From Msgr. Pat

"I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus." (Phil. 1:3-6)

In September 1961, when I went to Sacred Heart Seminary High School at 14, I only ever wanted to be a parish priest. I'd watched Frs. O'Reilly, Orlick, Thomas, Cushing, and O'Donnell as I grew up at St. Michael in Pontiac. They were obviously happy as parish priests, so I hoped and prayed that I would be, too.

I think I shared when I arrived last December that God had other plans. Newly ordained, I was in a parish, but also a hospital chaplain. Then I was chaplain at a Catholic High School and worked in the Communications Office for Cardinal Dearden and Cardinal Szoka. I next served as spiritual director in the College seminary, and later in the same role when the School of Theology opened at Sacred Heart.

After 12 years, I went back to parish life (finally!). That lasted three years when Cardinal Maida called me back to the seminary as Vice Rector and Dean

of Formation. After 7 years in that role, I went to St. Paul, Grosse Pointe, as pastor. I thought I'd be there until I retired (whatever that means for a priest). Then, Archbishop Vigneron asked me to work with priests in the Clergy Office as Director for Priestly Mission.

Toward the end of that ministry, I was asked to go to the Shrine of the Little Flower in Royal Oak, to help while Fr. Joe Horn recovered from his open heart surgery. He returned. I packed and moved to retirement.

I told the junior high students at St. Augustine School back in February that I do not like being a priest. You heard correctly. I **LOVE BEING A PARISH PRIEST!** God has generously given me another opportunity to serve as a parish priest here with you. I am so grateful to our Father who loves us beyond describing.

I thank Him for you, and I thank you for welcoming me in a most challenging time for you. I asked you to pray that I would be the shepherd He wants me to be. I am most grateful for your prayers, and your words of encouragement. Know that you have now and will always have a place in my prayer and heart.

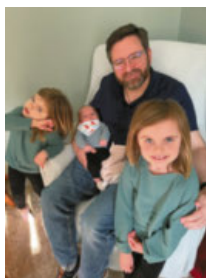

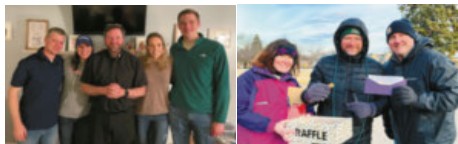
