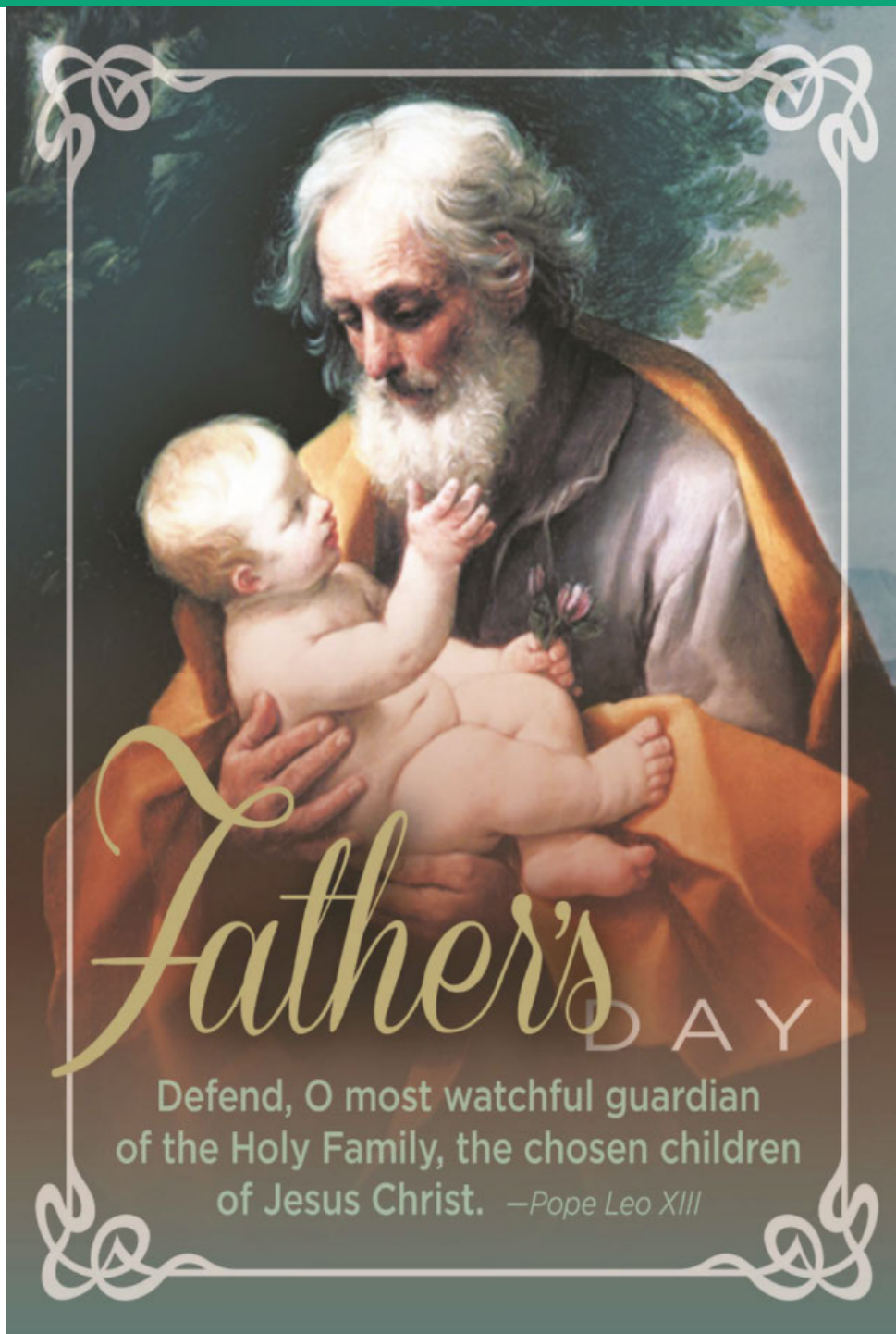

From Msgr. Pat

In third grade, I hit a learning road block. In math we were learning to “borrow” while doing subtraction, and, in spite of Miss Baiari’s best efforts, I could not understand how a zero could become something else.

I was sitting at the table at home on Lewis Street, very frustrated, when my dad came to sit down beside me. I was convinced I’d spend the rest of my life in 3rd grade. My dad, Leo, was an accountant working for Oakland County. He patiently explained, multiple times, how that last zero in 500 could become 10, so I could subtract that last 9 in 349 from it. Eventually, the light came on, and I got it.

My father went home to God 15 years ago. I speak of him in the present tense, because I know he’s alive in Christ. He’s a gentle man. He enjoyed gardening, and grew beautiful roses, the size of cantaloupes. He worked hard, having to overcome a serious hearing impairment. Some of that was likely genetic, and made worse during his service in an artillery battalion in WWII. He has a dry sense of humor, and deep, deep faith. He’s a much better theologian than his priest-son.

