From Fr. Mark Livingston

I am very happy to be here as the Administrator of our Family. Thank you so much for your warm welcome as I begin. I am looking forward to meeting each of you, hopefully sooner rather than later. Be assured of my prayers as we begin this journey together.

Whenever I would hear today's Gospel, I used to think that Jesus sounded a little harsh. I mean, if we don't take up our cross, or love him more than our parents, we are not even worthy of him. How can Jesus be so demanding of us, especially when we have been asked to honor our fathers and mothers? What we have to remember is that Jesus is telling us that we need to correctly prioritize our lives and put him first because he is the source of truth, love and eternal life that we all long for. If we don't have eternal life in heaven or love, then we are not happy and will not be happy, and our lives are doomed to come to a miserable end. Therefore, Jesus is asking us to live our lives like we understand this and we are aiming for heaven, not Purgatory or lower.

But sometimes it can be so easy to be distracted from our goal of making Jesus first in our lives. Throughout Jesus' preaching, life, and death on the cross, he pointed to four general areas that people grasp after, which distracts us from God. These four things, Jesus tells us, are things that we need to live a life of detachment from so that we can be attached to God instead. And they are: pride (or ego), pleasure, power and possessions. Not that it is bad to have these things, but when it becomes more im-

portant than God, that is when we are attached to them—that is when we end up looking for these things to fulfill us, and they don't. They can't satisfy us. People, for example, look for pride or to have their egos stroked. Sometimes people will do whatever they can to appear on television or on social media and have their 15 minutes of fame. Some people will tear others down to make themselves look better. It's pride; it's ego. Some people search for pleasure. They take drugs, or get drunk on alcohol or live promiscuous lives in a never ending search for pleasure. Some people totally immerse themselves in their own hobbies in a never ending search for fun. Some people look for power, power over people, to make people do whatever they want. Sometimes when people go to things like astrology, it's a desire to have power over future or current events. Or sometimes when people insist that truth is all relative, it is out of a desire to have control over morality, and to define for oneself what is right and what is wrong rather than submitting to God. And then of course there are those who look for possessions, money, and wealth to fulfill their every want and desire.

But none of these things truly leaves us satisfied for long. Jesus' dying on the cross is a stark contrast to these areas of

life that the world clings to. Jesus certainly wasn't reveling in pride on the cross as he suffered humiliation from his tormentors. He certainly didn't experience pleasure on the cross. He was willing to forego his power as the Son of God and allowed himself to be tortured and killed to lure the Enemy close so as to defeat him. And Jesus also was without possessions as the soldiers even cast lots for the only thing he had, which was his garment. Jesus, throughout his life and death, was telling us that there is another way, a better way to find what we are really longing for, and what we are really longing for is found in him. God is reaching out to us and seeking to share His life, His truth, and His love with us. His love calls for a free response. We can accept, reject, or ignore His offer of love. But it can only be fruitful in us if it is accepted. Accepting it means loving in return, entrusting our lives to Him. It means entering into a covenant relationship of love with Him.

Sometimes people think that loving God simply means "do unto others as you would have them do unto you," or helping one's neighbor, or taking care of the poor. Although that is certainly part of it, the problem with this is that loving God must mean something more than just doing those things because even many atheists and agnostics would agree with doing such practices. What separates us from the atheists and the agnostics is that, not only do we believe in God, but also that we believe in having a personal relationship with God because God is not simply some abstract idea, he



is a personal Being (Being Itself) that has involved Himself with human beings throughout all of history. This is important because you can't love an abstract idea, but you can enter into a loving relationship with a personal being. And this is what we are called to do with God.

Therefore, we must ask ourselves, how much of a priority is this to me? How committed am I towards following Him? How much do I really desire to enter into a personal relationship with God? And we have to ask ourselves this because there will always be plenty of distractions in our way. It's only if we put God first, that these distractions can be overcome. That is why Jesus says that you must love him above all else. But he also says it because he knows that the life he has to offer fulfills every need we have. We were created to love and be loved by God. That is the purpose of our existence. Therefore, what Jesus said was not meant to shock us, but to challenge us, and invite us in. Do we want the love and the life that God is offering to us? The choice is ours.

Lastly, I pray that everyone has a safe and blessed 4th of July! As you go to your picnics or other gatherings, please say a prayer for all of our brothers and sisters who, inspired by the Holy Spirit to be protectors, gave up their lives for our freedom. Whether they gave up their lives in battle for our independence, another war or conflict, or are currently serving in our military at home or abroad, let's remember and *pray for them*. My brother was in the Armor Division of the US Army and was stationed in Kuwait, South Korea and several other places. There wasn't a day that passed that I didn't think of him and say a prayer for his safety and virtue while he was away. Let's remember the men and women in our own parish, past and present, thank God for their hearts willing to make sacrifices for us, and pray for them. Happy 4th of July!

Traveling Chalice Program

Over a year ago, Archbishop Vigneron declared a year of prayer for priestly vocations. In response, Father Phil organized our Vocations Committee, who in turn launched a Traveling Chalice program for our Family of Parishes last February. It began at St. Augustine and we have been pleased that the program has been successful with six sign outs by parishioners over the past several months.

During that time, our committee members have received several questions from people about the program. Below are some of our frequently asked questions.

Question:

What is the purpose of the Traveling Chalice Program?

Answer:

To encourage families to pray and promote vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life.

Question:

How do I sign out the chalice?

Answer:

There are business cards next to the display case that have a QR code. Open the camera on your smartphone and point it at the QR code on the card (or use the one below) and complete the sign out. Then pick up the chalice after mass and return it the following week.

Question:

When will the chalice come to my parish?

Answer:

The chalice is currently at St. Augustine. Our committee has delayed the rotation out of respect for Fr. Mark's arrival on July 1st. We felt it was appropriate to allow Fr. Mark some time to settle in before the move. It will rotate to St. Mary Mystical Rose in July, and then to Holy Family in October.

While the year of prayer for vocations declared by Archbishop Vigneron has ended, there is still a need for priests. Our continued action should be to pray for Vocations, and the Traveling Chalice is the perfect avenue for our petition. "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (Matthew 9:37-38)

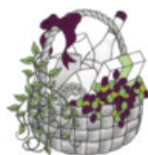
