From Fr. Mark Livingston

HOPE! New beginnings can be challenging and uncomfortable. Thank you for your patience and prayer. I have met with many people so far and there are so many more to meet! In the words of Pope St. John Paul the Great (and Jesus), “Be not afraid!” Hope in Jesus. In our Gospel this week, we read about a reference that is familiar to many in our area: sowing seed. The seed is the word of God and new life in his grace. Jesus tells us that some seed (word and grace) fell on the path and was stolen away by the Evil One because we did not understand the gift of God in front of us. Other seed fell on rocky ground and it was scorched by the sun because there were no roots, with only a superficial acceptance of the Gospel without letting it hit the heart. Still other seed fell among thorns and was choked out by worldly distractions (materialism, wealth, hedonism, anxiety, etc.). Lastly, some seed fell onto rich soil and grew and produced a lot of fruit because we heard and understood it’s significance. This Greek word for “understand” is *syniemi* (soon-ee-a-me), which is similar to “synthesize” or “synergy” meaning to adopt into our lives and fully live it. We might say, then, that those who hear and integrate his Word into their lives will be saved.

Jesus is challenging us to consider “What kind of soil is my heart?” Can it receive, hear and integrate his teachings? Or is it rocky or thorny? Lack of understanding (or desire to truly understand), superficiality, and worldliness are big distractions from God today and in every era. This confusing world can deflate us and leave us feeling hopeless and help-

less. After COVID and so many changes in our church and family, how is the soil of your heart and mind? St. Gregory the Great wrote this beautiful passage, challenging us to the rich “heart soil” of virtue. “The only true riches are the ones that make us rich in virtues. Therefore, dearly beloved, if you want to be rich you must love true riches. If you seek the summit of genuine honor, reach out for the heavenly kingdom. If you love the glories of rank, hasten to be enrolled in the court of the angels on high... The word of God is our mind’s food.”

Our goal is to hear the Word (spoken and witnessed) with our ears (senses), understand with our hearts, integrate God into our lives, and be converted to and healed by God/ Jesus. We begin to lose hope when we start thinking that our battle is against flesh and blood, rather than the powers and principalities (spirits) of evil. St. Paul assured us that this life is a constant spiritual battle. When we lose hope, we begin to reduce everything down to material issues to be resisted or celebrated—people, places, things, etc. Our battle is a spiritual one. In scripture, Jesus says, “Unless you become like little children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.” It’s an interesting word choice, “become”. He does not say “remain” as children, but “become”. We might add “become again” like little children. In other words, to reclaim our innocence and childlike wonder in a troubled world!

I used to manage and be a therapist in a few dialysis clinics. One day, I asked a young man with Down’s Syndrome on dialysis “what’s new” and he shouted,

“EVERYTHING IS NEW!!” through a toothy grin with large spaces between each tooth. It was beautiful and infectious! The whole place erupted in joyful laughter. It was refreshing and lightened everyone’s heart ... in a place not known for levity. I needed to hear his message at that point in my life.

The remedy for loss of hope is prayer from the heart and trust in God, especially handing over our heavy and hardened hearts to Jesus—all of the frustrations, desolation and throwing our hands up in the air because “nothing is new”—and asking him for the particular treasures of renewing grace in his Sacred Heart. God’s mercies are new every morning. That’s the point of the sunrise and the cooling breeze—newness. That’s the point of a smile and a handshake; a pat on the back—refreshing newness. God is loving us with his renewing grace. The more we search for the remedy to our lack of hope from things in this world (riches, anxiety-invoking preoccupations, trying to live without prayer and God), the less we will understand and synthesize God’s word and grace. We even risk losing the free gift of his salvation.

This week, search your heart for the place of struggle and hopelessness, give it to God with great trust, ask for his renewing word and grace, understand/ receive it with your hearts, integrate that word of renewal into your life, and be converted and healed by Him who loves you beyond measure. Everything is new with Jesus!