Two years after my mother died, just short of her 64th birthday, my father remarried. He was no good on his own. Poor Mary developed cancer about two years after their wedding. After Sunday Masses, I went to St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiac to visit her. Dad, my sister, Kathy, and I, were sitting in the cafeteria so Mary could nap. It must

have been Lent, because we’d heard the story of Abraham and Isaac at Mass that morning. Kathy had questions about how God could give Isaac to Abraham, promise him that he’d be the father of a great nation, and then demand that Abraham sacrifice his only son.

I hemmed and hawed, trying to buy time, and Dad said, “But He didn’t. He sacrificed His own Son instead.” I sat in stunned silence (a rarity, as you might imagine). I was more than stunned. I was in awe.

Dad is a man of deep, deep faith. It’s why I’m confident he sees Jesus face to face now. I could wish—no, pray, that my faith would be a fraction of my father’s.

I haven’t checked the old baptismal ritual to see if there’s anything similar to the final blessing for fathers like we have in the Rite today. The final blessing for fathers now says:

“May the Lord God Almighty, the giver of life both in heaven and on earth, bless the father of this child, so that together with his wife, they may, by word and example, prove to be the first witnesses of the faith to their child, in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

I understand that to mean that fathers and mothers have their child entrusted to them by God with the understanding that they will do everything in their power to see that their son or daughter gets to heaven. What better could they want for a child?

I know that’s what Leo sought to do. It’s why he was such a good theologian: he taught us with words, but even more with his actions, to be people of faith, disciples of Jesus Christ.

So I thank God for Leo Halfpenny, for giving me to him and Phyllis. God bless all our fathers. They have their work cut out for them these days. May God, our Father, give them the grace, wisdom, and all they need to love as He loves them, to be the first and most important witnesses of faith for their children, to help them get to heaven.

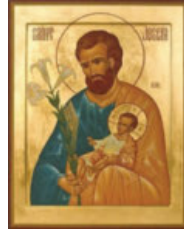

Now, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we kick off the next phase of this journey—the Year of Parish Revival.

Beginning on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), you will see many more opportunities to participate in the Revival on the local level. The task of parishes in this Year of Parish Revival is to revive parishioners in their love with Jesus in the Eucharist and to send them forth to share this love with others.

Each parish will respond in a unique way to four key invitations: reinvigorate worship, create moments of personal encounter, engage in robust formation, and send Catholics forth as missionaries. What this looks like at your parish will depend on the culture and character of your community.

In the coming weeks, we will be sharing more details about each of the four invitations as we enter this exciting year of grace. That way you will know what to watch for at the parish level, and what upcoming initiatives could use your prayers.

Q. Where in the Bible does it say that creation is a reflection of God? What exactly is this reflection?

A. Perhaps you are asking about Romans 1:20? *“Ever since the creation of the world, his invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity have been able to be understood and perceived in what he has made. As a result, they have no excuse.”* (NRSV-CE)

If anyone stops to ponder the wonders found in all of the various forms of life, the consistent order of the universe or the beauty of a single flower, they will indeed recognize these things must have been created by an awesome designer/builder. Even better, this creator has revealed his identity to us. By his doing this we can see even clearer how God’s creation reflects him.

The One True God has revealed that he is a Triune God existing in three persons; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Science reveals that everything that exists is either that of matter, space, or time (triune). Furthermore, all matter is solid, liquid, or a gas (triune). Space is measured in height, depth and width (triune). Time is past, present or future (triune). After these creations, God then created humans in his image (Gen 1:26-27). We too are triune, consisting of body, soul and spirit.

Msgr. Pat gave an illustration using his experience as a student working on a survey crew. Perhaps we can borrow from that here. Msgr. Pat shared that the tri-pod upon which the survey instrument is mounted has three adjustable legs. These legs are adjusted so that the transit on top sits level no matter how uneven the terrain. The illustration being that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, working together provide a stable foundation for our spiritual journey, no matter how rocky our road. We need not fully understand in order to embrace one God in three persons.

Borrowing Monsignor’s illustration, we can apply it as an example of the Church Jesus established to guide us. This Church can also be compared to a tri-pod. We have Sacred Scripture, Sacred Tradition, and Magisterium. Like the legs of a surveyor’s tri-pod, with all three offices of the Church, we have a stable, level platform from which to

learn and grow in our spiritual journey through life.

The last sentence in Romans 1:20: *"As a result, they have no excuse"* is a warning for us as well. If turning a blind eye to *"his invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity"* does not excuse anyone, then what about those of us who have access to the fullness of God's revelation found in the Catholic Church? Jesus said in Luke 12:48: *"Much will be required of the person entrusted with much, and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."* (NRSV-CE) The questions every Catholic must ask themselves are: What are the gifts, charisms, talents, skills and abilities God has given me? What then might be required of me? Am I fulfilling that requirement?
