September In "I told the junior 1961, when I went high students at to Sacred Heart St. Augustine Seminary High School back in School at 14, I February that I do only ever wanted to be a parish not like being a priest. I'd watched priest..." O'Reilly, Frs. Orlick. Thomas. Cushing, O'Donnell as I grew up at St. Michael in Pontiac. They were obviously happy as parish priests, so I hoped and prayed that I would be, too.

I told the junior high students at St. Augustine School back in February that I do not like being a priest. You heard correctly. I *LOVE* BEING A PARISH PRIEST! God has generously given me another opportunity to serve as a parish priest here with you. I am so grateful to our Father who loves us beyond describing.

I thank Him for you, and I thank you for welcoming me in a most challenging time for you. I asked you to pray that I would be the shepherd He wants me to be. I am most grateful for your prayers, and your words of encouragement. Know that you have now and will always have a place in my prayer and heart.




