From Fr. Mark Livingston

Our country has become increasingly secular over time. There are a lot of debates and arguments over things that would not have been a debatable issue 50 or 100 years ago. For example, there has been a lot of debate over whether or not you can have the 10 Commandments in a courthouse, a Nativity Scene on public property, and the words "under God" in the pledge of allegiance to the flag. We are now debating things that God defined for us in Scripture, like marriage and gender. It seems that there is an attempt to push God out of nearly every aspect of our personal and public life. We do so to our own detriment.

Shortly after 9/11, a lot of people quickly found religion, some for a couple of weeks and others for longer, some even continuing to practice the Faith up to today. Around that time, the daughter of Billy Graham, Anne Graham, was interviewed one morning on the Early Show regarding the September 11th attacks. The show's host, Jane Clayson asked her, "How could a good and loving God let something like this happen?" Anne's response was basically this: "I believe God is deeply angered by this, just as we are, but for years we've been telling God to get out of our schools, to get out of our government, and to get out of our lives. How can we expect God to give us His blessing and His protection if we demand He leave us alone?" This is profound and true!

Without God, we are toast. We have to come to a clear understanding how badly we need God. Mother Teresa once said, "The longest journey is from the head to the heart." I agree. We can't just have "head knowledge" about God, but must have an intimate, experiential knowledge-from the heart-of God from relationship with him. His blessings and protection are essential, but we need him for much more, our eternal salvation. In our lives, we can be burdened with many things: our careers, bills, families, hectic schedules, the activities we are involved with, social calendars, etc. Sometimes we can get so caught up with the things of this world that we can forget about God, or just place Him off to the side somewhere, remembering him occasionally.

To recognize our need for God requires humility. That was part of the problem with the scribes and Pharisees. They didn't see a need for Jesus, they did not think that they were in need of his mercy or forgiveness, they did not think they were in need of his words of wisdom or his ministry. They thought they had what was needed inside themselves, by themselves; they certainly didn't think they needed Jesus. They thought that by following the law by their own efforts, that they earned their own salvation. Many people can fall into that same kind of trap, thinking that they have everything they need, and that church or religion is a waste of time. Some think that salvation is earned, especially by being a nice person. I have heard people say regarding salvation, "I'll be fine, it's not like I've killed anyone." Not committing murder is the lowest possible expectation of human behavior, not the highest! Repentant sinners, even the gravest of sinners, will enter the Kingdom of Heaven before the self-righteous because they realize their utter dependence upon God for their salvation and cling to God.

No matter how good a person might think they are, none of us is perfect and we cannot overcome that imperfection on our own. Certainly, living a virtuous and Faith-filed life requires effort over time on our part, but we cannot get to heaven without faith in and reliance upon God, who is perfect. God and heaven are perfect, so what makes anyone think that they deserve to walk into heaven with all their imperfections? The truth is, we sin. We mess up and we are limited; we just cannot get to God no matter how hard we try, it isn't possible without his grace and help. But God can come to us and lift us up, and that is what he did through Jesus Christ. Salvation is a gift freely given to us by Jesus Christ, and it is a gift that we can choose to accept or deny. This is not a one-time choice, but a daily living of the choice we've made for or against Christ. We primarily accept this gift of salvation by accepting Jesus Christ and his offer of love, of being family with him. Also, we need to accept that he is the Truth and source of eternal life. So, if we truly accept this gift of salvation it will show in our devotion to Jesus Christ and in our deeds by putting his words into action. This is one reason why we so desperately need him.



But when people think, "I don't need this religion stuff, I have everything I need," we have to ask ourselves, what is it that we really need? What is it that truly satisfies the deepest longings of our troubled human hearts? Will more things of this broken world solve the problems in my troubled, broken heart, or do I need to search for something beyond it? The things that people really want are found in their desires for beauty, truth, freedom and abundant. Money, vacations, TV, gaming systems, social media, prestige, work, etc. are not bad in themselves, but they will never fill the hole in your heart. Jesus is the source of the things that we really need. It is his love and truth that sets us free from the shackles of sin and death so that we may have life. That is why we need him and need to actively engage in the relationship us to, individually and communally.

What we do here at church is far from irrelevant. It is about the very things that are most important to all of us— God, family and salvation. If we possess the humility to realize that

we are in fact in need of a savior, then we will not be in danger of taking God out of our lives or our country, nor will we take him for granted. Instead, we will discover our deepest desires and find that Jesus is the fulfillment of all of them.

Friends, God wants to heal you too. Just because an injury is old and you've come to "live with it" doesn't mean that God doesn't want to heal you of it, and the process is simple. All you have to do it ask.

Traveling Chalice Program

This week, we continue to answer frequently asked questions about the Traveling Chalice Program.

To recap from last week, Archbishop Vigneron declared a year of prayer for priestly vocations over a year ago. Our Parish Family responded by organizing a Vocations Committee, who in turn launched a Traveling Chalice program last February. It began at St. Augustine and will be moving to St. Mary Mystical Rose in July, then to Holy Family in October.

Since the program's inception, Vocation Committee members have received several questions from people about the program. Below are answers to more of our frequently asked questions.

Question:

The chalice is currently at St. Augustine but I attend mass at a different parish. Can the committee deliver it to my parish?

Answer:

Unfortunately, no. We do not have the people available to provide for that. People from parishes, other than the one hosting the chalice, can sign-out the chalice by using the Sign-Up Genius and attending mass at the parish that is hosting the chalice. Simply pick it up after mass, and return it to the hosting parish the following week prior to mass.

Question:

The display case looks heavy! Do I have to take the whole thing?

Answer:

No, you can take the chalice by itself if you like. There is a cylindrical case on the base of the display case's table that can be used to take the chalice alone.

Question:

I have other questions. Who can I talk to about them?

Answer:

Contact Dan Evans, committee chair, at (586) 453-5731. If you are a young man who is discerning the priesthood, contact a committee member or one of our priests for help and direction.




