opportunity to explore MSU a bit and even go to the campus's science museum. While MSU is not unfamiliar to me as I completed my undergrad there, it was nice to be back on campus again, and I was happy being able to share the place I spent an important part of my life with some of our students.

Looking back on this year, there's no doubt that the "Model of Workmen" was quietly caring for our team, and I think it's rather fitting that this article is being written so close to the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker (May 1st). Before each of our practices, we'd pray the *Memorare to St. Joseph* together and ask for St. Joseph's intercession in helping us get to the state tournament. While we didn't get *exactly* what we were hoping for in advancing as a team, we still got the chance to go

the state tournament – just not in the way we expected. As always, St. Joseph never disappoints in his ability to obtain from the Lord what we ask, so long as we ask with a sincere heart that's receptive to His will. On that note, I am again recommending the book *Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father* by Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC. It's a wonderful read, and a way to learn about the great gift that the Lord has given us in St. Joseph. 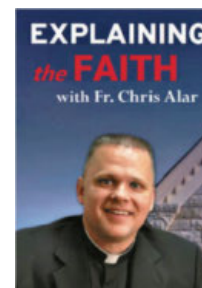

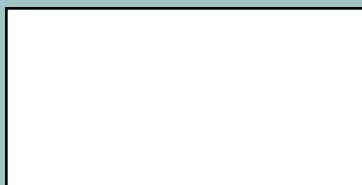

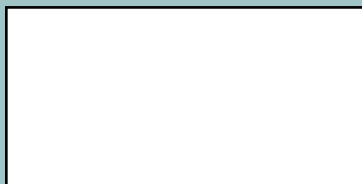
