Notify the parish office of any need for hospital or home visits.

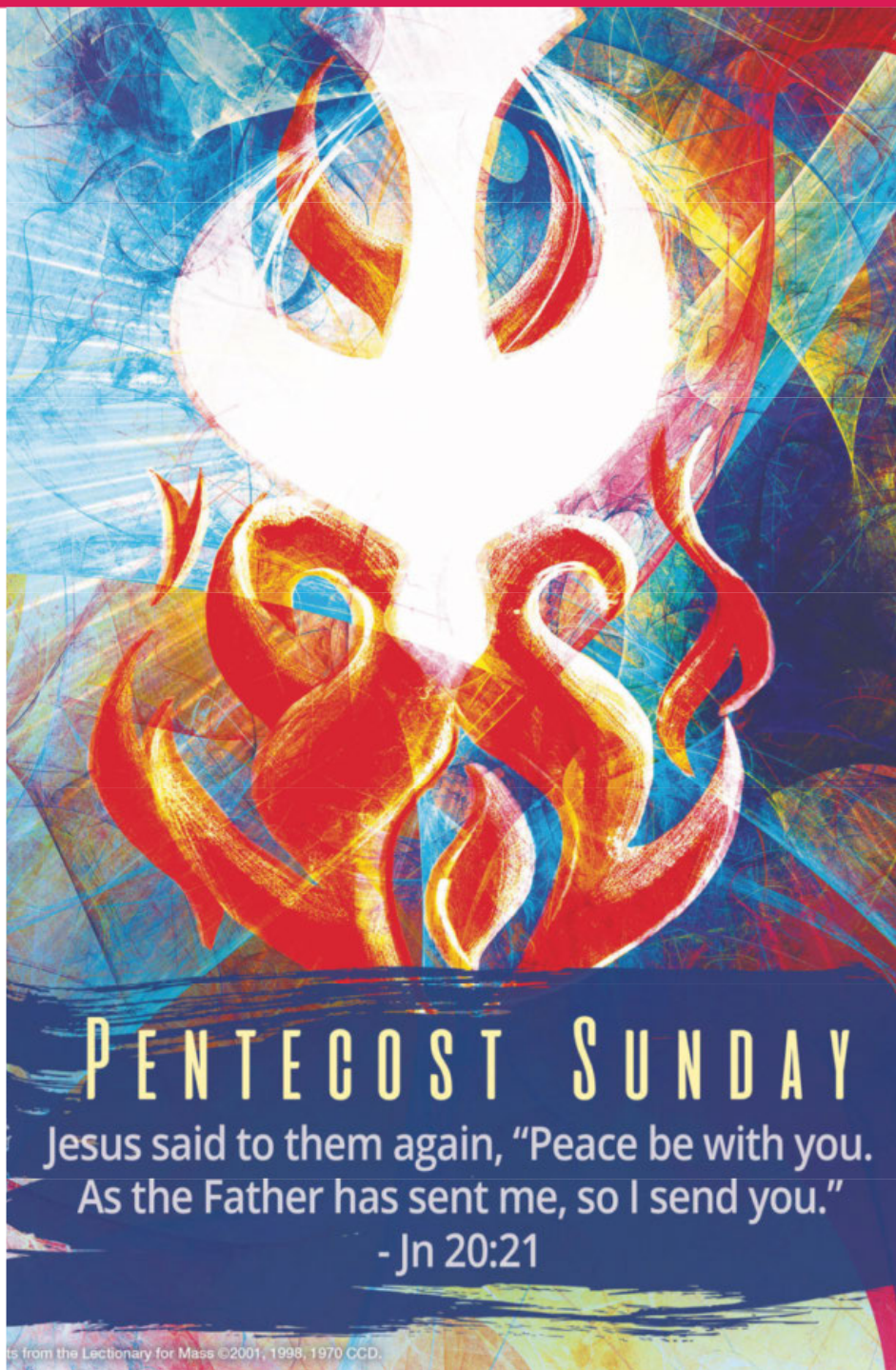

From Msgr. Pat

When I was in 7th grade, on an extremely rare occasion when I misbehaved, the teacher told me I was being bold. She didn't mean it as a complement.

This morning (Monday) as I write this, our first reading at Mass today from the Acts of Apostles continues to describe St. Paul's travel and ministry. He's in Ephesus where he finds a group of believers who've only received the baptism of John (Acts 19:1). Paul prays over them and imposes hands (as Bishop Fisher did last Sunday over those mostly 8th graders whom he confirmed). They immediately begin to manifest the power of the Holy Spirit.

Acts goes on to report Paul's debates with persuasive arguments in the synagogue in Ephesus. Luke describes Paul debating "boldly" (Acts 19:8). I'm sure Luke is using the word very differently than Sister did when describing me. Paul was courageous, confident, passionate for the Gospel. He'd met Christ who changed his life, and Paul wanted that for every person in that synagogue.

