

From Msgr. Pat

Ah, Spring appears to be here at last: the robins no longer wear scarves; flowers are in bloom (and so, Claritin flies off the shelves), and the Catholic Services Appeal has begun. You may already have received the pledge materials in the mail. I know I have. If you haven't received these materials, please contact any of the three parish offices.

Here are our respective targets:
Holy Family \$48,692.00
St. Augustine \$80,152.00
St. Mary, Mystical Rose \$19,778.00

The targets reflect a percentage of parish income. Holy Family, 12%; St. Augustine, 13%; St. Mary Mystical Rose, 10.5%. The percentages are assigned, again, based on a parish's annual income.

While we'll see Archbishop Vigneron's message after Communion this weekend, I find it helpful to remember what the CSA supports, for us and for the Catholic community across the 6 counties of the Archdiocese of Detroit, our local Church.

I can't count the number of times since I joined you last December I've said to one or another pastoral staff person, "Call this person at the Archdiocese" for guidance about a question that's arisen about marriage difficulty, something at St. Augustine School, or as we prepared for the beautiful, but complex ceremonies for Holy Week. As a parish priest, I rely on the good brothers and sisters in the various offices who have the expertise which I lack, even after 48 years of priestly service.

Recently, we welcomed Fr. Craig Geira, Director of the Office for Priestly Vocations, to our special luncheon for junior high students. He returned to celebrate Mass for the school children, and stayed to answer questions. Fr. Sal Palazzola, who serves in the Metropolitan Tribunal, helps us with the weekend Mass schedule, and is available to answer complex questions about Catholic Church marriage law.

All of which is to say that I support the Catholic Services Appeal because I know from personal experience the good that my contribution supports, not only for me, but for the whole Catholic community. On an even more personal note, the CSA supported me as a seminary faculty member, and when I served as Director of Priestly Mission before I retired last July.

So, I urge you to be generous. Our support for CSA supports our mission to *Unleash the Gospel* here in Northern Macomb County. We support our brothers and sisters around and throughout the Church in Detroit.

May God bless you. Msgr. Pat



At Holy Family & St. Augustine

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) is an age-appropriate opportunity for children to celebrate a *concurrent* Liturgy of the Word in a nearby space and then return to the main assembly for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The children experience the same ritual and hear the same scriptures, but proclaimed in simplified language. The most notable difference is that the homily message is delivered as an interactive dialogue.

CLOW is currently happening at the 9:00 a.m. Mass at St. Augustine and the 10:30 a.m. Mass at Holy Family. All children are welcome. No preregistration is necessary. Please understand that this is not Childcare; the children are only gone for approximately 15-18 minutes. They'll return during the Offertory preparation. CLOW is most appropriate for Pre-school through 2nd grade.

After the Introductory Rites, the celebrant will invite the children and the volunteer leaders forward to be dismissed. The leaders will proclaim the readings and gospel, lead the children in singing a Psalm response, share the main message, and conclude with a simplified creed and intercessory prayers before rejoining their parents. This is not a "Sunday School" format. There are no crafts, coloring pages or snacks offered.

We are in great need of CLOW Leaders. If you enjoy working with children and can spare about 15 minutes of prep time, please consider this ministry. You will work in teams of two and if enough people sign up you will only be scheduled once every five or six weeks. A detailed leader guide is provided. 