How about you and me? As we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost today, all of us who have been confirmed have had the very same Holy Spirit come upon us with the same power and possibility as those 12 men at Ephesus, as powerfully as He came upon Paul. Are you and I "bold" for the Gospel? Do you and I want every person we meet to know Christ (I presume we answer "Yes!")? Do we want them to know the joy and peace we know, receiving His Body and Blood in the Eucharist? Are you and I willing to act and speak boldly so Christ can make this happen

through us? Here we might pause. Hmmm.... Am I willing to do this? Does this mean I have to stand on a corner in Richmond, Armada or Memphis and pass out pamphlets? Likely not. But I could sign up for a ½ mile of the procession on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord (Corpus Christi), when we very publicly show our devotion to Christ's Real Presence.

I could sit down and prepare my "elevator speech," so I'm ready when someone asks me at the family picnic this summer why I came late in order to go to Mass first. (The "elevator speech" is what I'd say to someone in the time I'd have to ride with him 15 floors in an elevator. Experts say we've got 3 minutes. I'd say it's closer to 90 seconds. "This is why I come to Mass. I know Jesus is speaking to my heart through the Scripture. He loves me. He died for me. Sin tears my life apart. It doesn't make me happy; in fact just the opposite. When I receive Him in Holy Communion, I remember that love, and that He's with me, no matter what comes. I know He wants that for you, too.")

Sit down. Ask the Holy Spirit to give you what to say to that son or daughter, in-law, cousin or neighbor. Write it down. Then ask the Holy Spirit to help you learn it by heart. Ask Him to bring that person to you or you to that person. Ask Him to show you the time and place. Ask, and He will!

Then, like Paul and every other saint, some canonized, some not: BE BOLD! Have a blessed Solemnity of Pentecost.

A friend of one of our parishioners' reports:

After accidentally falling 15 feet from a second story window, our 2-yr old grandson suffered internal trauma and was transported to a local hospital. An ultrasound revealed a critical amount of fluid in the abdomen, indicating serious internal bleeding. Arrangements were made to transport him to another hospital where he could receive specialized care. In the meantime, calls went out for prayers (via the Cursillo community) to hundreds of people around the world.

Upon arrival at the second hospital, a second ultrasound was ordered for comparison. The results however, showed, no internal bleeding. Doctors ordered a third ultrasound to verify the conflicting results but again, no internal bleeding could be discerned. As a result, the doctors subsequently cleared the child of abdominal injuries!

Because of a wonder-working God, I was witness to the miraculous healing of my grandson. I am so grateful to all who stood in the gap while I felt that all I was able to do was to say the name of Jesus during the trauma.

If you ever wondered if your prayers are the lever that changes things, just remember little Lincoln who is home and healed by the ultimate Physician!

A Great Story Never Gets Old

What is it about a good story that makes it stay with us over the years? How come certain characters have the ability to change us in various ways? You know you've read a great story when you get to the end and you don't want it to end because you will miss the friends you've accompanied on their journey through disappointments, and triumphs. That's exactly how I felt the first time I read, "Where the Red Fern Grows" by Wilson Rawls with my class many years ago. This year I had the opportunity to share this unforgettable novel with my sixth graders. I had some reservations though. It's been over 25 years since I read it with my former students, and I wasn't sure if the setting (the Ozark Mountains in the 1920's) would be engaging enough for my students this year who love books like "The Hunger Games" and "Percy Jackson". While reading the first chapter with them, I cautiously glanced around the room trying to get a feel for if they liked it or not. To my astonishment every student was mesmerized with the words they were reading on the pages. It was a dream come true- they were hooked, and I would get to revisit my 'ole pals Billy, Little Ann, and Old Dan once again! The students on the other hand would get to meet these new friends too while learning about literary elements such as conflict, imagery, and theme. The reason this book remains timeless is because of the themes and lessons that Wilson Rawls brings to life through his dynamic characters: Billy (a 12 year old boy), and his two red coon hunting dogs (Old Dan and Little Ann). Through their actions they teach us that sacrifice, loyalty, and trust in God are the fabric of living a happy life.

As much as I enjoy reading realistic fiction from authors such as Wilson Rawls, I am even more so in love with the stories that come from our Catholic faith; the true stories, not fiction! These stories tell us who we are and where we're going. When you look at St. Augustine Church, the stories are endless. On the outside of the church, the stones on the walls tell the story of the many farmers that brought them from their fields and placed them on the building making it a beautiful place to worship. On the inside of the church walls, the Stations of the Cross remind us of the story when Jesus carried his cross for us. However, the greatest story that our church reveals to us is hanging above the altar- the crucifix. This story is our love story of God sacrificing his only son so we could have eternal life with him. All of these stories are meant to be revisited to help us grow deeper in the understanding of our faith. The next time you are at Mass, take a good look around and see how many heavenly stories surround you. Just like the story, "Where the Red Fern Grows," our Catholic stories will never get old no matter how many times we visit them. They will only get better!

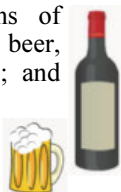
2023 Festival Hot Option Raffle

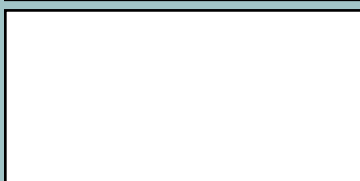
